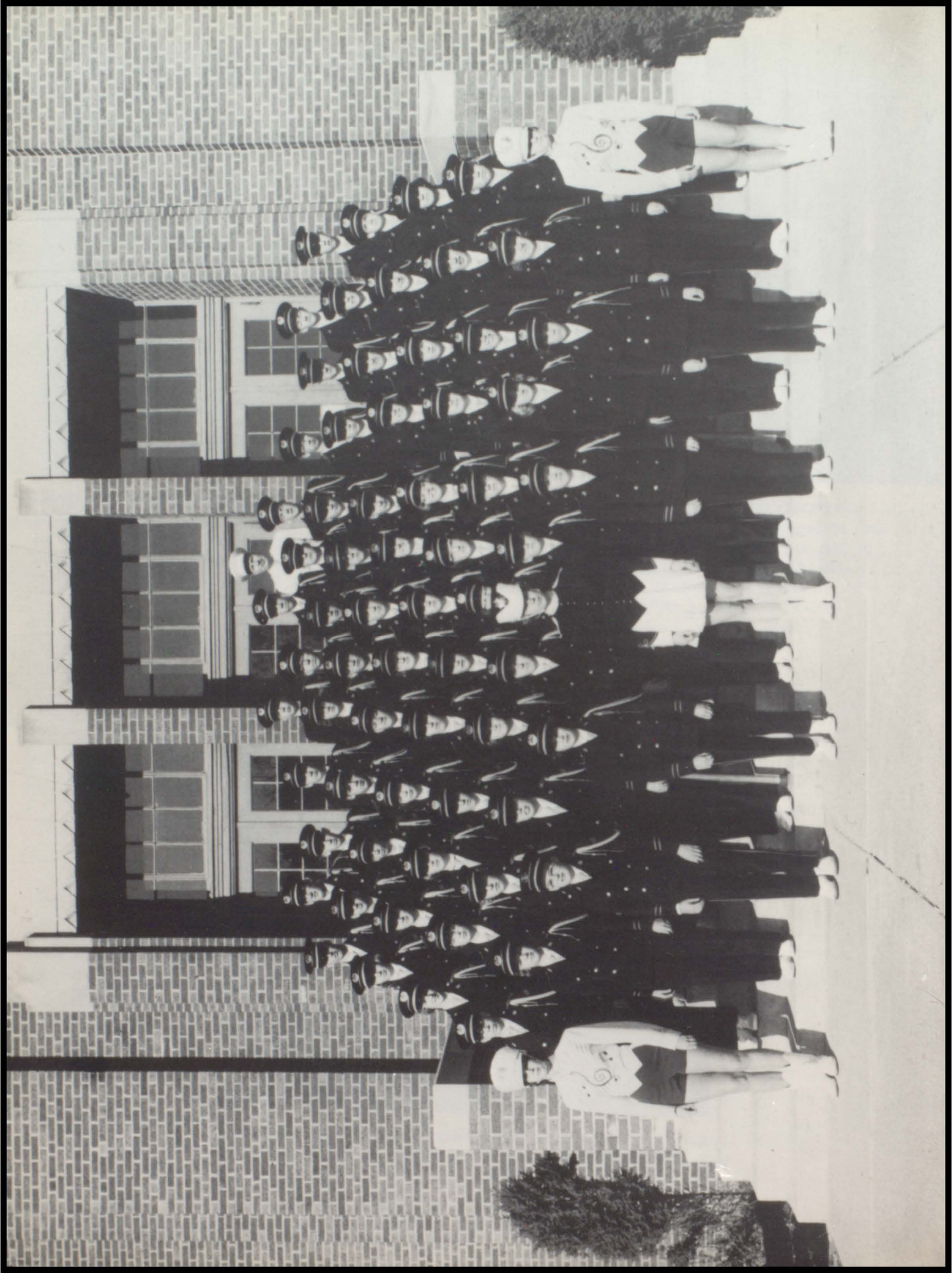

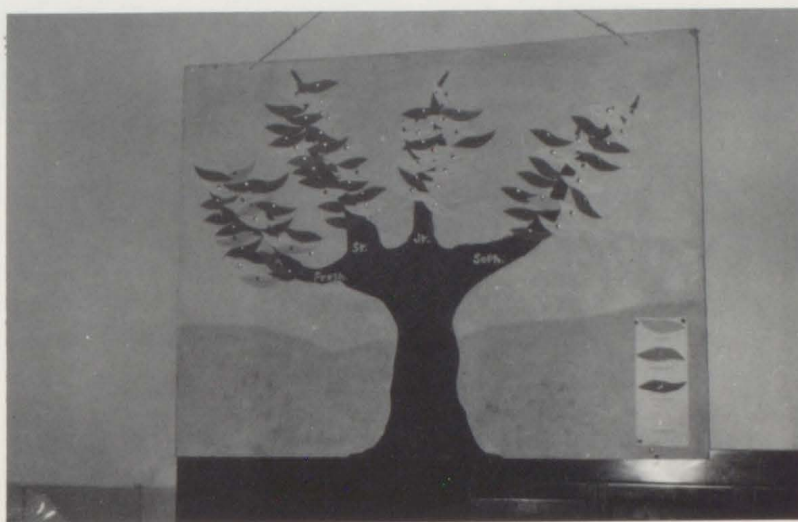

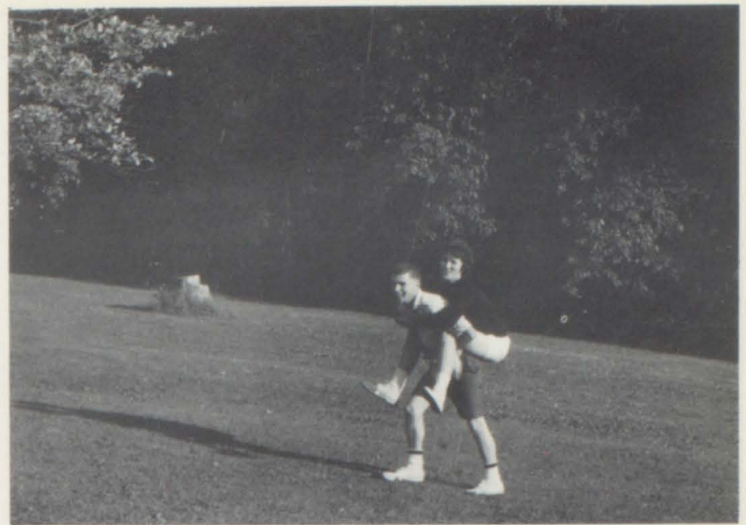




SENIOR PICNIC

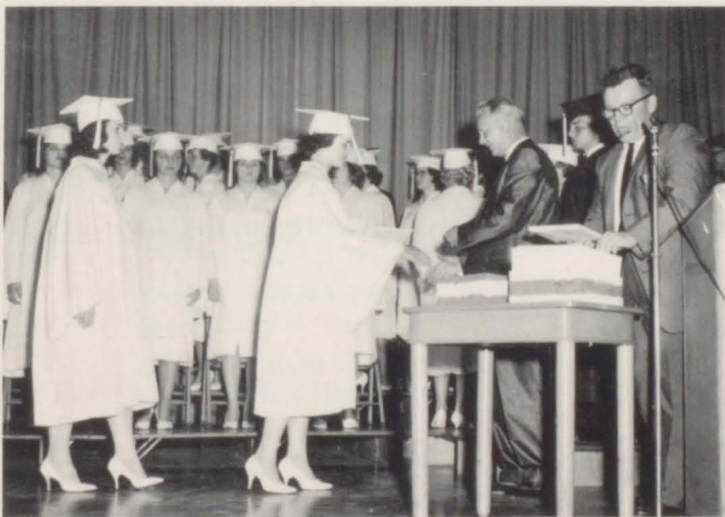

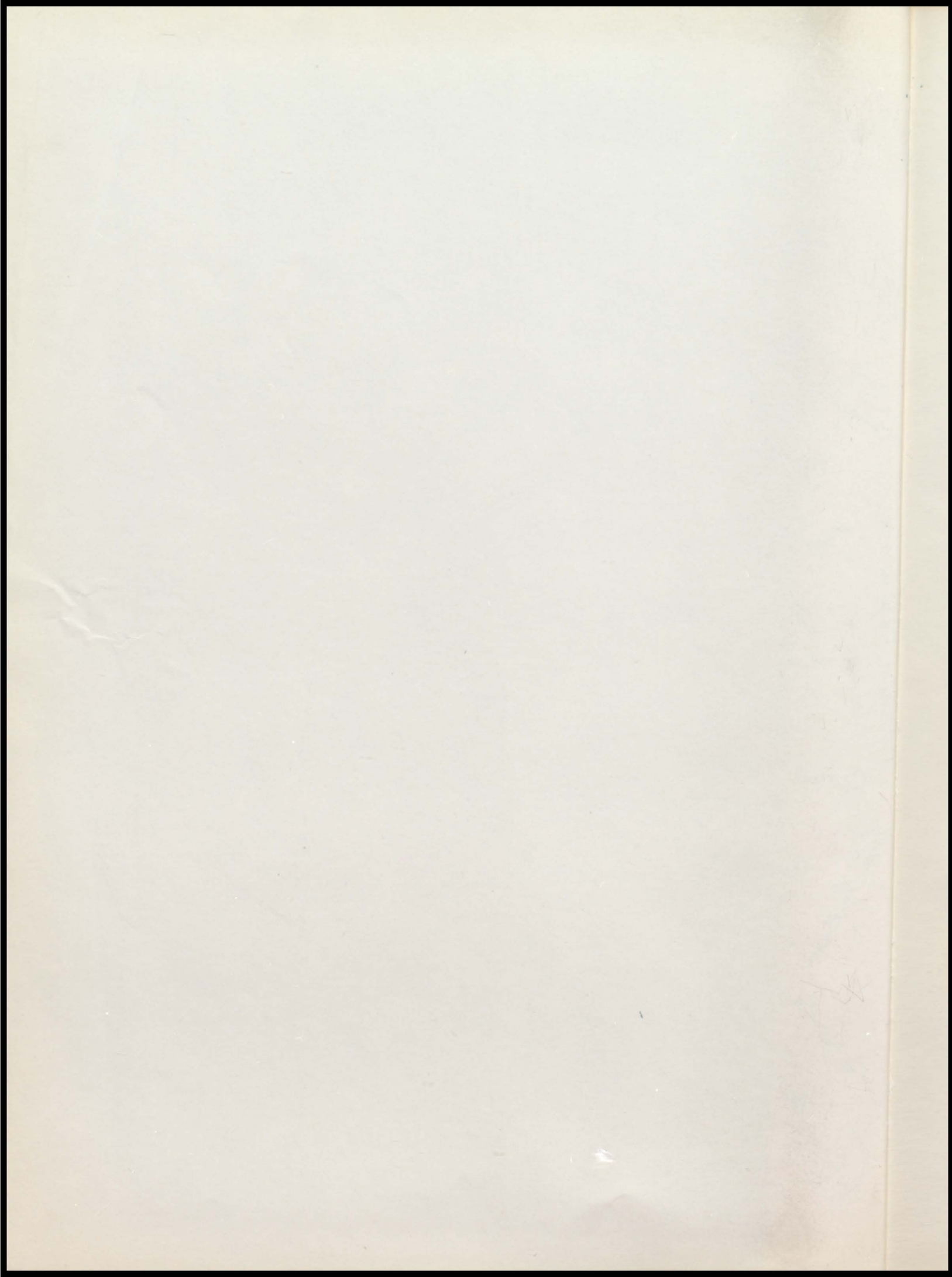
