And yet don't look too good, nor talk too wise;

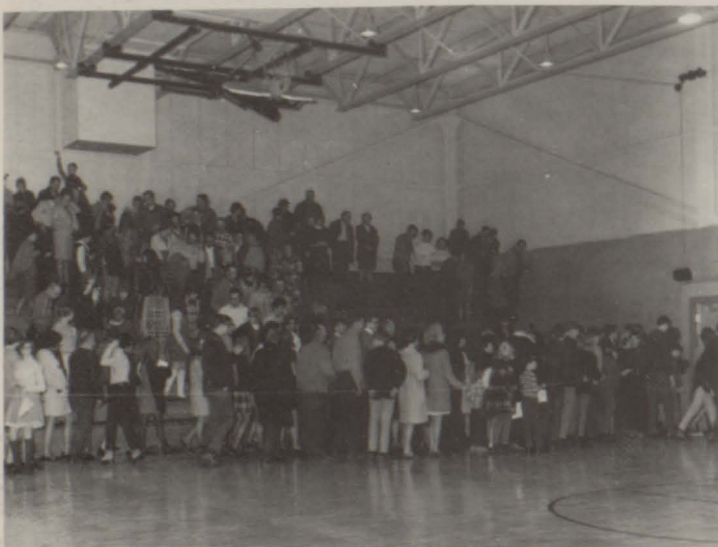
If you can dream--and not make dreams your master;

Except the Will which says to them: "Hold on!"

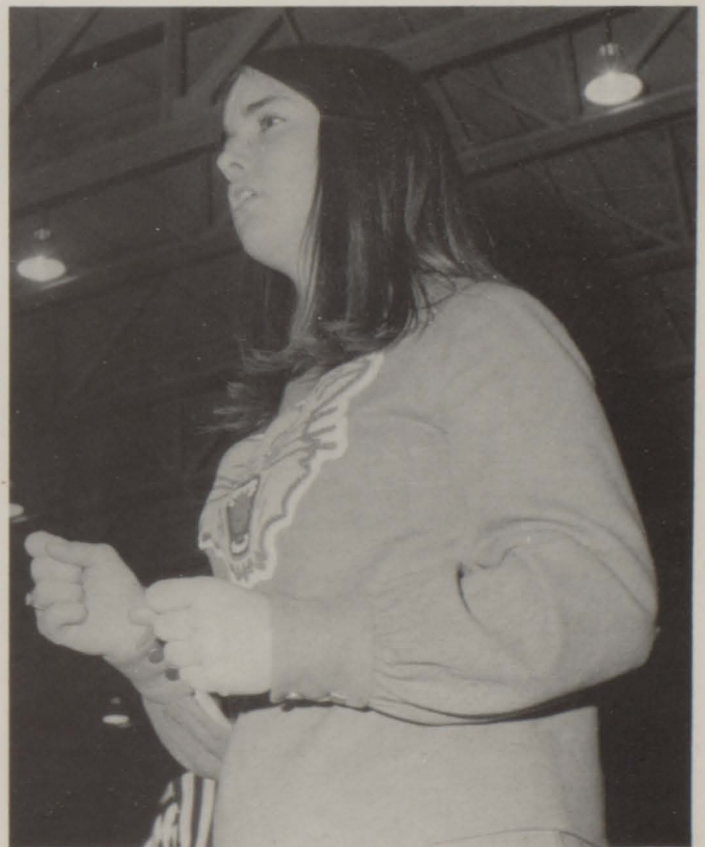
If you can talk with crowds and keep your virtue

And--which is more--You'll be a man, my son!

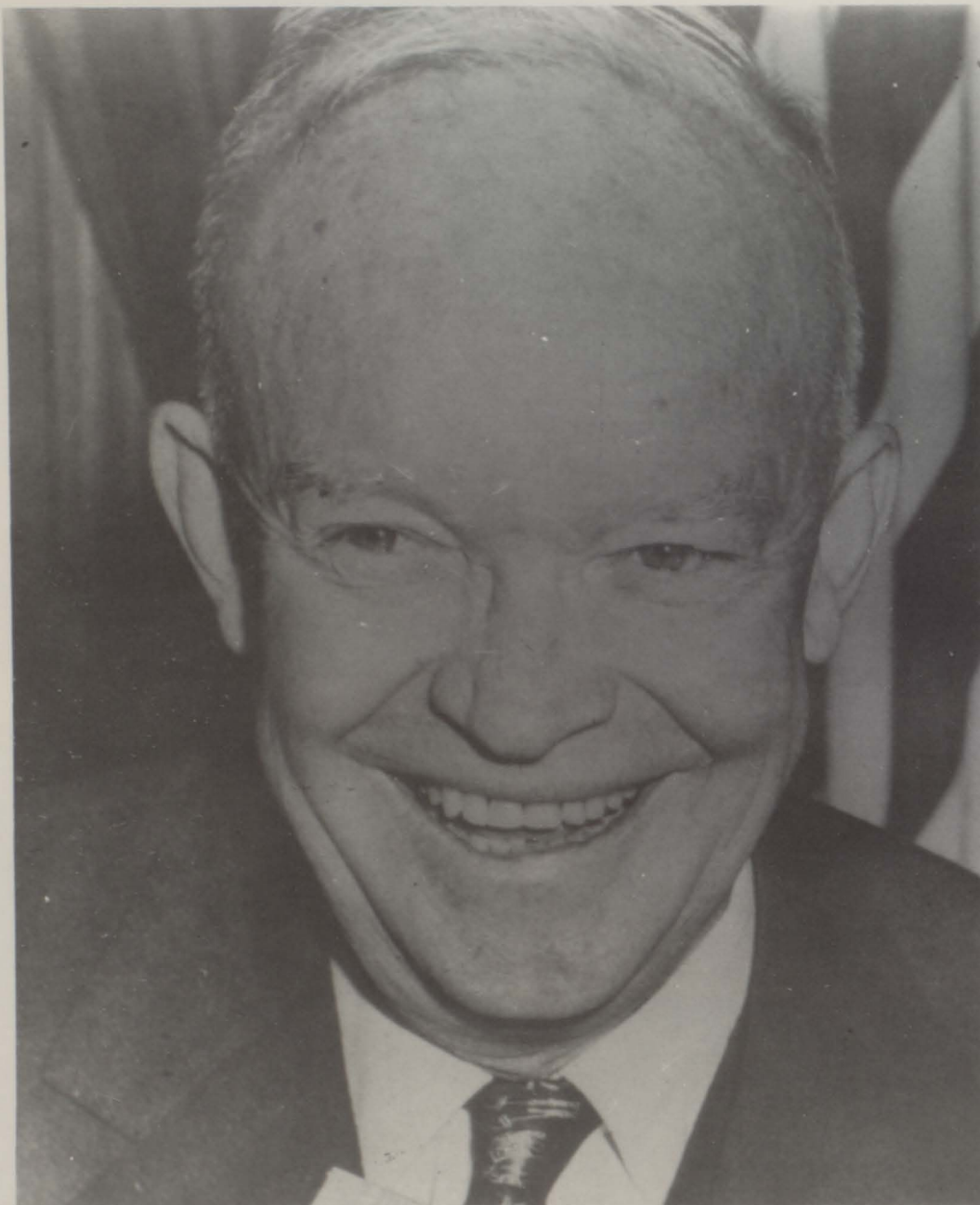

The year started out with the selling of food at football games. Pop, donuts, and coffee were also sold at basketball games for the financial support. The usual magazine sales were also carried on this year.

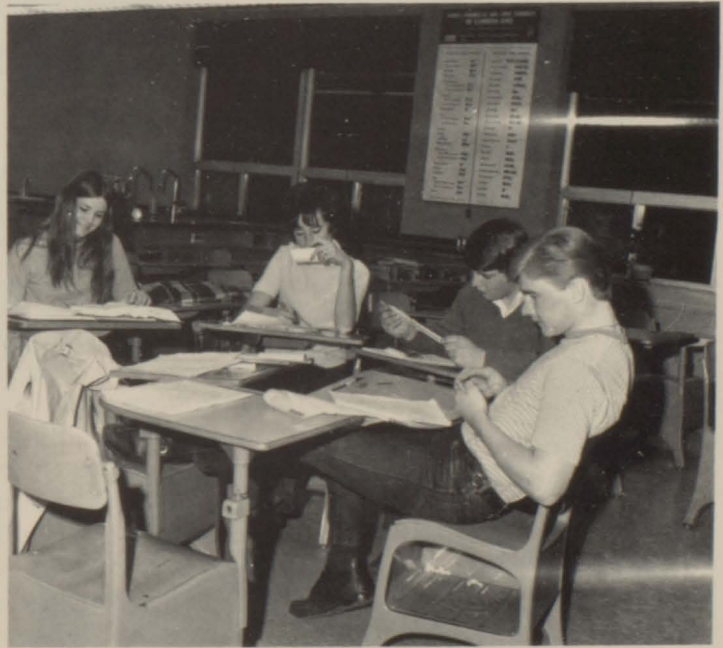

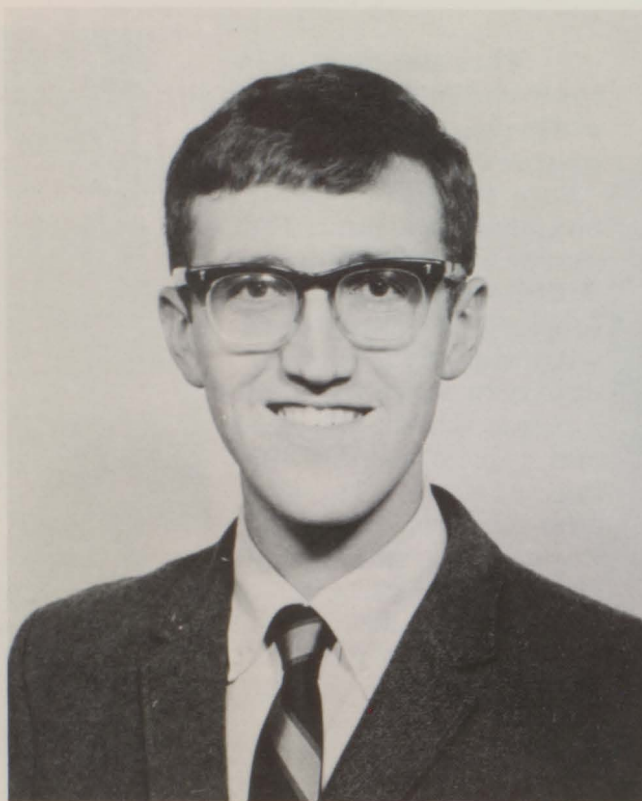
CLASS TRIP

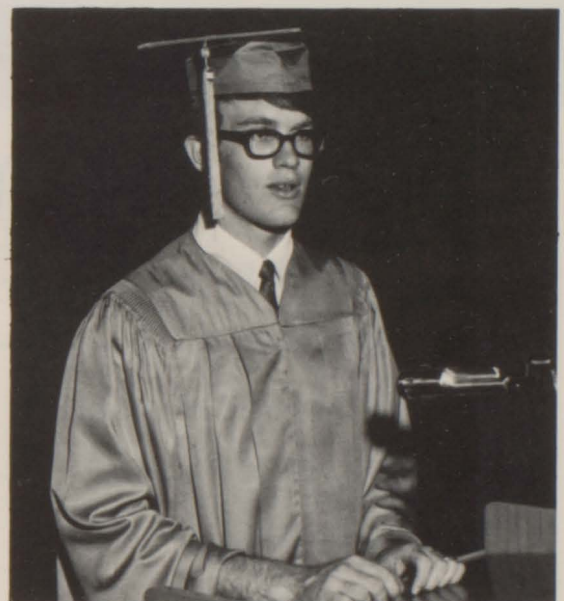
