10. He sets a good example to the youth of his community.





The 1965 Wildcat football squad had a successful season by compiling a record of six wins and three defeats. Our first encounter was against arch-rival Wethersfield. Because of the unseasonable rains the game was postponed twenty-four hours. Under the condition of the rain drenched field the Geese used their webbed feet to substantial advantage. Our Cats played good, hard football but lost the opener 14-0. The next week was the highlight of the season. Galva met a tough Bradford team that had won thirteen consecutive football games. The Cats showed no signs of discouragement from the first game by defeating Bradford 19-14. A play that would be any linesman's dream became the key to Galva's success that night. Tackle Dan Schwartzkopf picked a fumble from the Panther quarterback and ran seventy yards amidst a massive herd of fellow Wildcats for the touchdown.

Galva inhaled the loss to Walnut and went to Toulon hoping to get revenge by cleaning the Trojans. It seemed Toulon didn't agree but the Cats fought out a 7-0 roughshod victory. Galva traveled to Wyoming the next week to close the 1965 season. The Wildcats played a fine team effort and beat the Indians 39-6.

The wrestling squad and the rest of the student body want to thank Coach Colbert for the time he put into the wrestling season to bring home this successful year.



The Cats started the season on a bleak April day against Wethersfield. The game ended in a 4-4 tie after the game had been called because of darkness. Galva faired quite well against Manlius by defeating the Red Devils 9-5 on a cold, drizzly day. The next game had a change in weather and in score. The players would like to thank Mr. Parmelee for coaching baseball. They enjoyed working with him, and he did a fine job.



The seniors want to thank the lake owners for the use of the clubhouse and other lake facilities.











