# GALAHİ

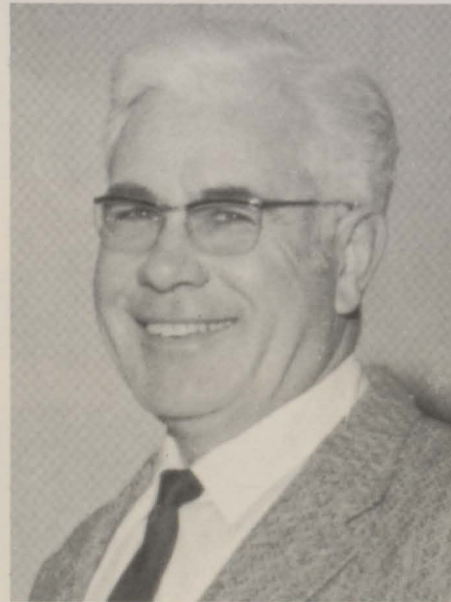

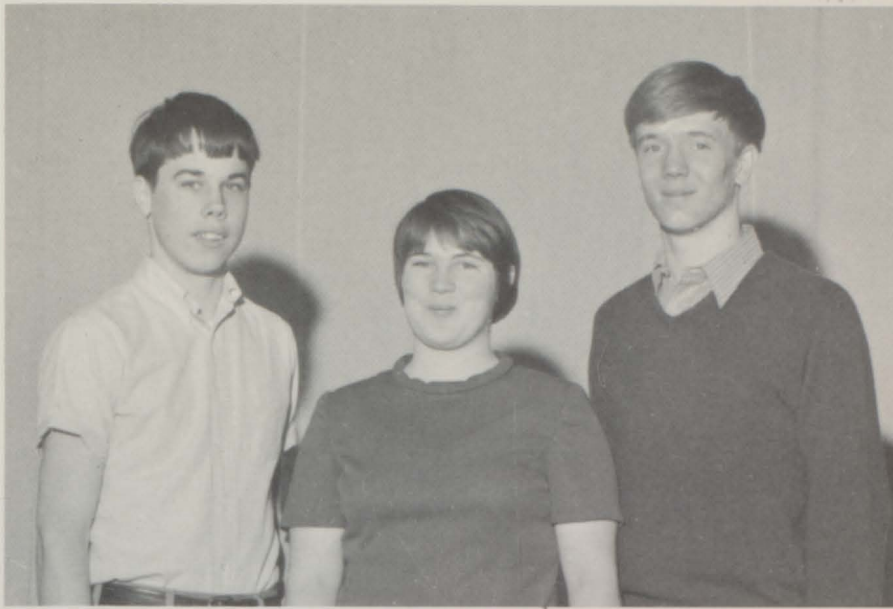

A Christmas party with a gift exchange was among the social activities. The last activity was a picnic held in Wiley Park.

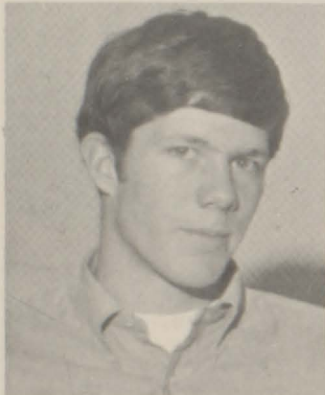
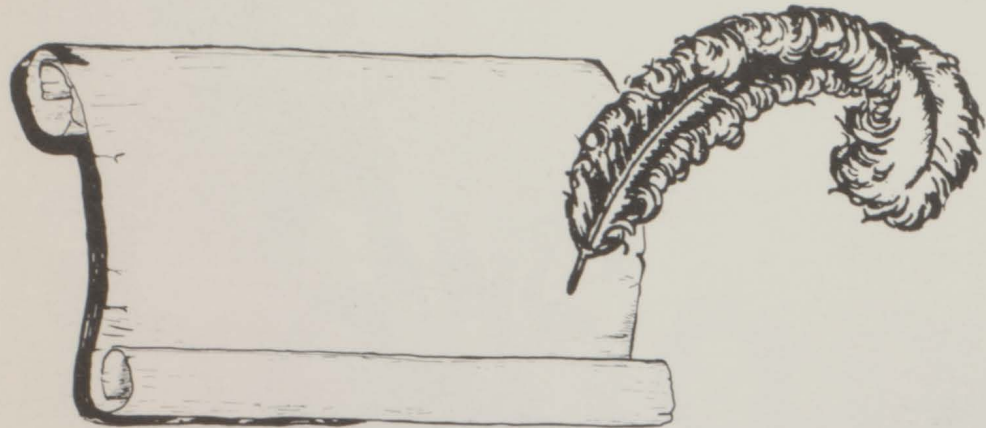

The money the club earned was spent on films for football and basketball. The surplus was spent Memorial Day when some G Club members and sponsors went to Chicago for a Cubs' double header game.





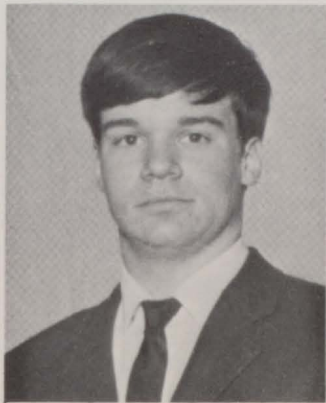
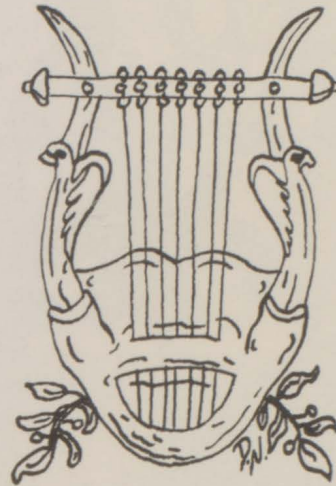

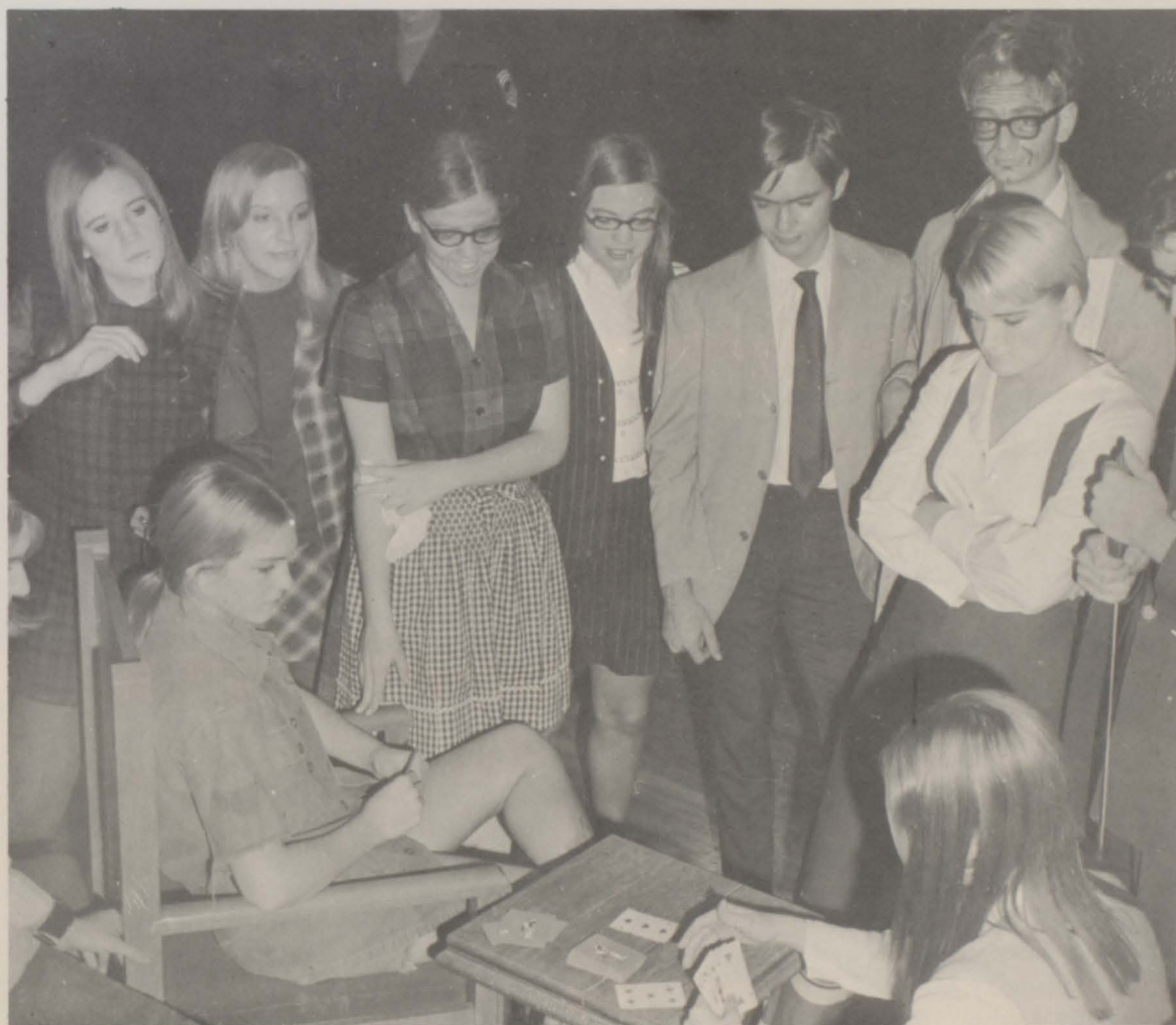
## THE MOUSE THAT ROARED

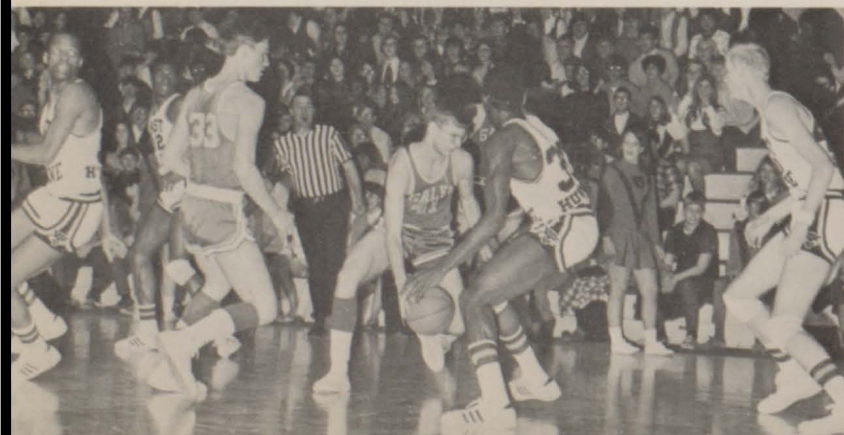
## FROSH-SOPH

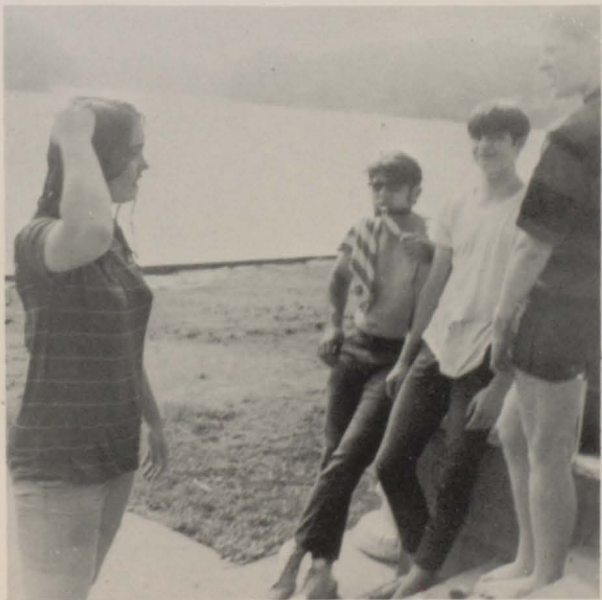


# SENIOR PICNIC

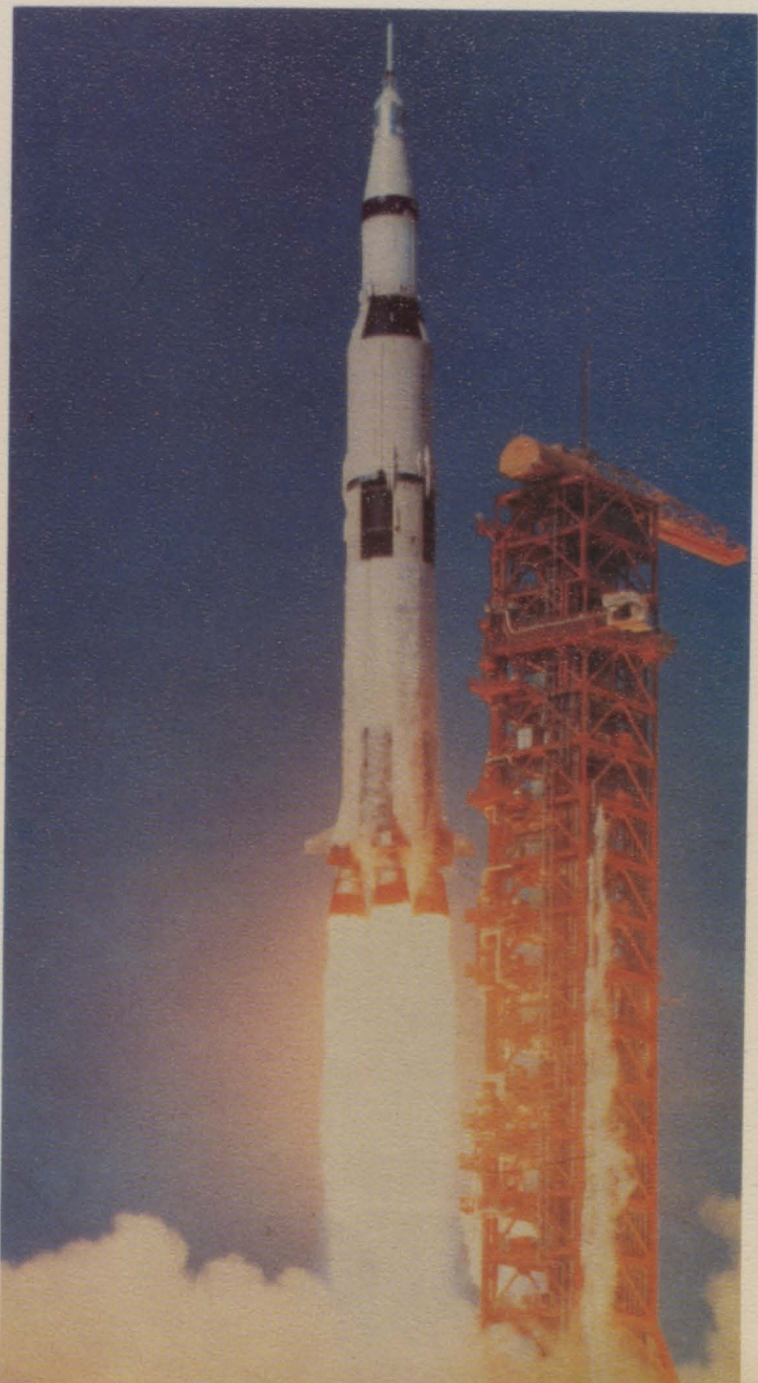

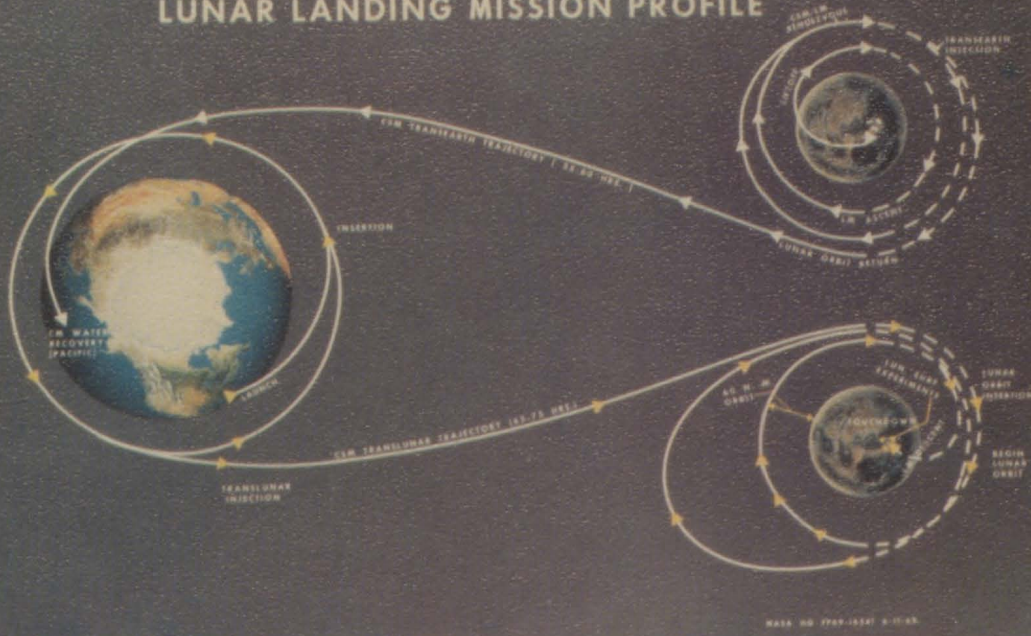

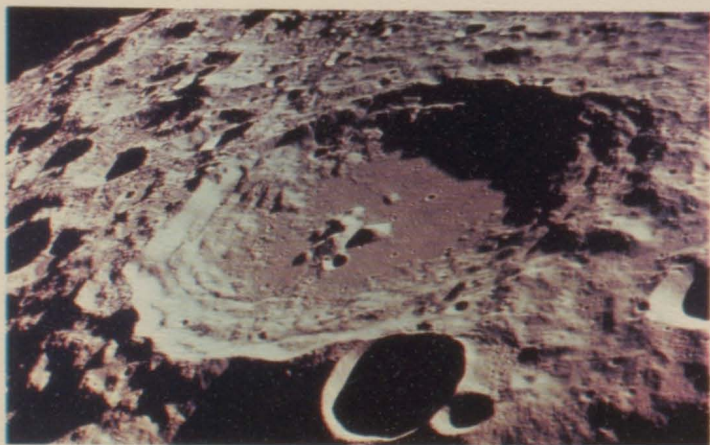

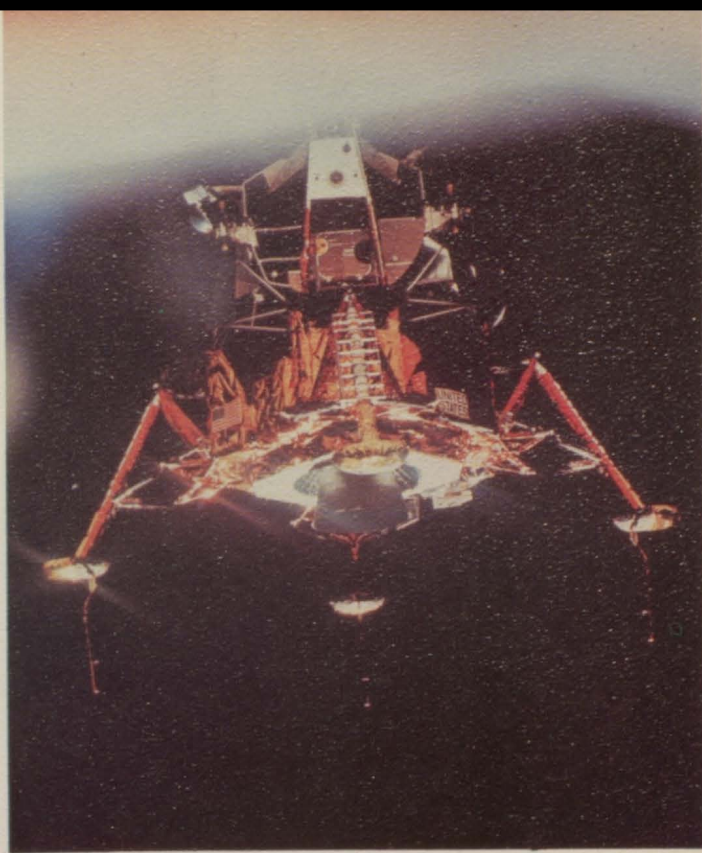

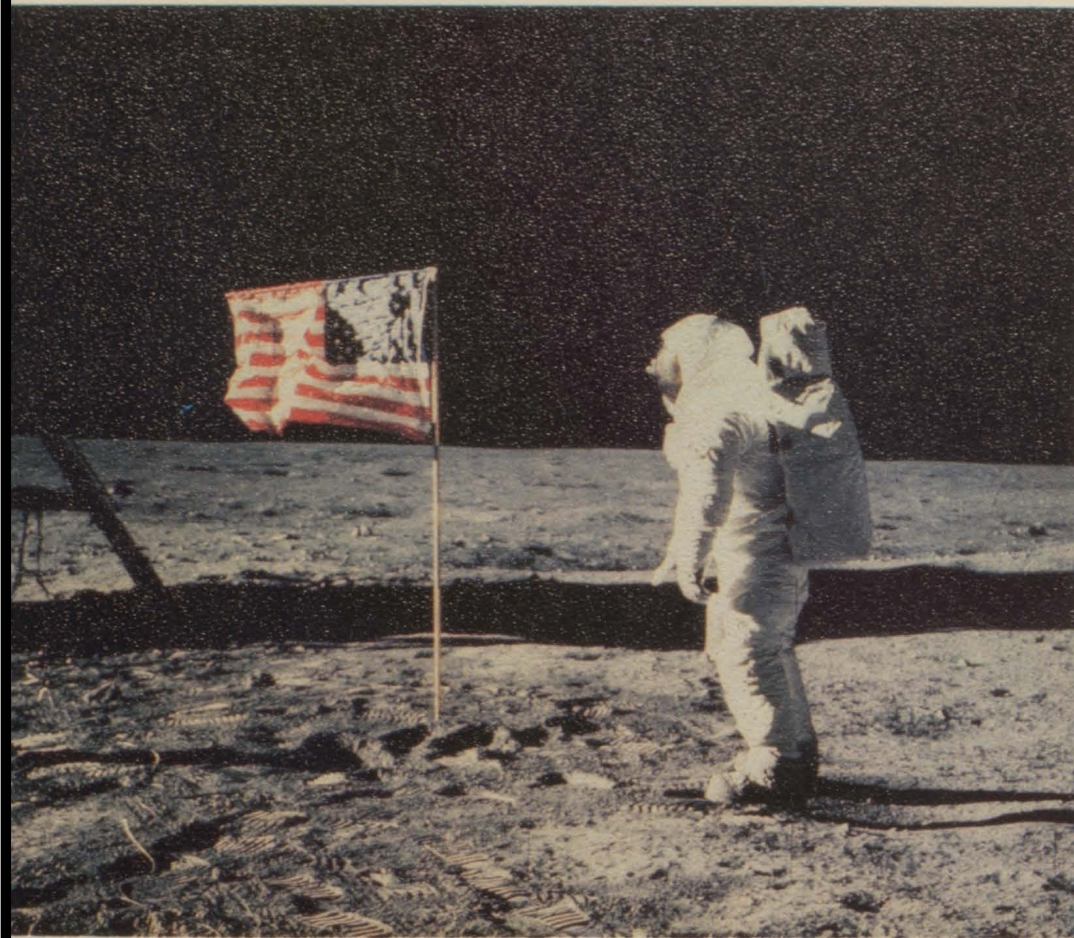

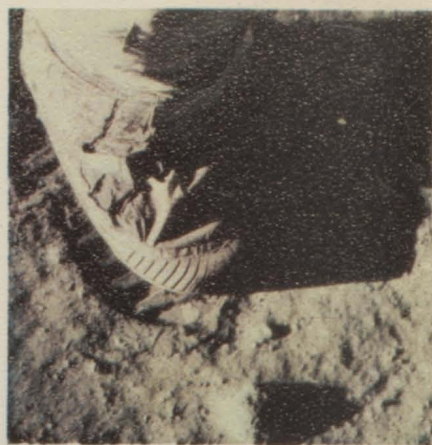

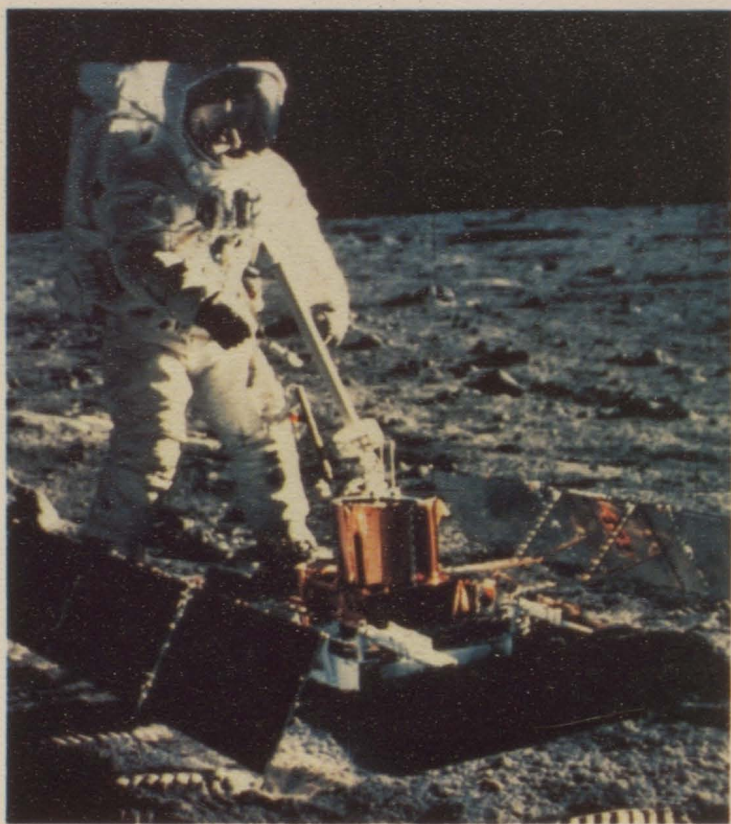

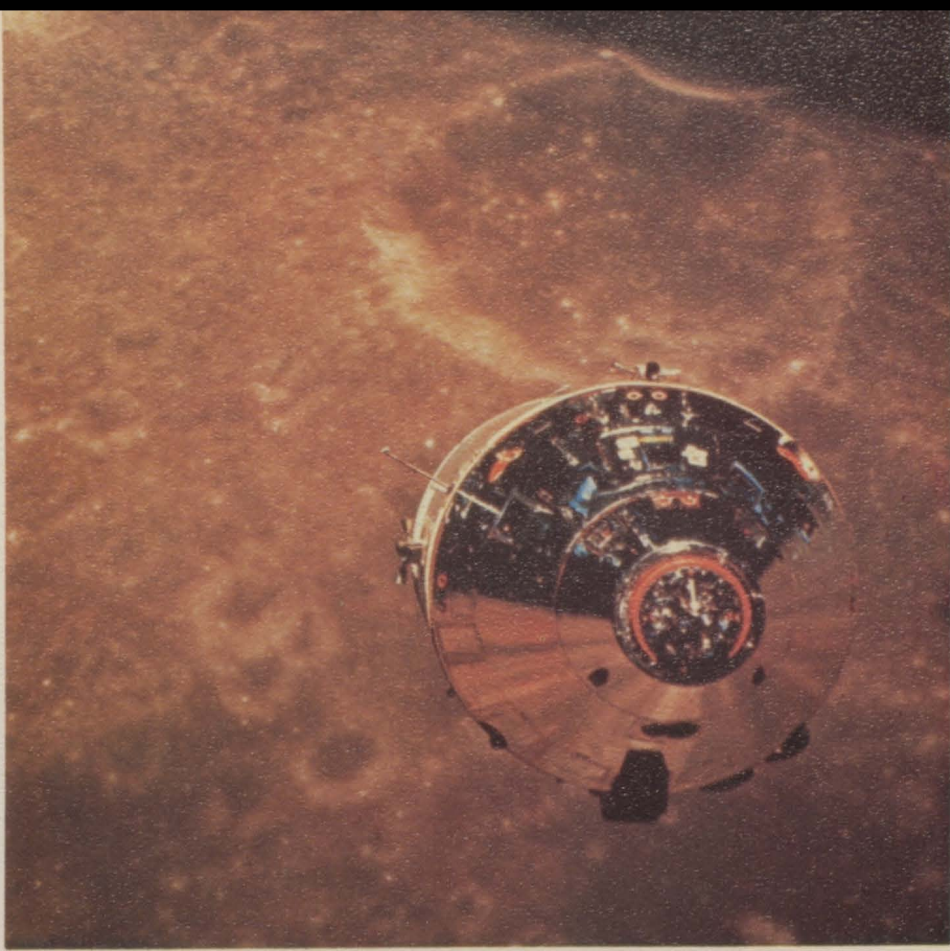

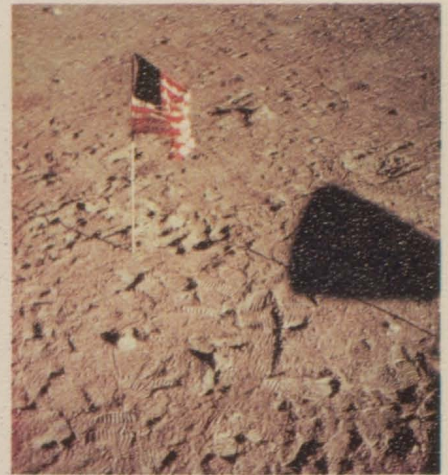
