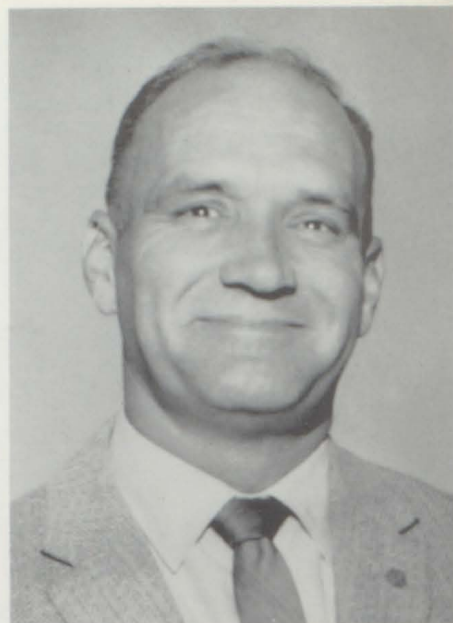
And when they, as retiring players in this game of life, take off their shoes to pass them on to the next generation, let it be said of them that they did, in reality, "Fill the shoes of life."

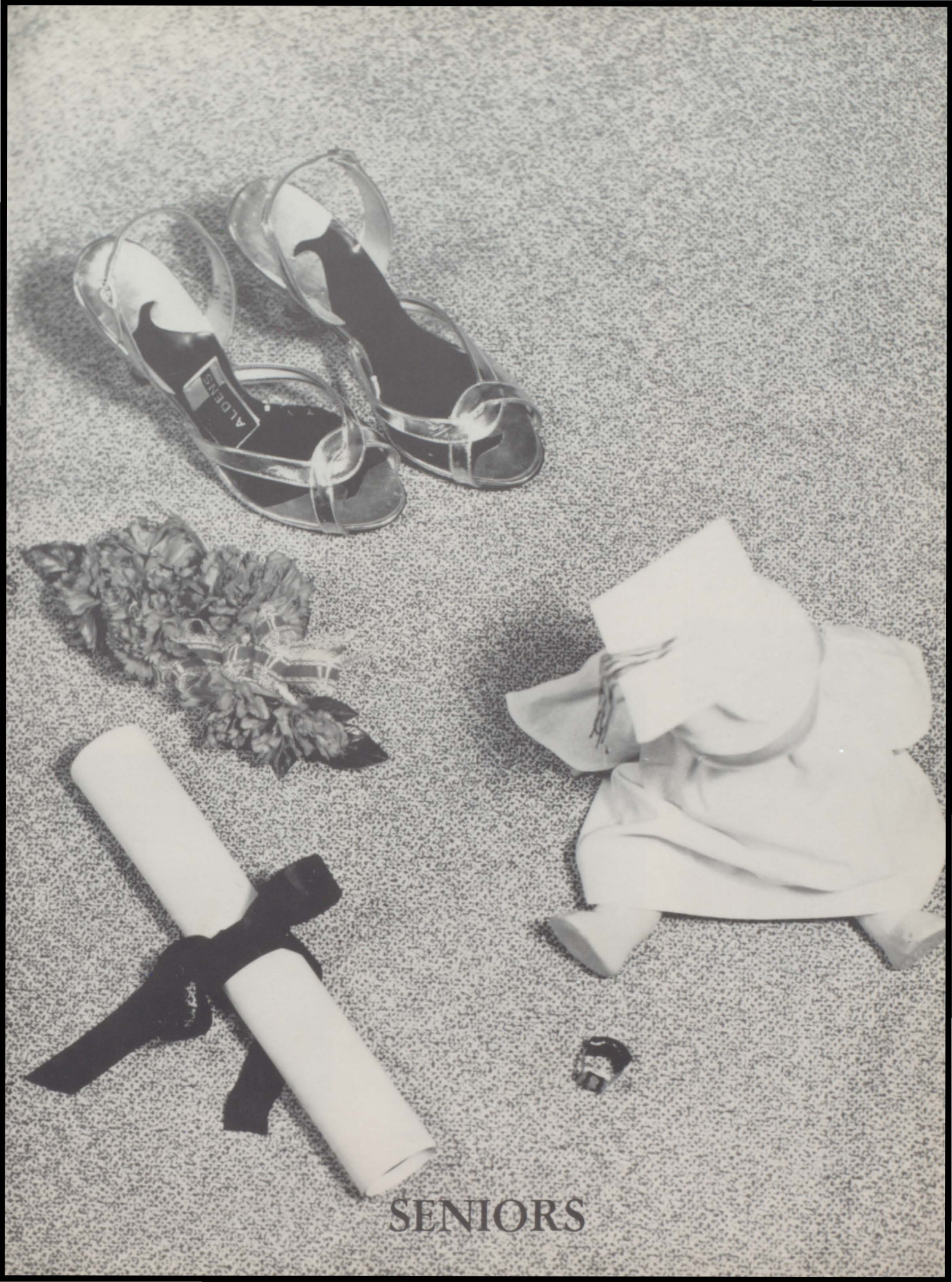


# IN MEMORIAM

Paul Myers placed second in the 880 in the district and therefore, made the trip to the State Track meet at Champaign, where he placed eighth.

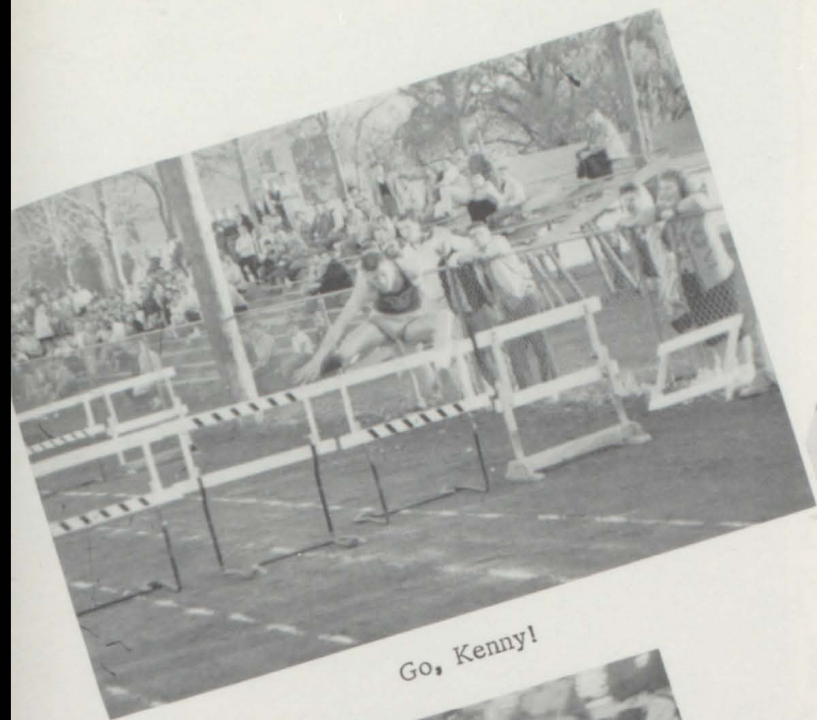

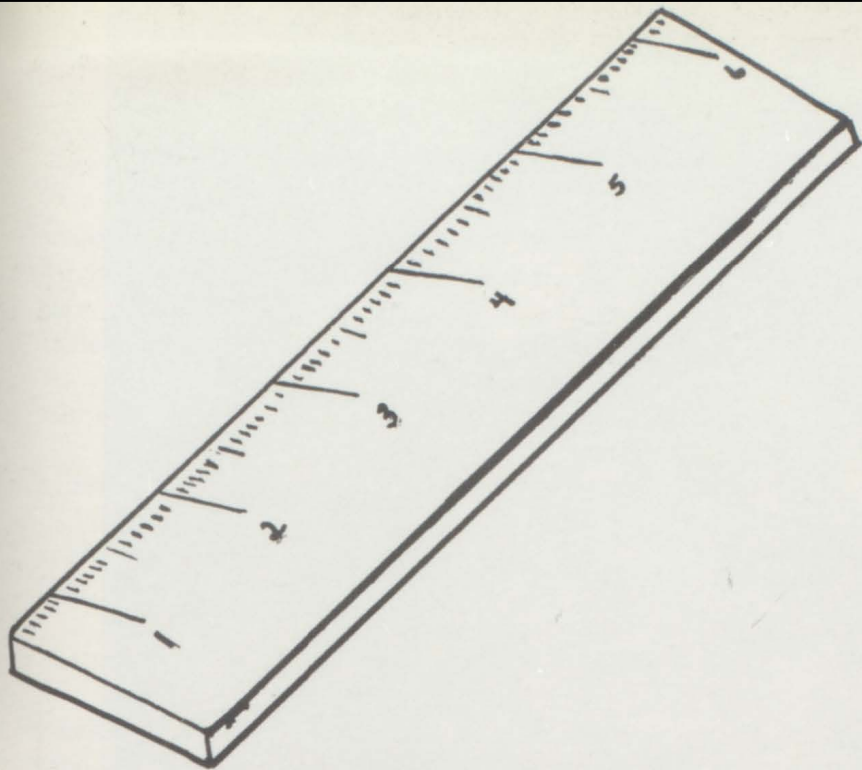
## FUTURE TEACHERS OF AMERICA

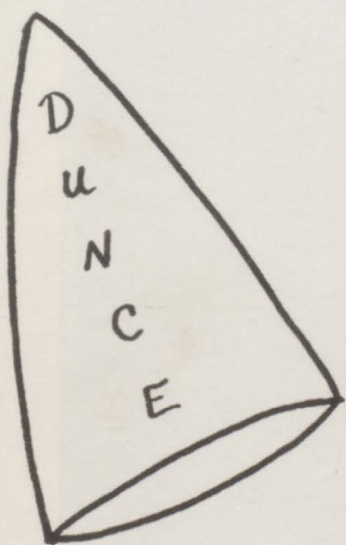




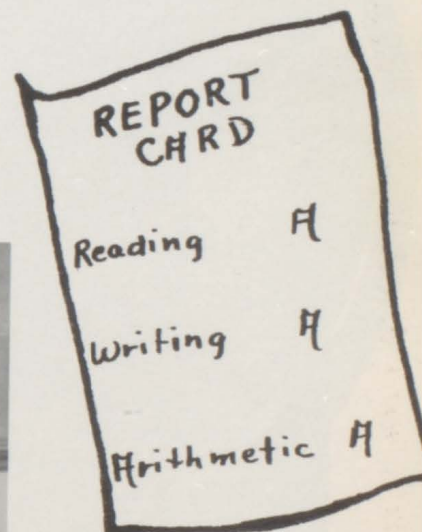

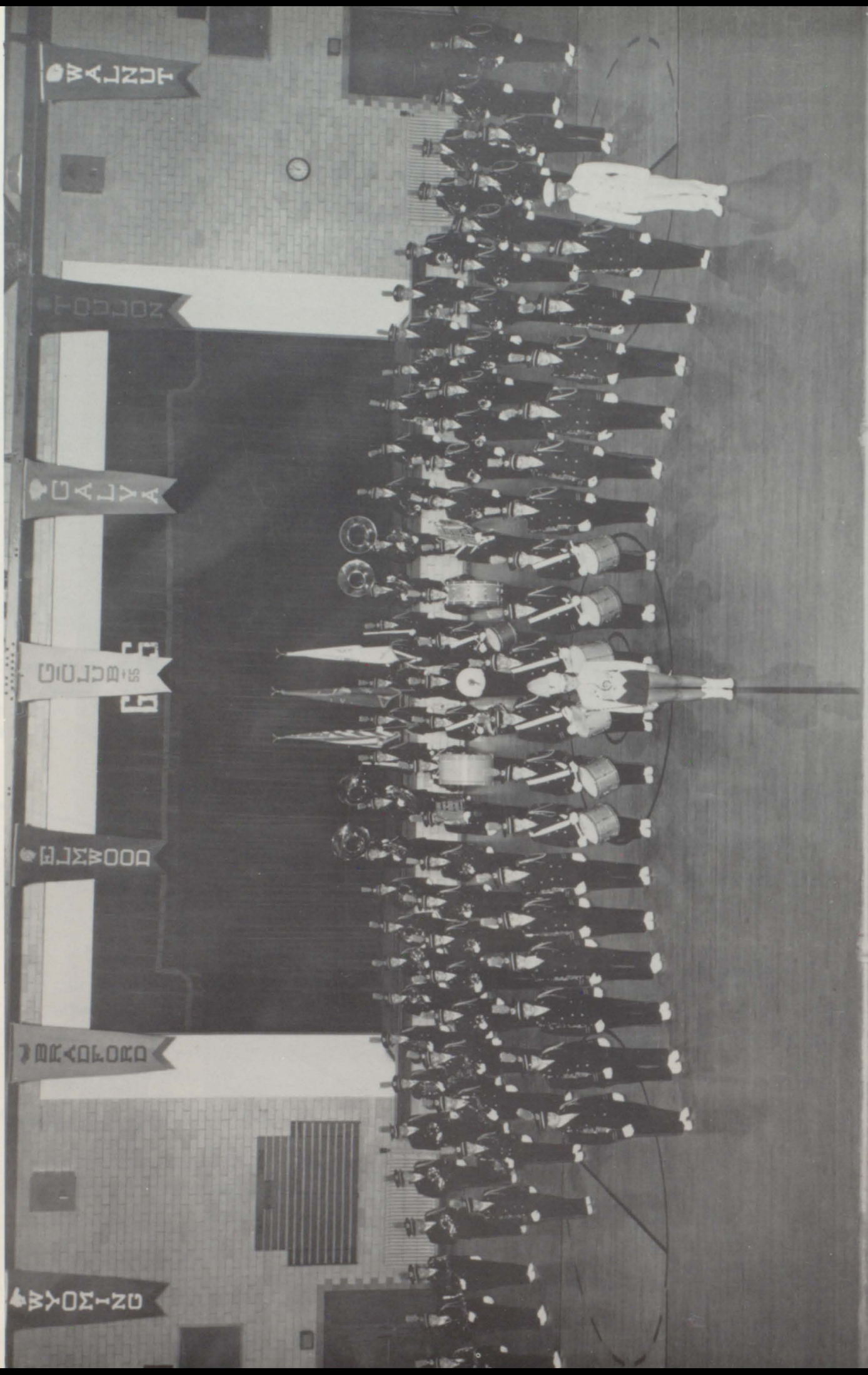

Our fine dance band played for a family dancing party and two school exchange programs.

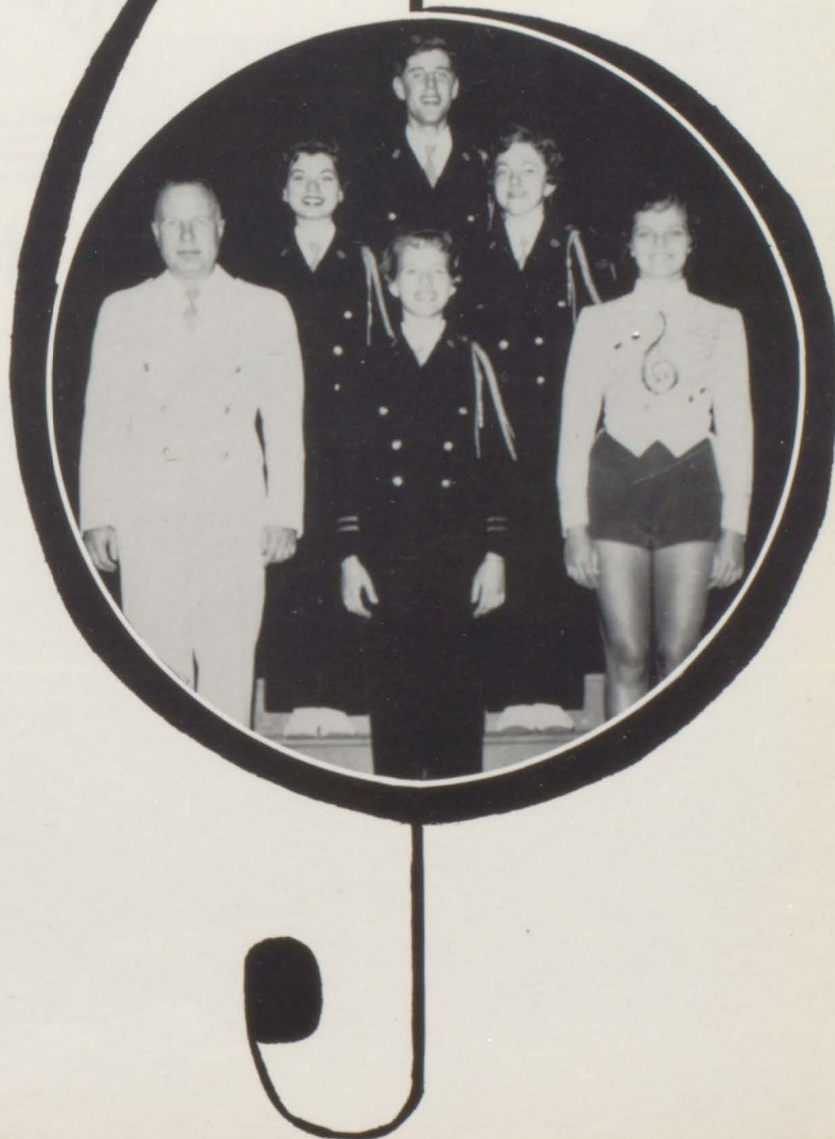
"Magic of Music" was the theme of our spring concert. Several special numbers included baton twirling, a dance routine with black light, and a peanut vendor.
