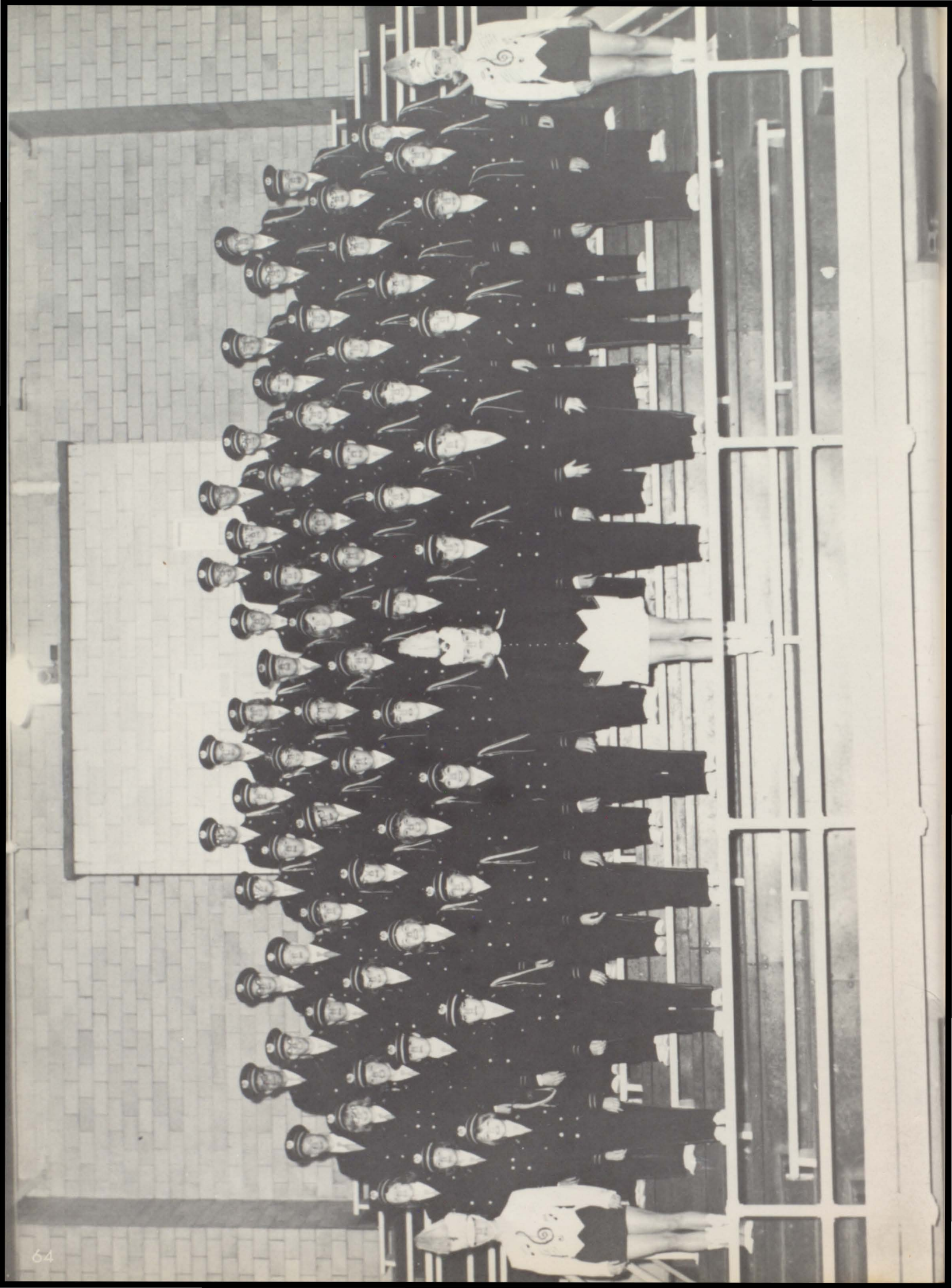
MR. LEONARD SMITH

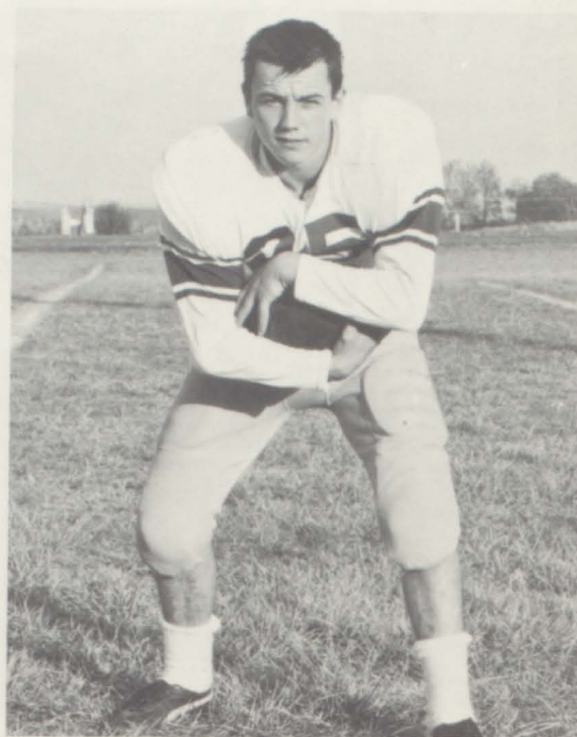

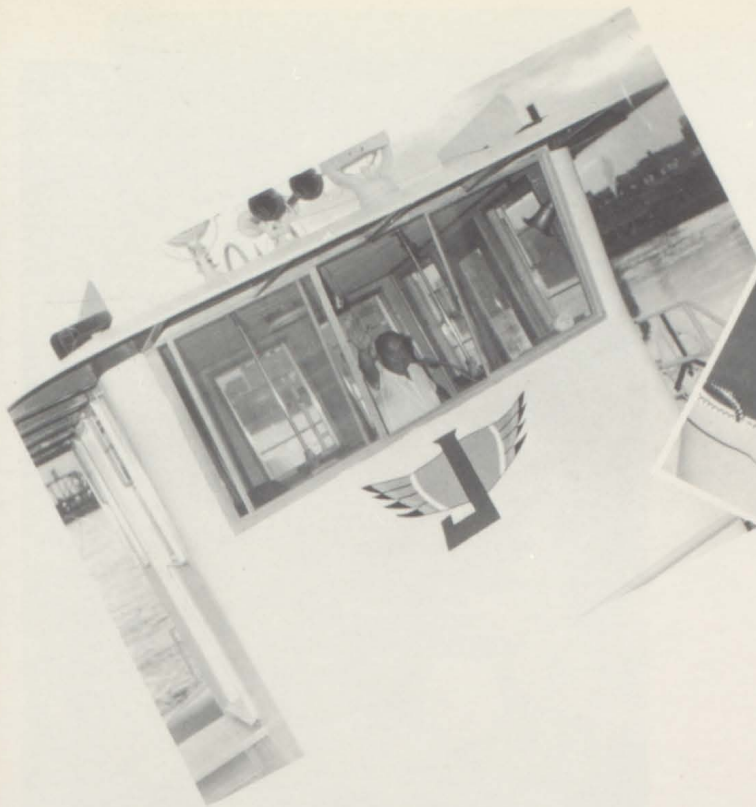

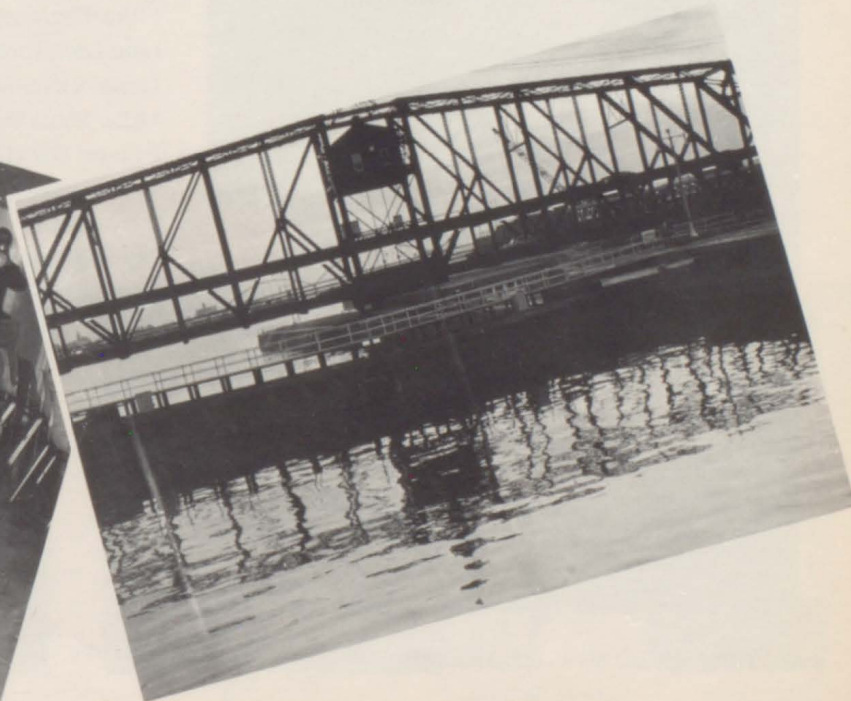
SENIOR PICNIC

SENIOR TRIP

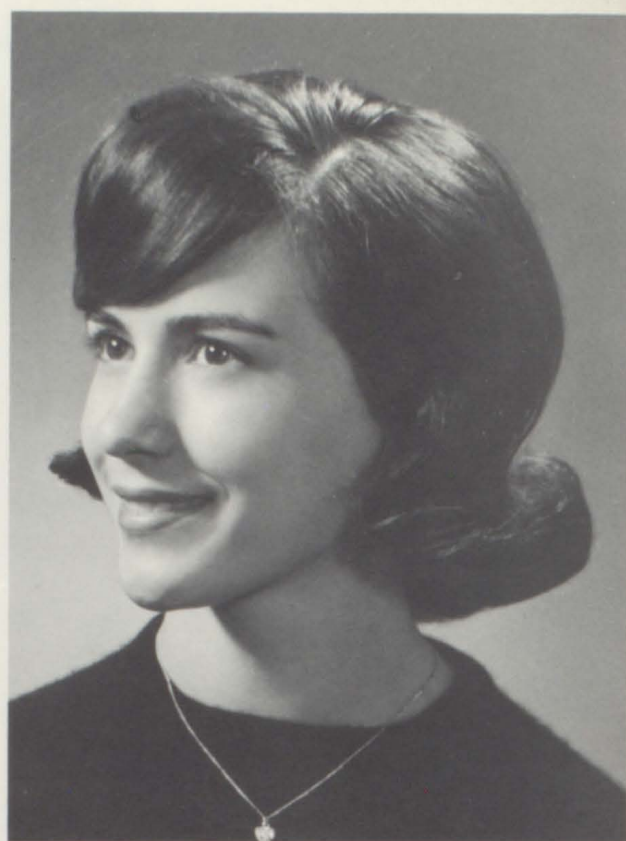
