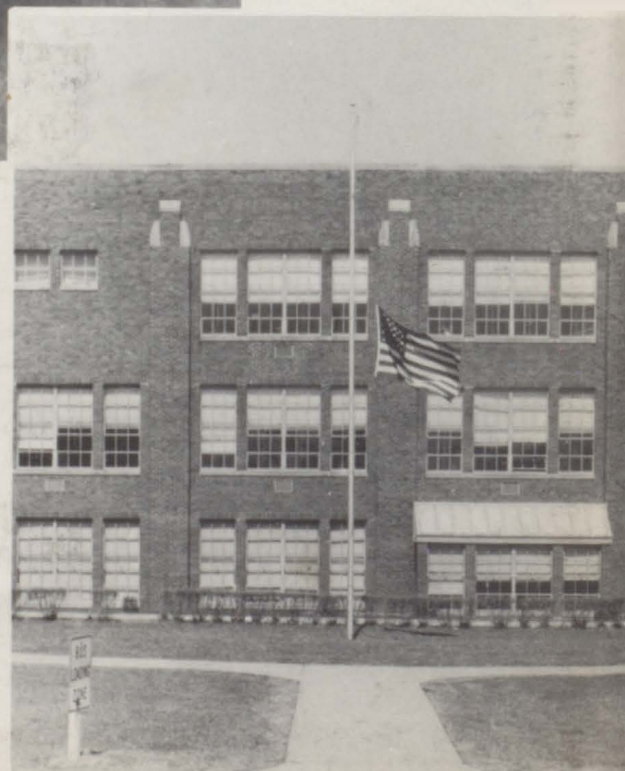
IN MEMORIAM

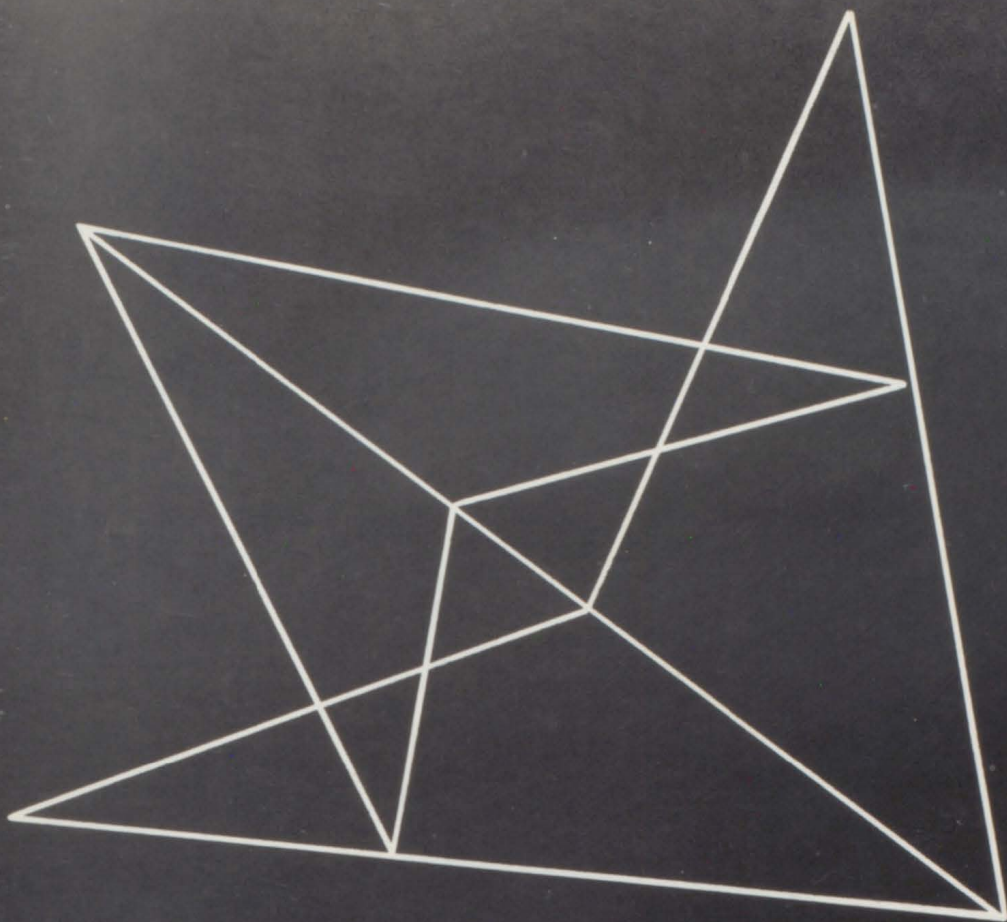
During this school year the flag flew at half-mast a total of five weeks, commemorating the death of two great and well known Americans.

On November 22, 1963, the entire world was shocked, stunned, and saddened by the sudden and untimely death of our president, John F. Kennedy. He died less than an hour after he was cut down by an assassin's bullets as he rode in an open car from the airport at Dallas, Texas, to downtown Dallas.

On April 5, 1964, General Douglas MacArthur, one of three Five Star Generals, succumbed to complications following a series of operations.

All Americans were sorrowful at the death of these two men.

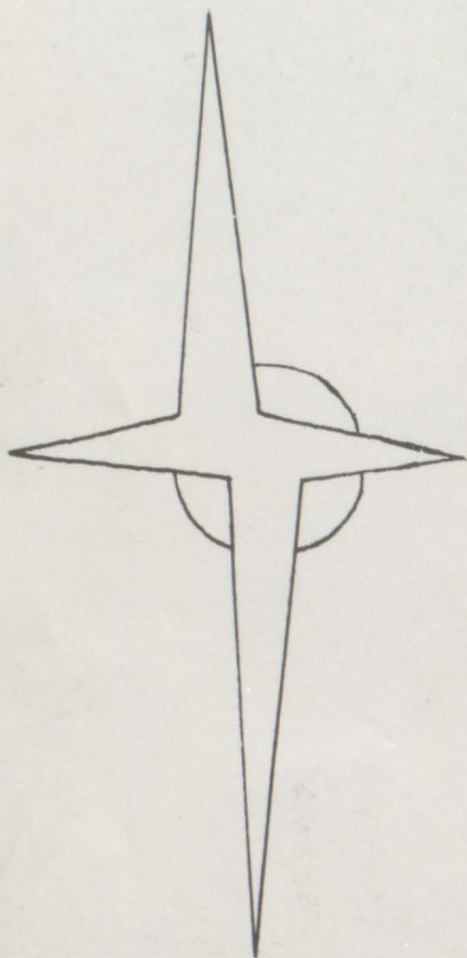
"Because" our school days at Galva High School will soon be a part of our past, the Galahi Staff of 1964 has tried to capture some of the memories of this our last year at Galva High.

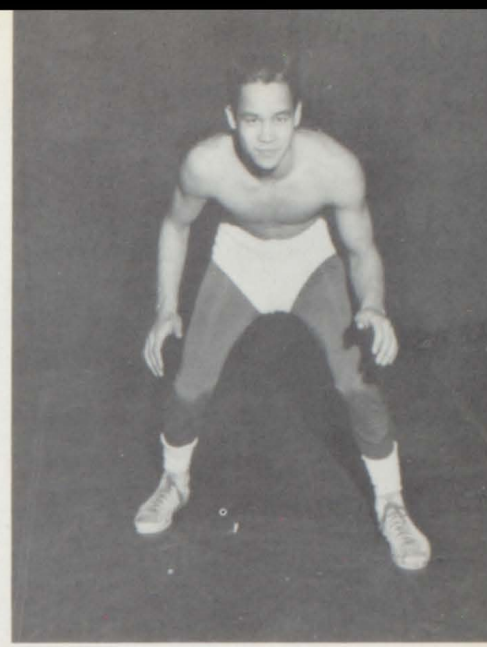
WRESTLING

This year the club sponsored National Book Week and Shakespeare's 400th birthday by having book displays downtown and in various places in the school.



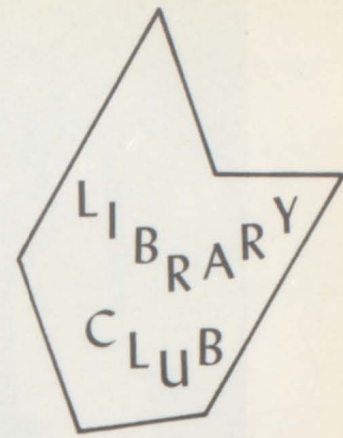

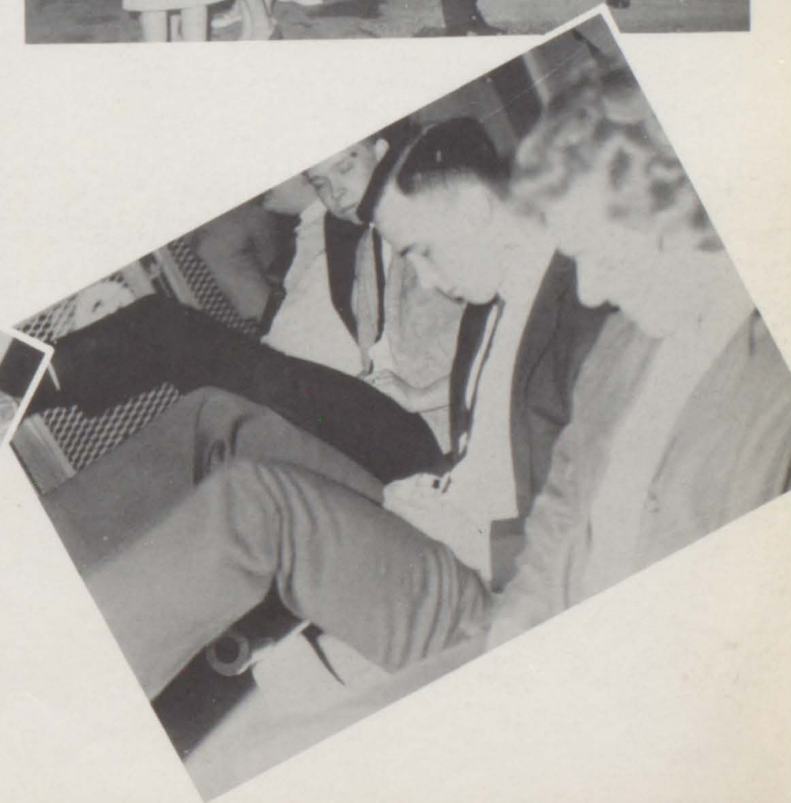
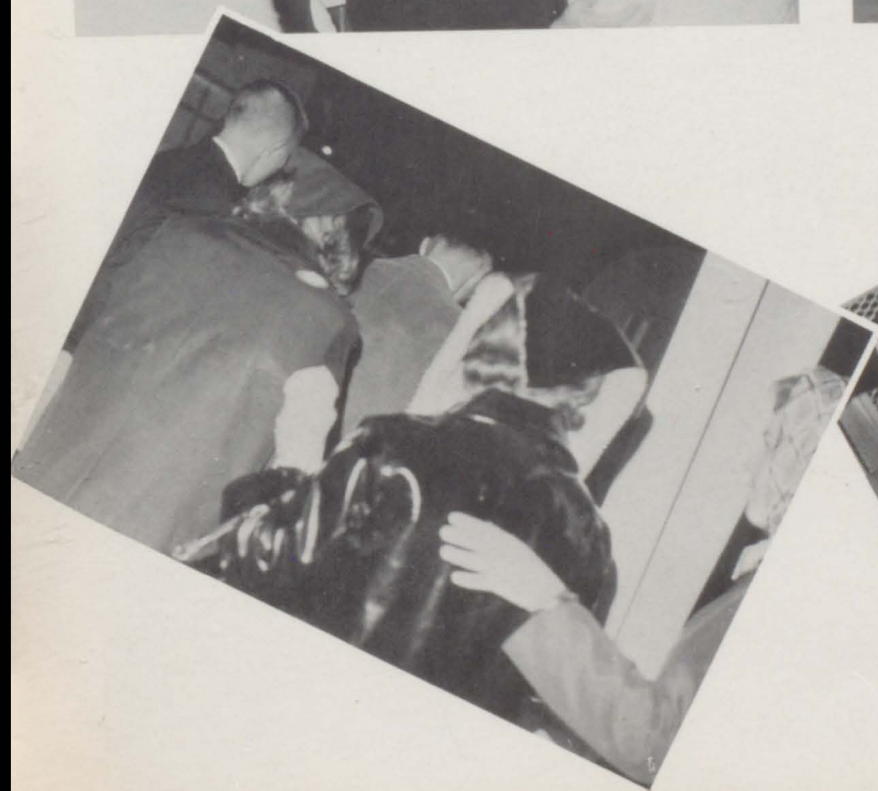


SENIOR BOAT TRIP
