


DEDICATION

Miller's 436 Points Tops Cat Scoring

Junior Rich Miller was Galva's biggest point maker in the 24 games played by the Wildcats during the regular season.

Miller not only led the Cats in total points, but posted the highest shooting percentage among the regulars. Rich hit on 169 of 304 field goal attempts and on 98 of 141 free throw opportunities for 436 points — an average of 18.12 per game.

Miller connected on .556 per cent of his field goal attempts and .695 per cent of his charity tosses. Only Kempin posted a higher field goal average. He hit on 10 of 12 shots from the floor for an .833 percentage.

Bryan Humphrey was second in scoring with 292 points. Denny Lewin posted the top free throw percentage, .771, as he canned 47 of 61 chances.

The Cats rolled up 1629 points in winning 24 games in a row without a defeat.

Humphrey was not only second in scoring but collected the greatest number of assists on baskets, 150. John Vaughan was the club's top rebounder with 177 offensive and defensive rebounds. Miller was the rebounder under the ofwith 74 while fensive board Vaughan Galva's provided strength under the defensive board, grabbing 116 rebounds.



That 24-0 in front of the jubilant Galva High School basketball team is the record compiled during the regular season completed Friday night. It was the first time in history a Wildcat basketball team has gone through an entire season without a loss. Since then the Cats have won their second state tournament game for a 26-0 mark. 

The band wishes to thank Mr. Smith for making this year a memorable and rewarding one.




