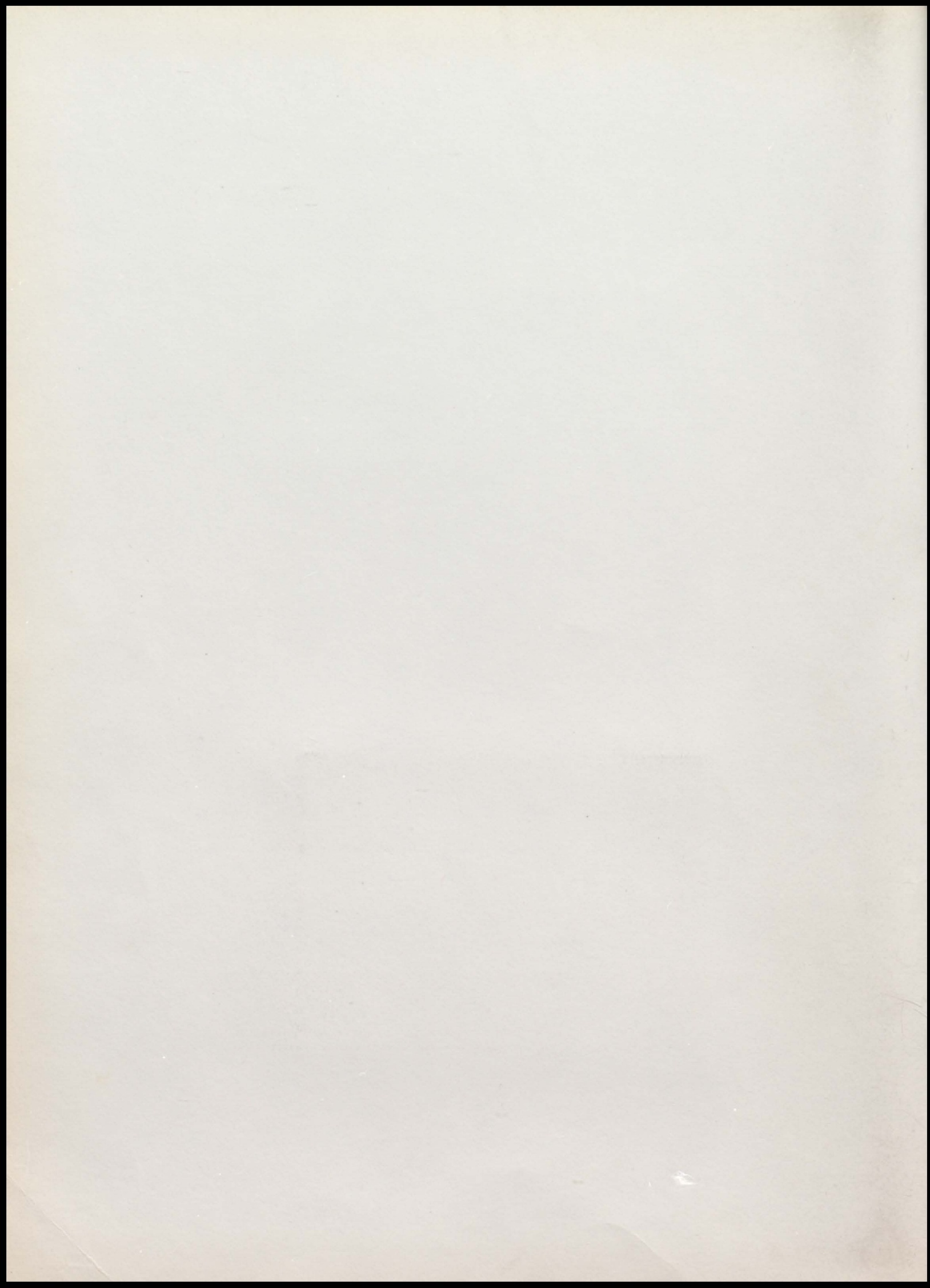

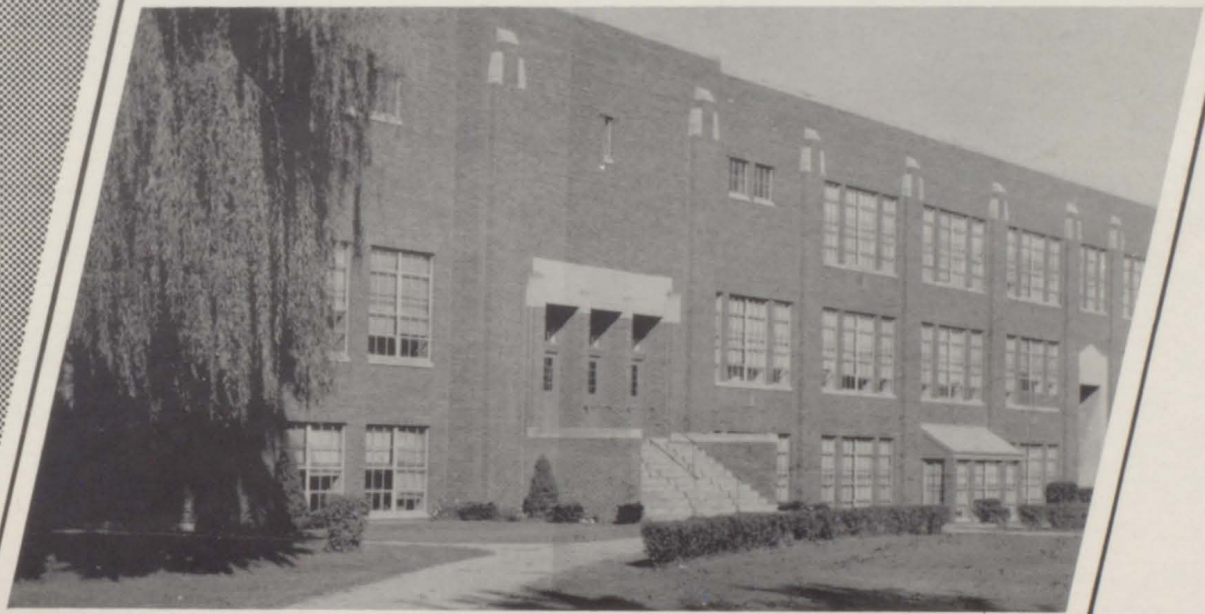

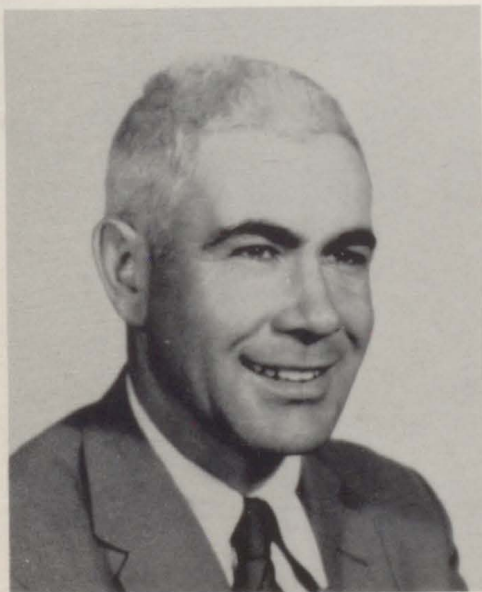
FOREWORD

The next day came the parade with the school bands, floats from each class, and scores of decorated bicycles.



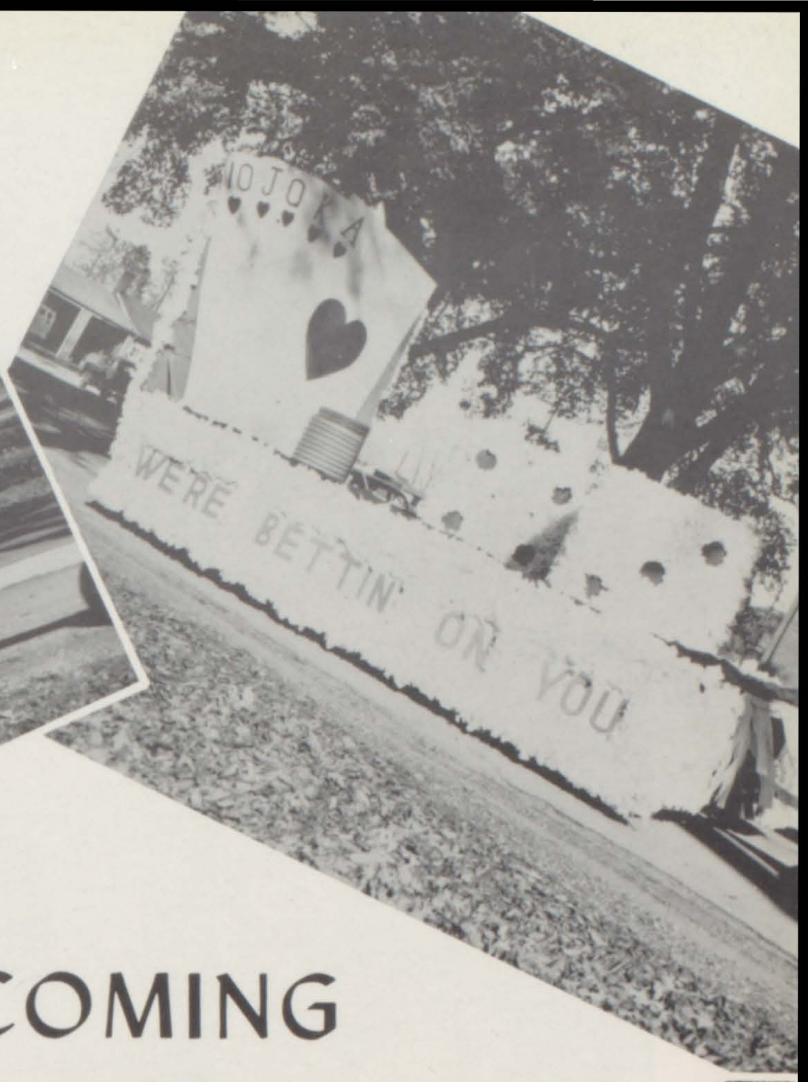
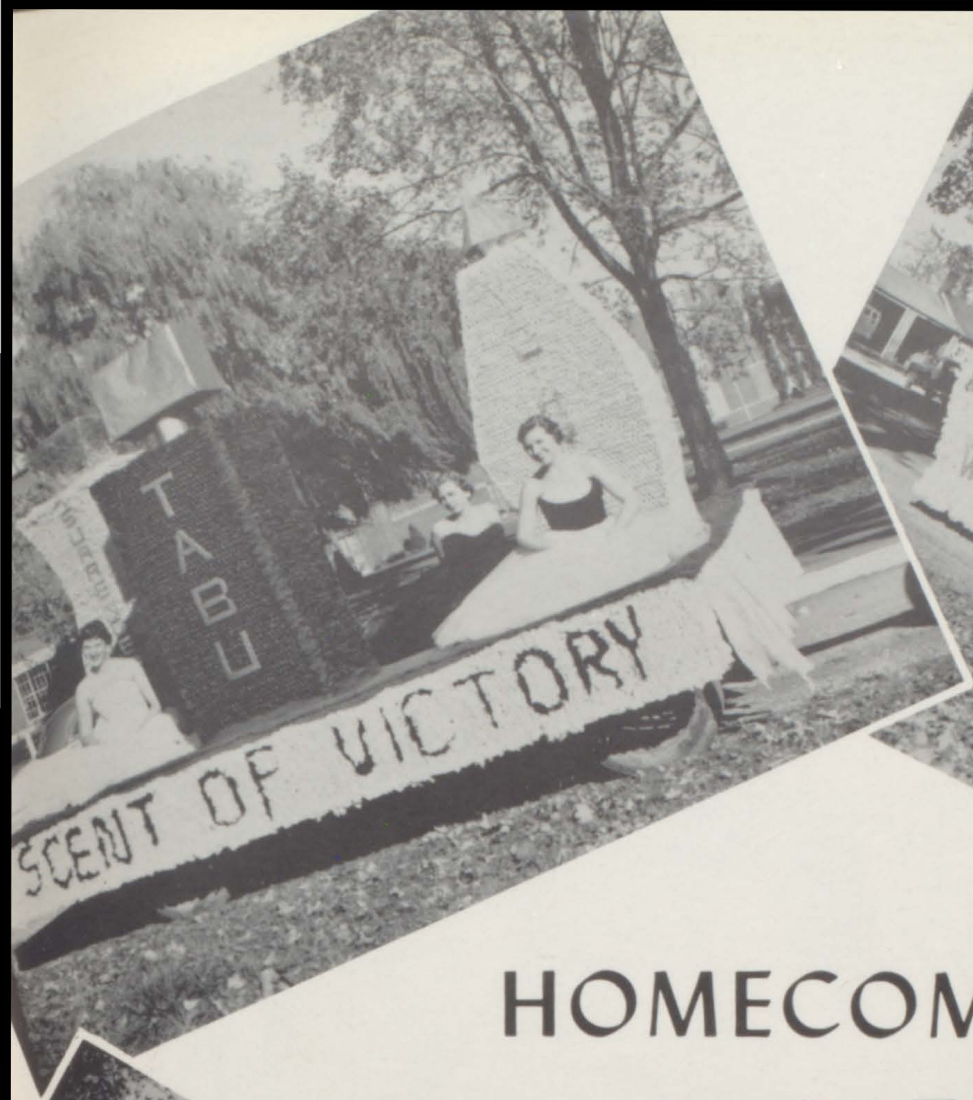

This year for the first time in several years we had an F.F.A. school dance on March 14. We also had a parents' night program and potluck March 19.

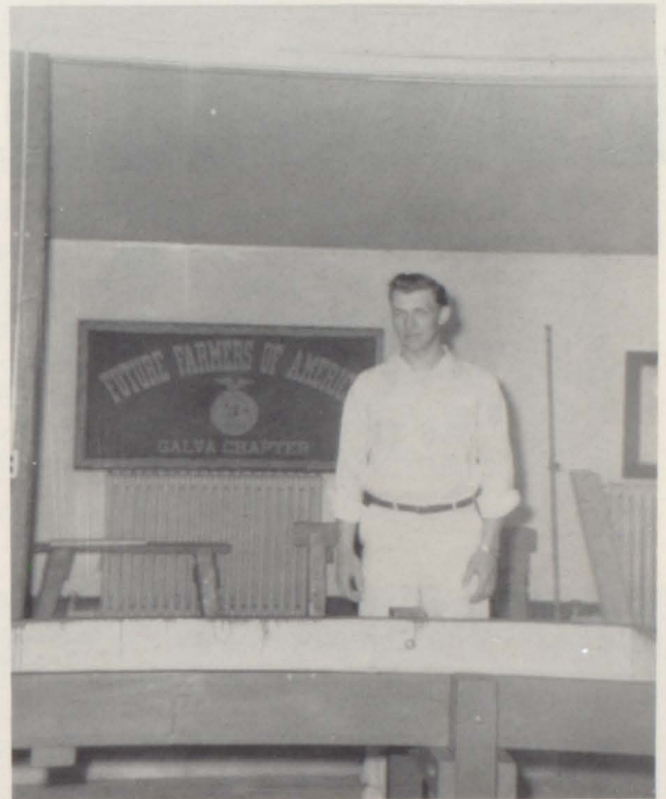

The National Honor Society is under the sponsorship of Leonard Smith.

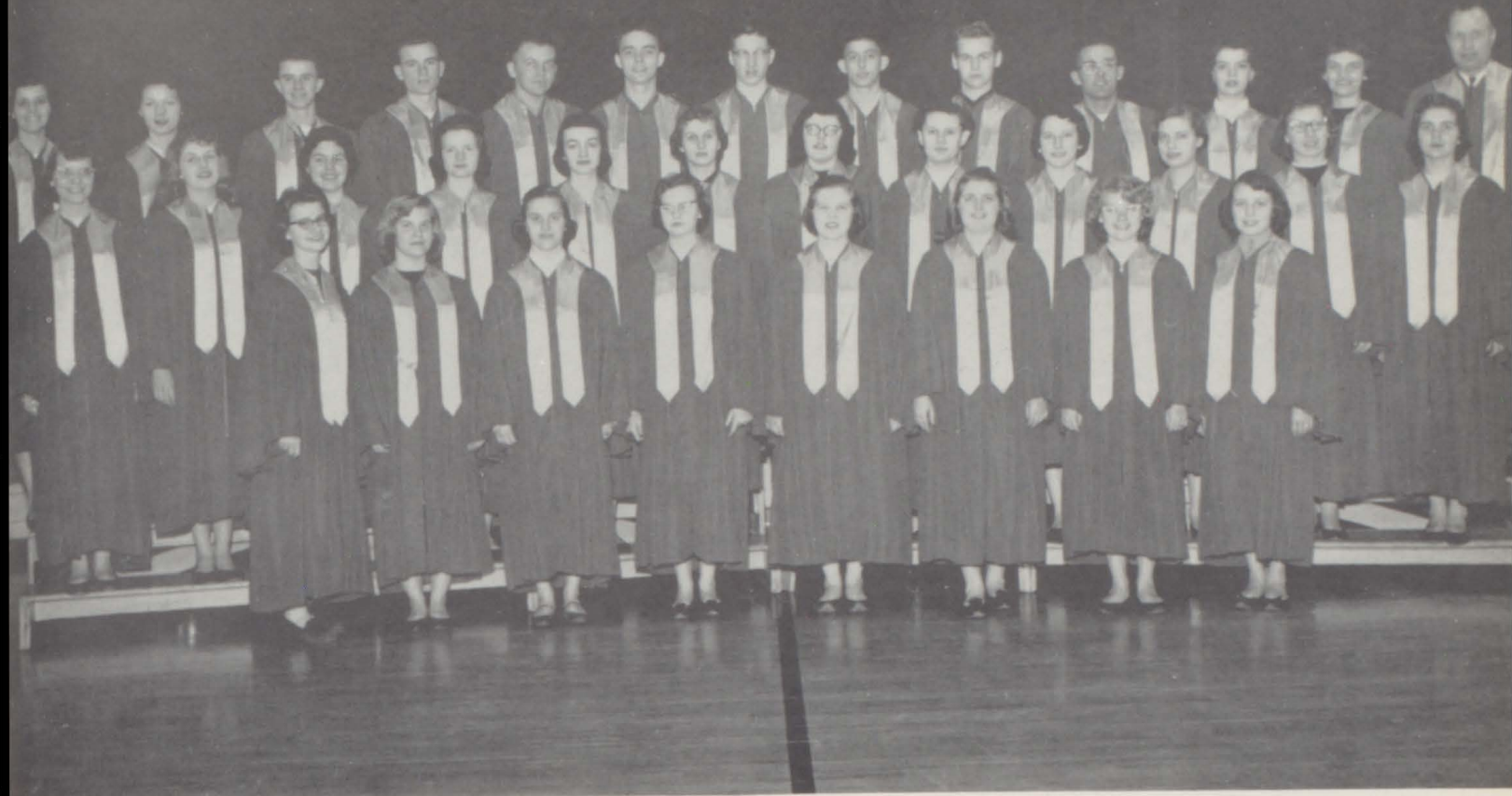

Their many activities included singing at the Christmas Concert. However, the student body witnessed a preview of their program at an assembly which was held to celebrate Christmas.

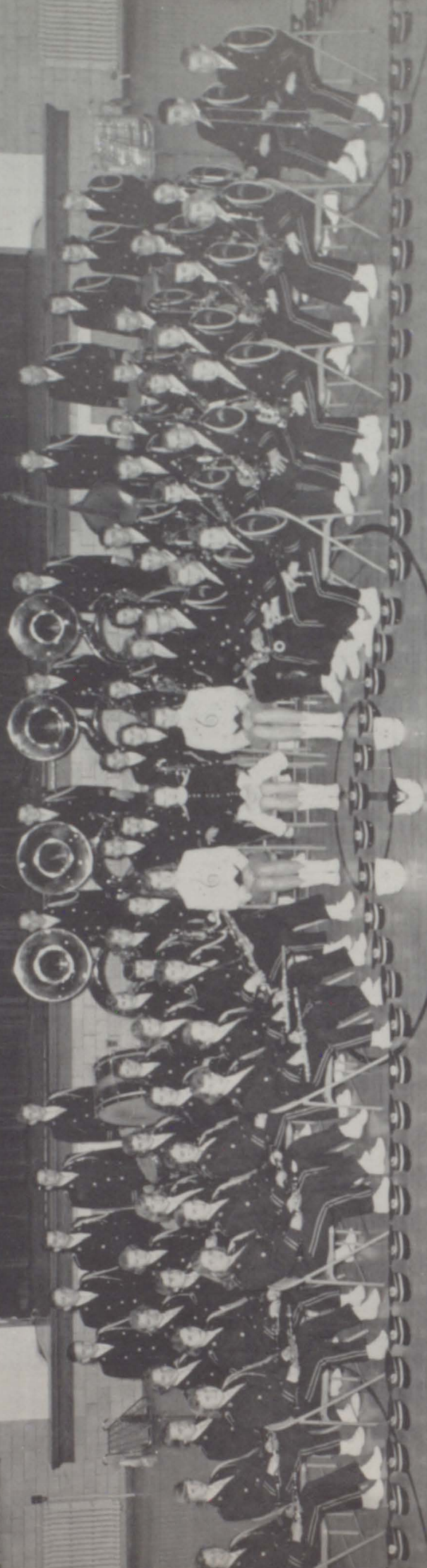
Again this year, the chorus participated in the Blackhawk Vocal Festival at Princeville.

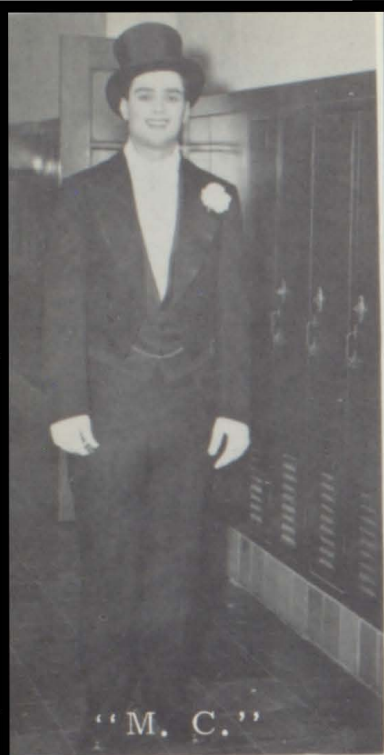
The calendar for the Senior Band during the 1957-1958 term has certainly been a busy one. Everyone worked hard to make all the activities undertaken a success.

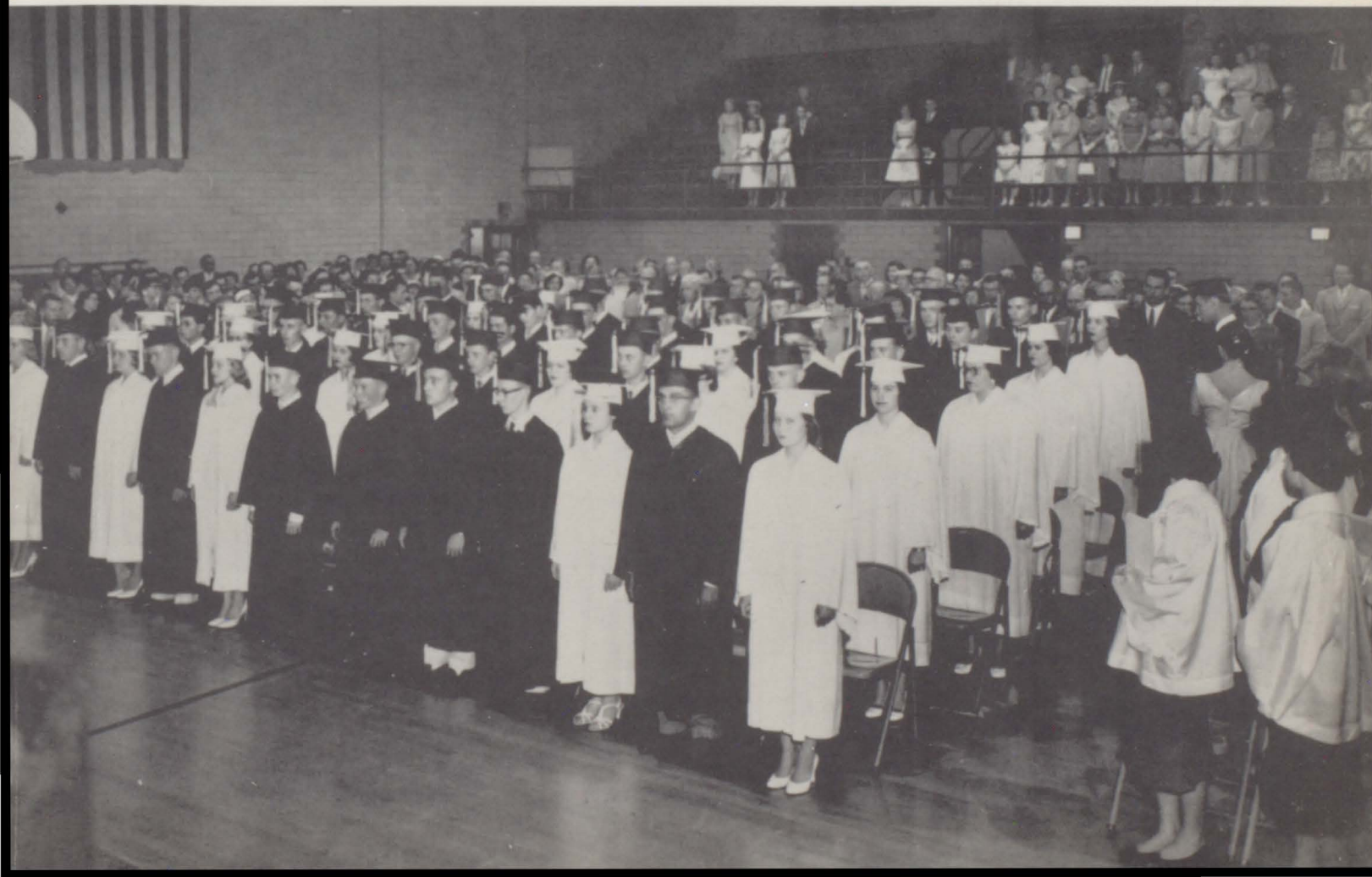
