'At the start of the "57" season the uncertain potential of the team and players caused the coaches some concern. Luckily, the returning lettermen were quite evenly distributed among the positions. Most of the boys were confident, maybe just a little too confident, for we lost a heartbreaker the first game.

The defeat by Rova helped give the boys the urge to tie a powerful Wethersfield team 6-6, and defeat Princeville 7-6 and Walnut 32-7. A record crowd attended the Wyoming-Galva game to see a thriller up to the final seconds. Although Wyoming defeated our team 20-13, our boys were never the underdogs and the game ended with the ball in Galva's possession on the one-yard line. The team quickly picked up steam and rolled over Elmwood 13-0, our homecoming game with Bradford 33-0, and our last game of the season with Toulon 13-0, to finish the season with third place in the Blackhawk Conference. As a summary, the team won 5 games, lost 2, and tied 1 for a very fine season.


### CLASS PROPHECY
