## VARSITY

Playing against tough competition the squad found the going a little rough at times this year. In conference play, the record was 12 wins - 4 losses, which rated second place, only one game behind the champs. All four of those games were close ones. They advanced to the finals in the Regional for the second consecutive year, losing to Galesburg. The season's record was 16-10.

Richard Falk set a new season's scoring record, making a total of 635 points, 24.423 per game. He was also the winner of the Eugene Anderson Memorial award.



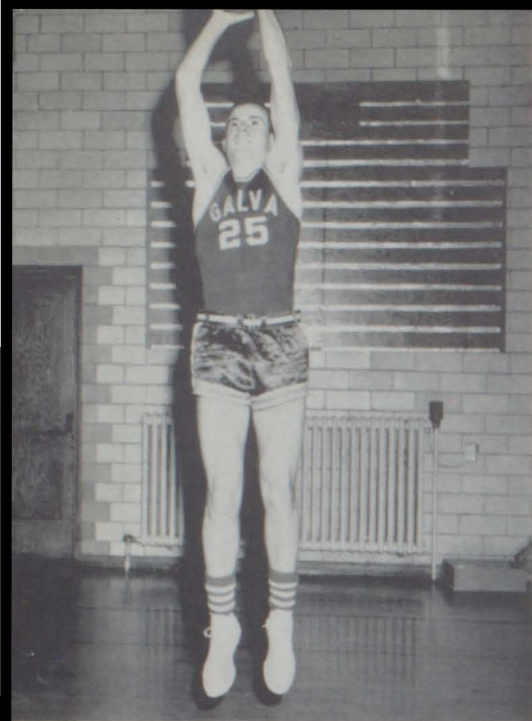

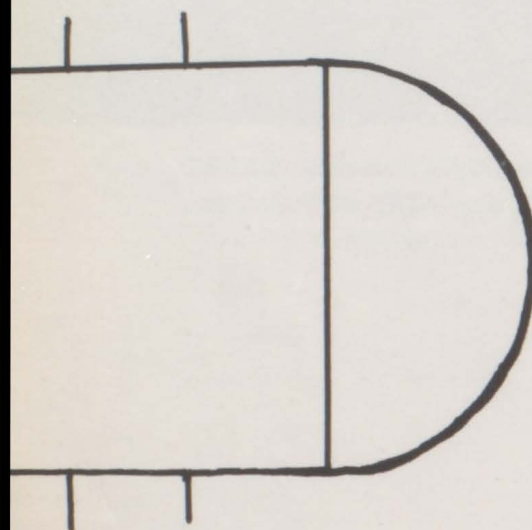
## B - SQUAD

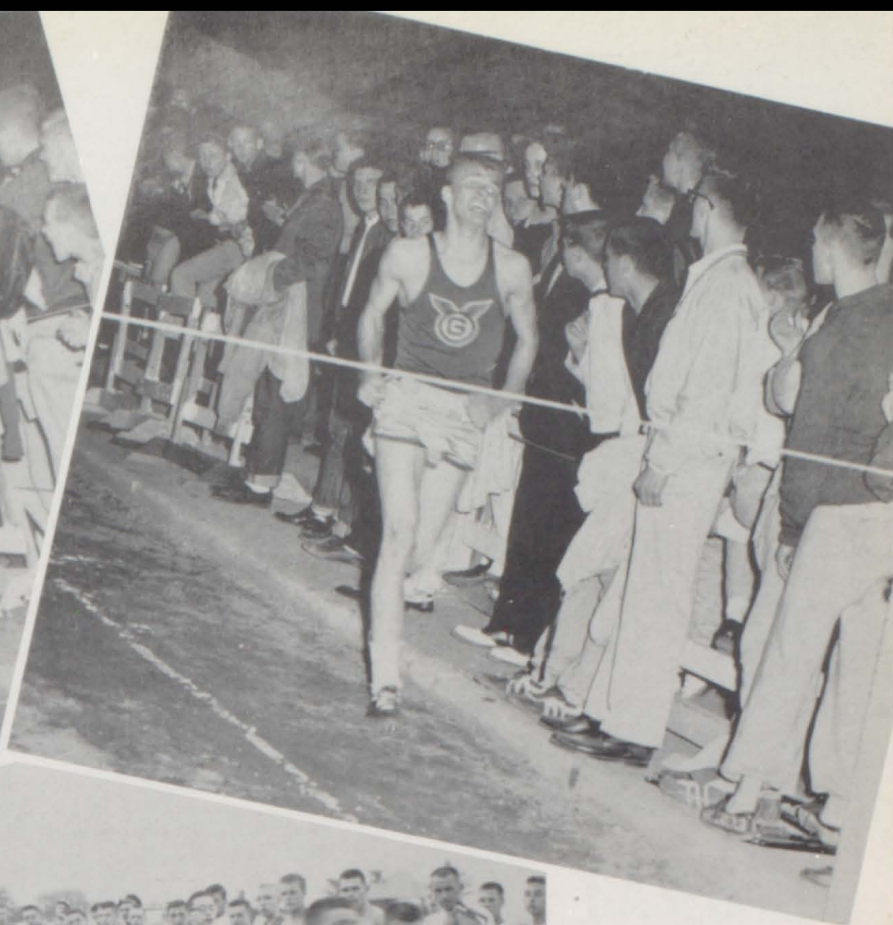
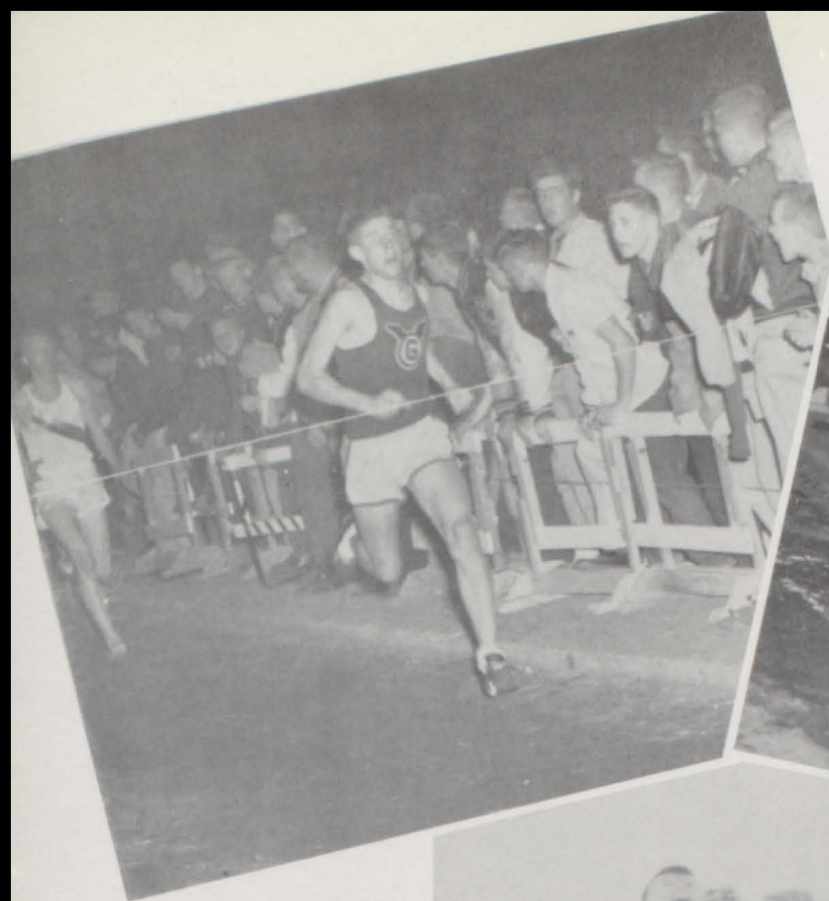
## TRACK

The members of the student council would like to thank you, Mr. Whitehouse, for your able assistance in all council activities.



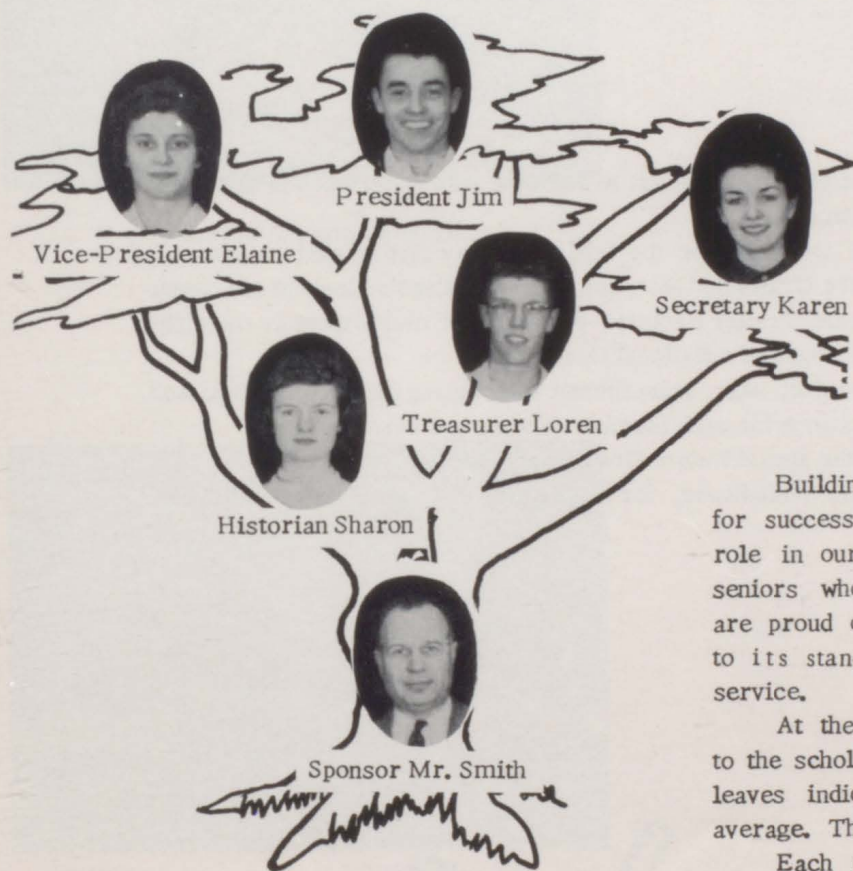

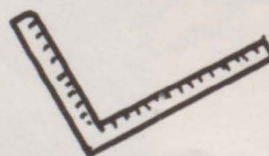
Fourteen new members were formally welcomed at the initiation party that started the year off.

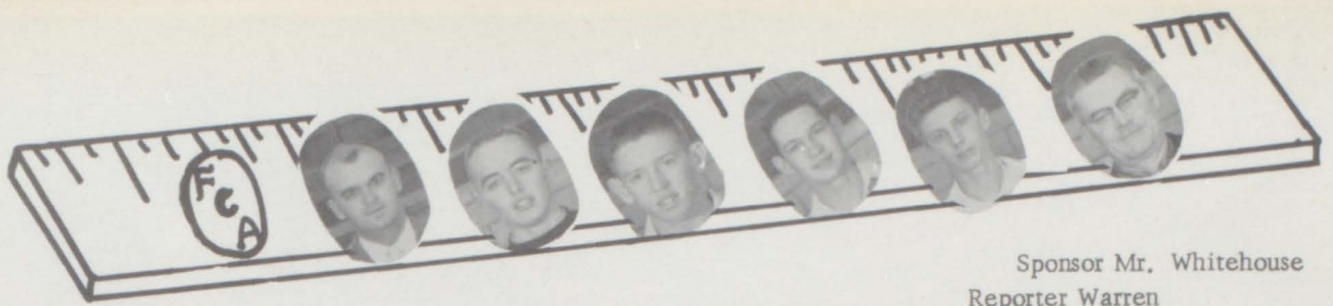
The most profitable money-making project was refreshment sales during the Galva Invitational Tournament. The four night event provided a chance for each member to work and earn points.

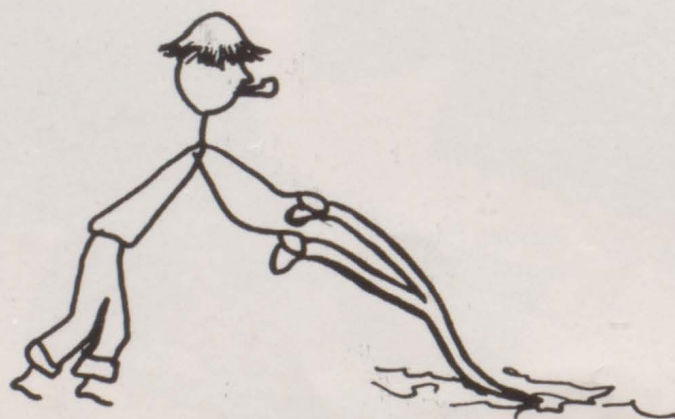
## FUTURE

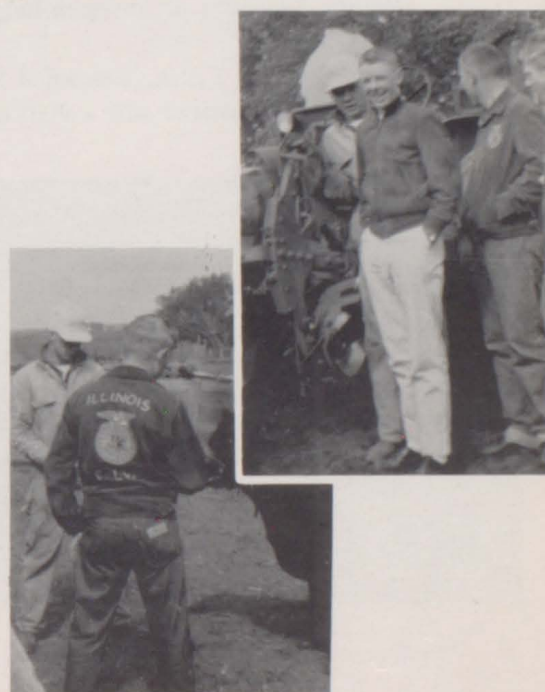

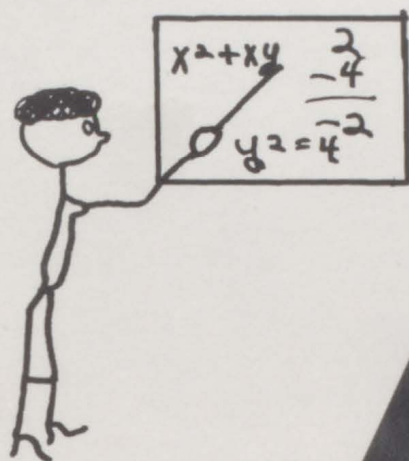

Such has been the year of this club which adds to our building for success.

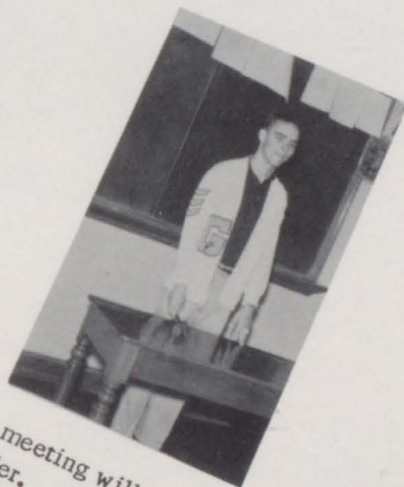




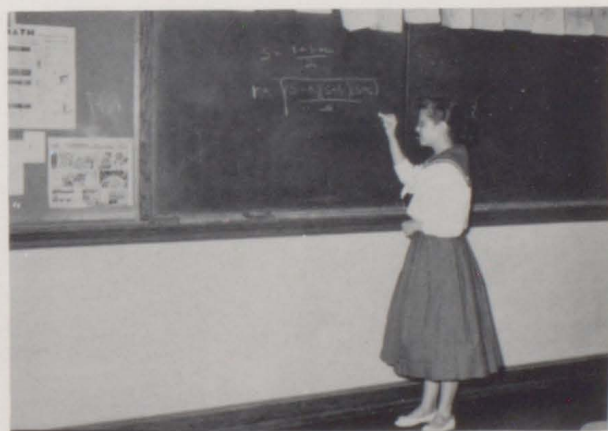

Mr. Smith, our director, has been very helpful and patient in our "building for success." Thanks, Mr. Smith.

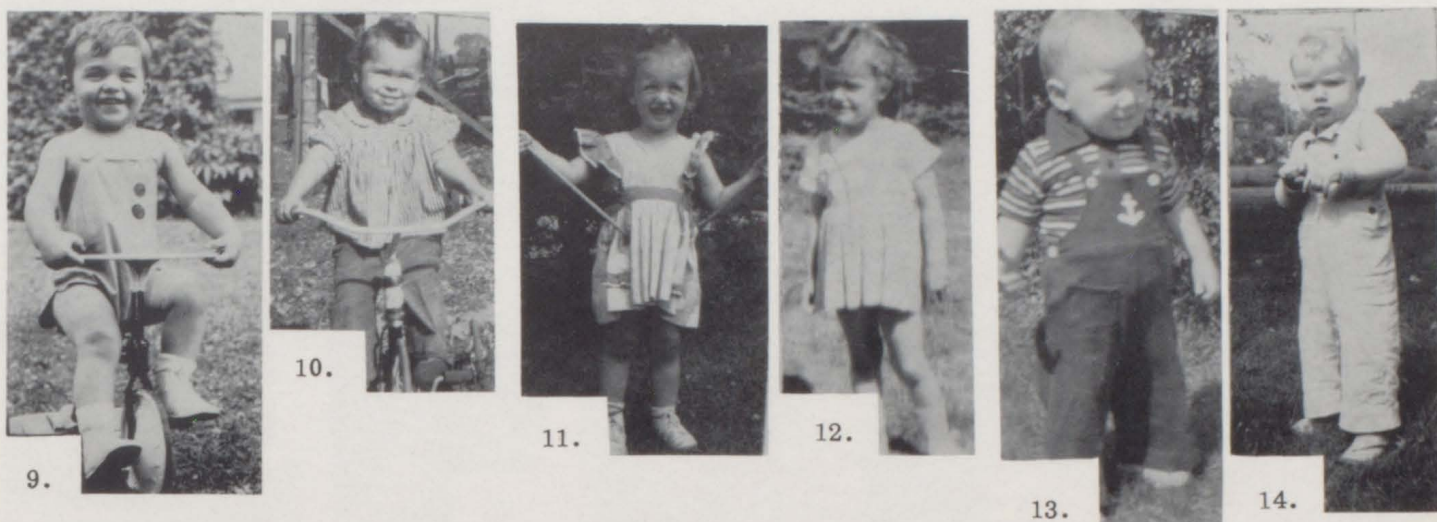

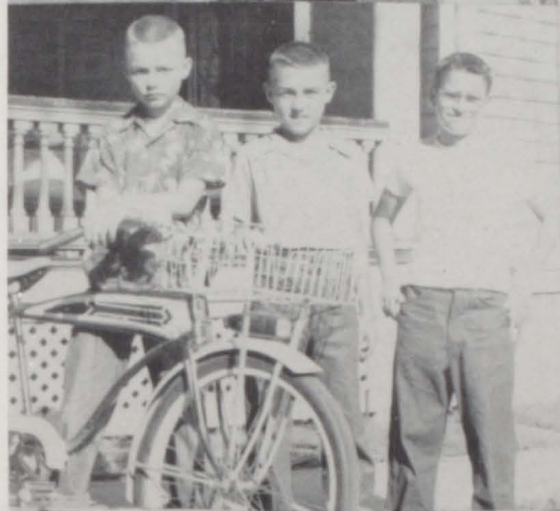














# JUNIOR-SENIOR PROM

# IN RETROSPECT

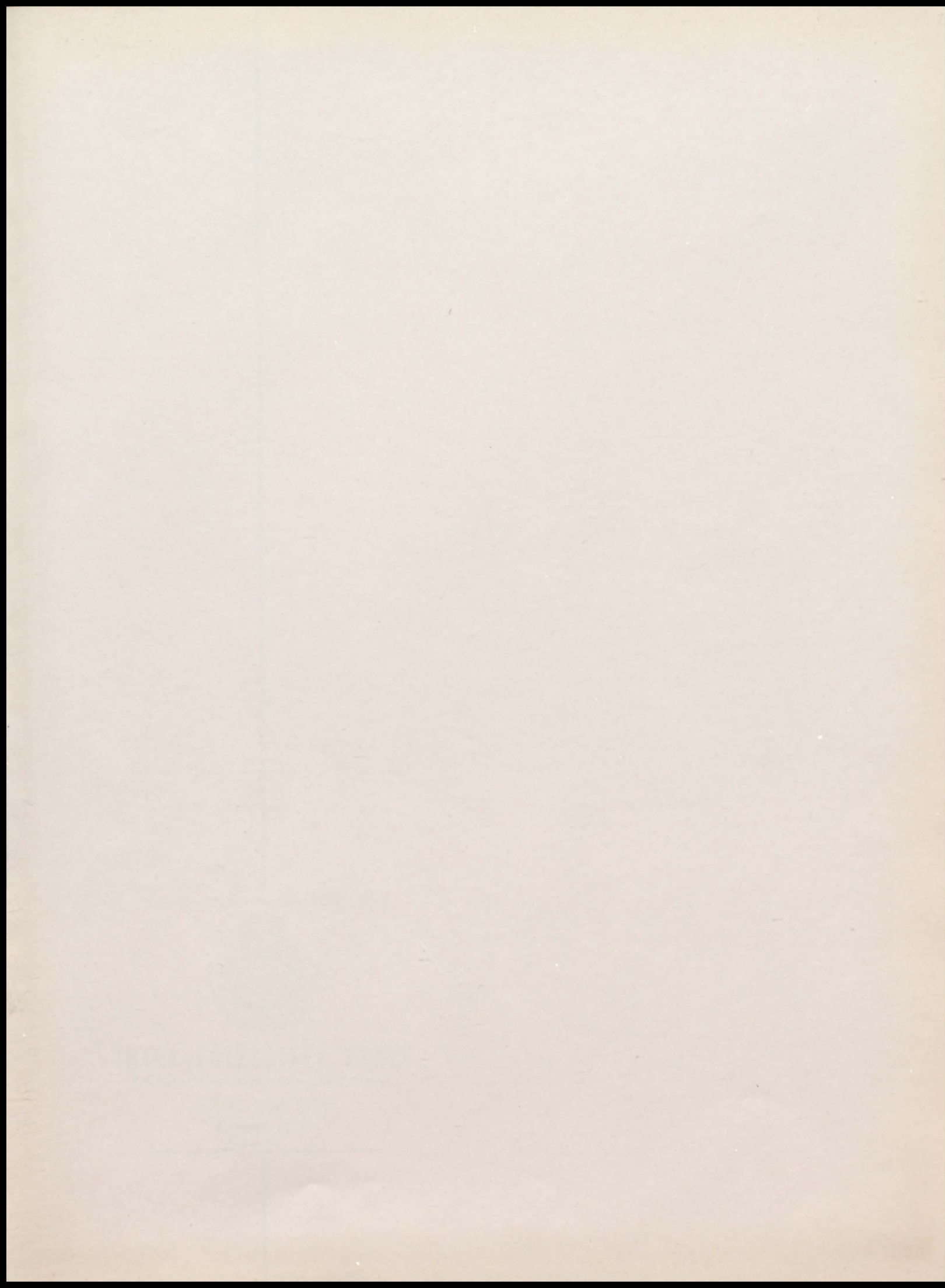

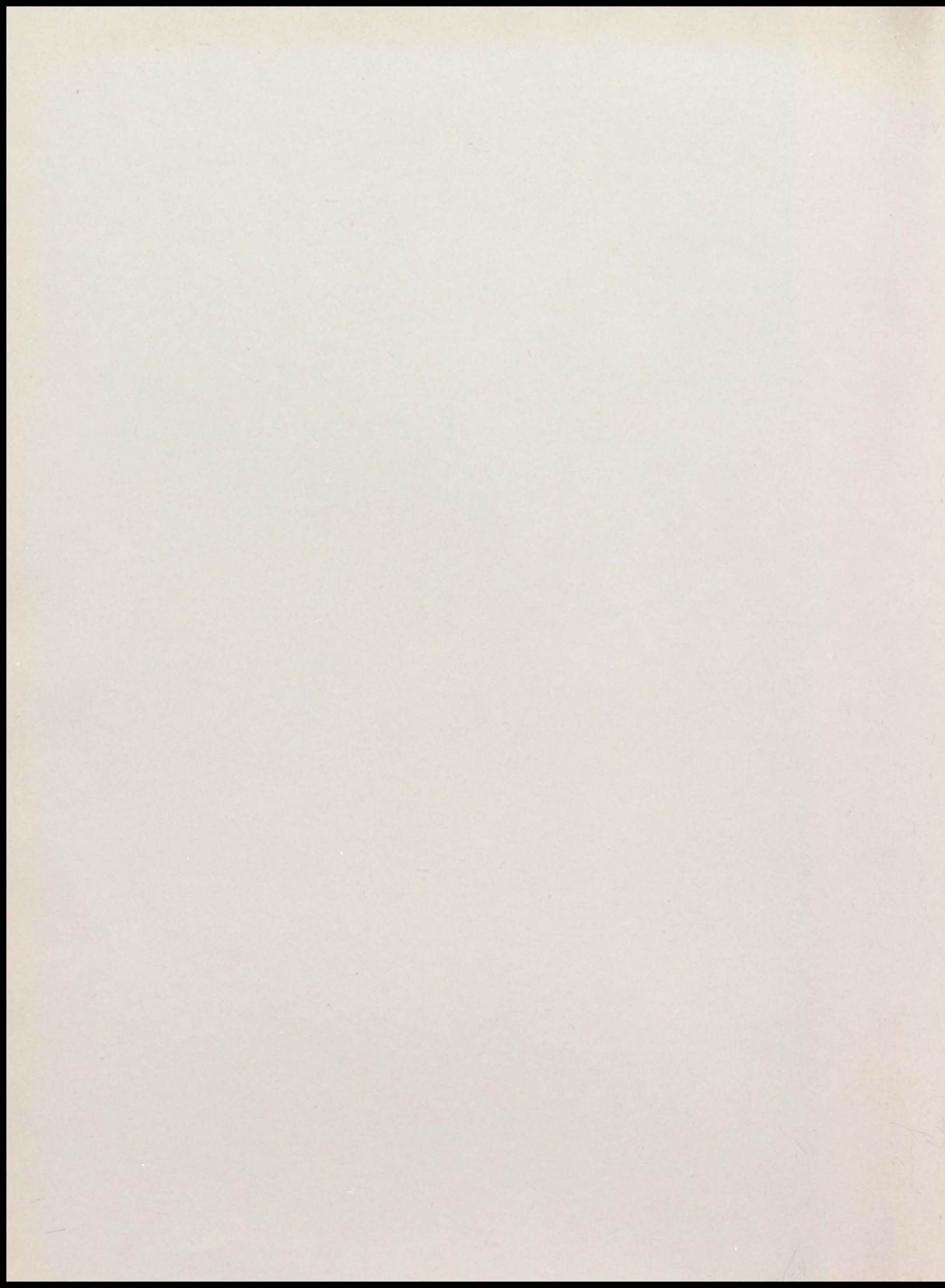
