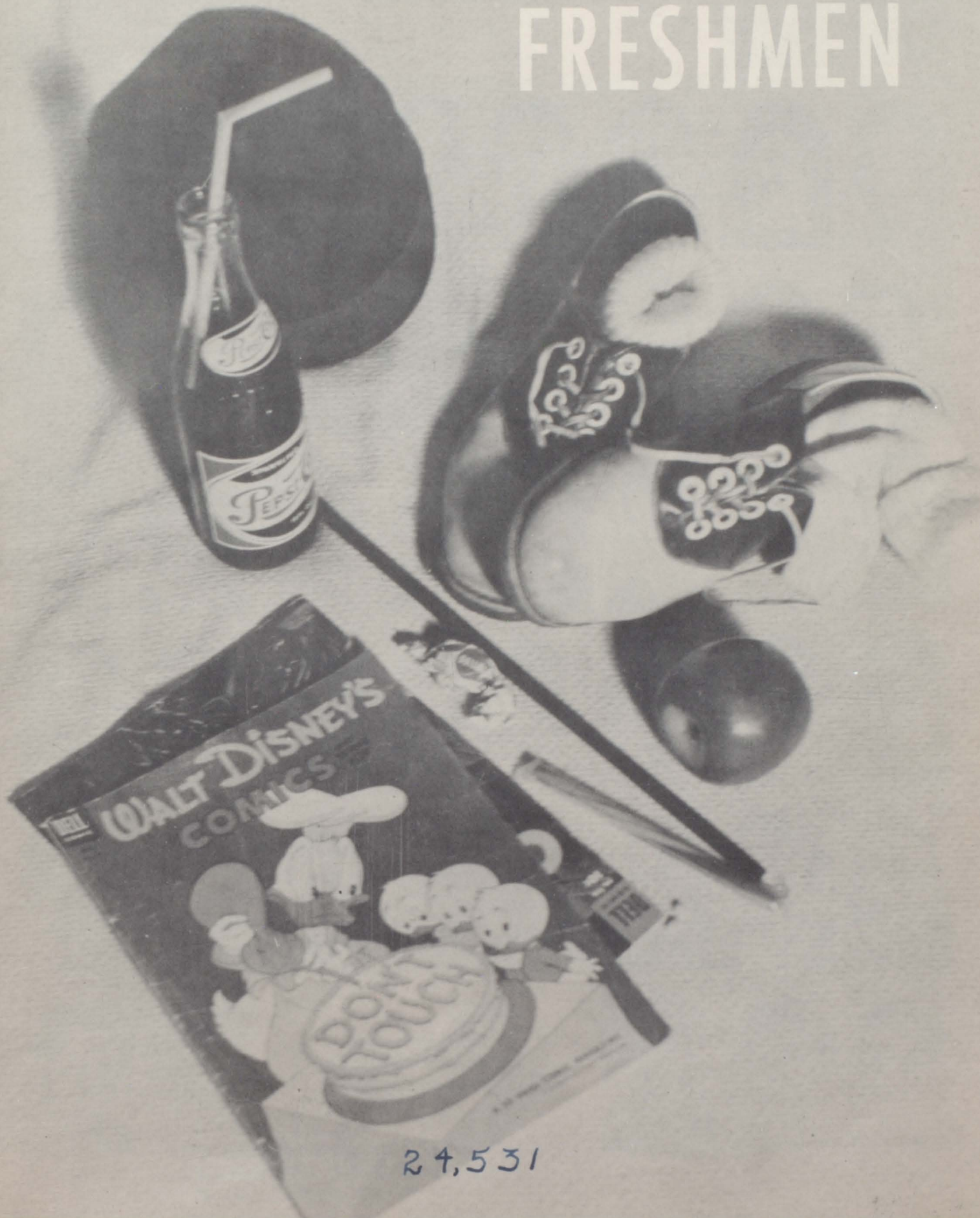
In our yearbook, we want to tell a story in three parts: our memories of yesterday, our activities of today, and our plans for tomorrow.

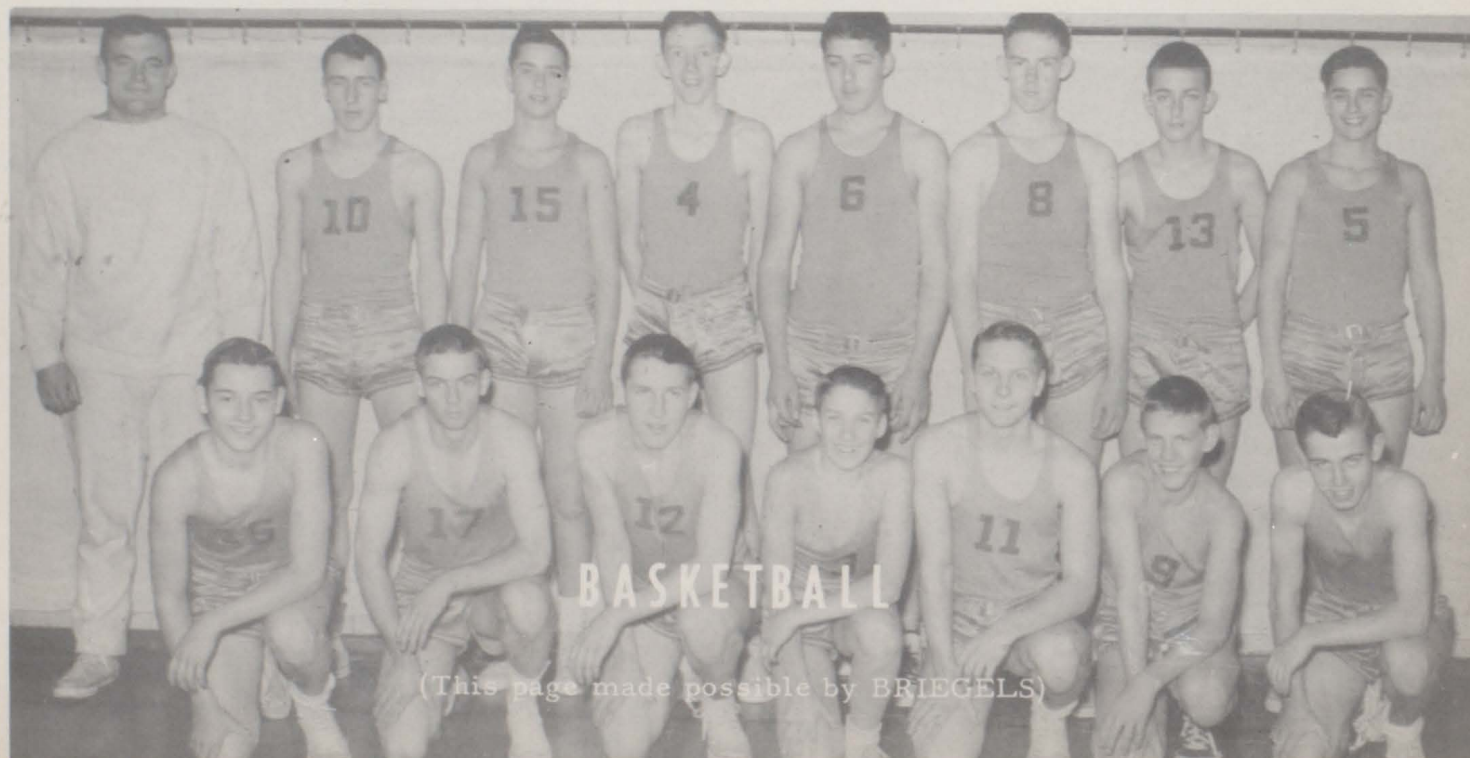

Our final event of the year will be our annual banquet where the awards we have won will be given to the members.

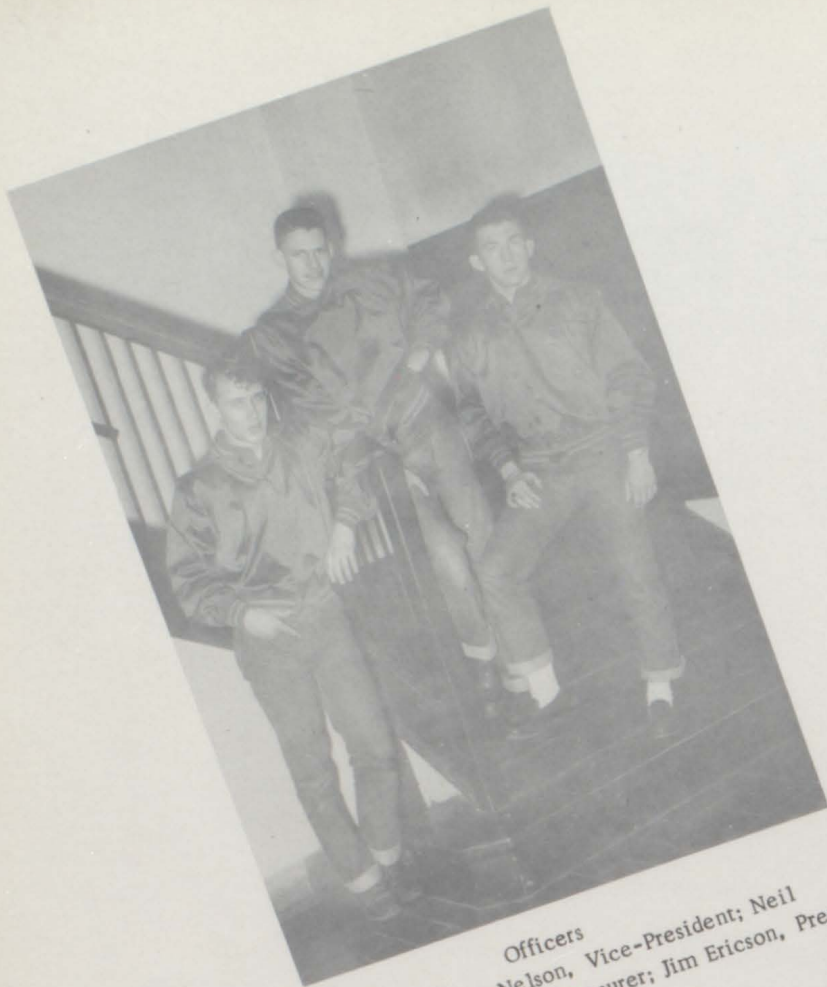

The National Honor Society wishes to thank Mr. Leonard Smith, our sponsor, for helping us make this year a successful one.


