




We, the class of 1967, do hereby present this yearbook to the memory of Bill Grice who, although he was with us for a short 16 years, became "special" to each of us in a different way.


Bill will always be remembered by us as a diligent worker, a good sport, and one who was always willing to do good for others.

After three weeks of hard preparation; the 1966 Galva Wildcats opened their season against a weak Wyoming team with a 33-0 victory. Next came a grudge game with neighboring Wethersfield. In a very rugged defensive battle our Cats overpowered the Geese 15-6. The following week Galva played another tough team. Except for one defensive lapse at the end of the half, Galva played a fine overall ball game in defeating a fast-charging, fine-passing Bradford squad. Against Elmwood the offense opened up in a 43-0 victory. The substitutes gained valuable experience, as the starters played only a little over two quarters.

Next, as expected, the Manulius Red Devils gave our Wildcats a rough defensive contest with a 0-0 deadlock at half time. In the second half Galva changed their offense to the old, yet very useful, single wing. We ground out a decisive 14-0 victory against the rather confused Manlius team. The following week the Wildcats traveled to Princeville. The Princes caused a bit of trouble for a quarter with an explosive offense and numerous Galva penalties. However, our offense showed its power against a weak defense and rolled to an easy 45-13 triumph. Our next opponent was dangerous Dunlap. For the first time this year our Wildcats found themselves behind. In a nerve-wracking contest Galve pulled the game out of the fire during the last four minutes and then staved off a last ditch effort by the determined Eagles. The final score was 20-14.

Next came the Walnut game which marred an otherwise perfect season. The Raiders from the North, taking advantage of several big mistakes and capitalizing on opportunities, pulled off a 19-12 upset. Several key injuries and an off night hampered the efforts of the Wildcats. In the final game of

our 1966 season the Galva Wildcats took on an undermanned Toulon squad, dealing out a 38-0 defeat. A weak Toulon defense could not slow the potent Galva ground game.



Our final record of eight victories and one defeat tied us with Wethersfield for the conference championship.

Because of a very small turnout of freshmen and sophomores, the B-Squad, had a tough time completing a good record. Despite the team's lack of depth, they had a fair record of two wins, three defeats, and one tie. Everyone gained valuable experience, and the outlook for future Wildcat teams looks good.







The 1966-67 edition of the Galva Wildcat basketball team did a commendable job this year showing a record of 15 victories and 8 defeats. The team was fourth in the Blackhawk Conference standings and gained second place in its own tournament.

After two weeks of preparation the team opened their season against Kewanee, losing a close 53-56 decision. The Cats then triumphed in four straight games. One of the highlights of the season was the victory over Costa in the second game of the Galva Tournament. The The inspired Cats hustled to a 67-60 win for an important victory. The team then hit the rough portion in their schedule and closed out the '66 part of their season with a 4-4 record. To start January the Wildcats dropped Elmwood and were beaten by Walnut. Then the team put together four wins in a row. Another high point of the year was beating Monmouth 67-66 in a nervewracking thriller. After a two-week layoff the team took on Walnut at home. Playing probably their best ball of the year the Cats blitzed Walnut 86-75. Following a loss to a fine Knoxville club, the Wildcats ruled off five straight victories. In the last home game of the season our team burned the baskets in smashing Prince ville 101-90, scoring 64 points in a run-and-gun second half.

B-SQUAD BASKETBALL

Coach Cender's team opened regional tournament activity with a fine defensive victory against ROVA, 68-39. The Cats took on the hot-shooting district winner, Warren, in the second round game. The game was very close until the end of the third quarter, when the Cats found themselves down sixteen points. Battling back gamely the Cats could come no closer than two points, the margin at the gun, 70-68. Superior freethrowing won the game for the Warren club.

The B-Squad played quite good ball this year. They ended the season with 16 victories and 9 defeats, coming on strong as the season progressed. They gave the two top teams in the Fr.-Soph. Conference, Wethersfield and Princeville, very close games on successive nights. The varsity potential of this team became evident toward the finish of the year.

The players would like to thank Mr. Cender and Mr. Paar for their leadership throughout the season. Both teams played exciting basketball. We wish the best of luck to future Cat teams coached by Mr. Cender and Mr. Paar.



During the summer, the members plan to participate in state and country livestock judging contests.






"F. H. A. Becomes of Age Through Education, Service, and Social Development" was the theme carried out through the year by our F. H. A. Programs were planned according to the theme.



Galva High School is fortunate in having such a well-equipped library for a school of its size. Miss Davis, the librarian, has spent much time in selecting books which are of interest to the student.




FUTURE TEACHERS OF AMERICA







BAND




CHORUS
