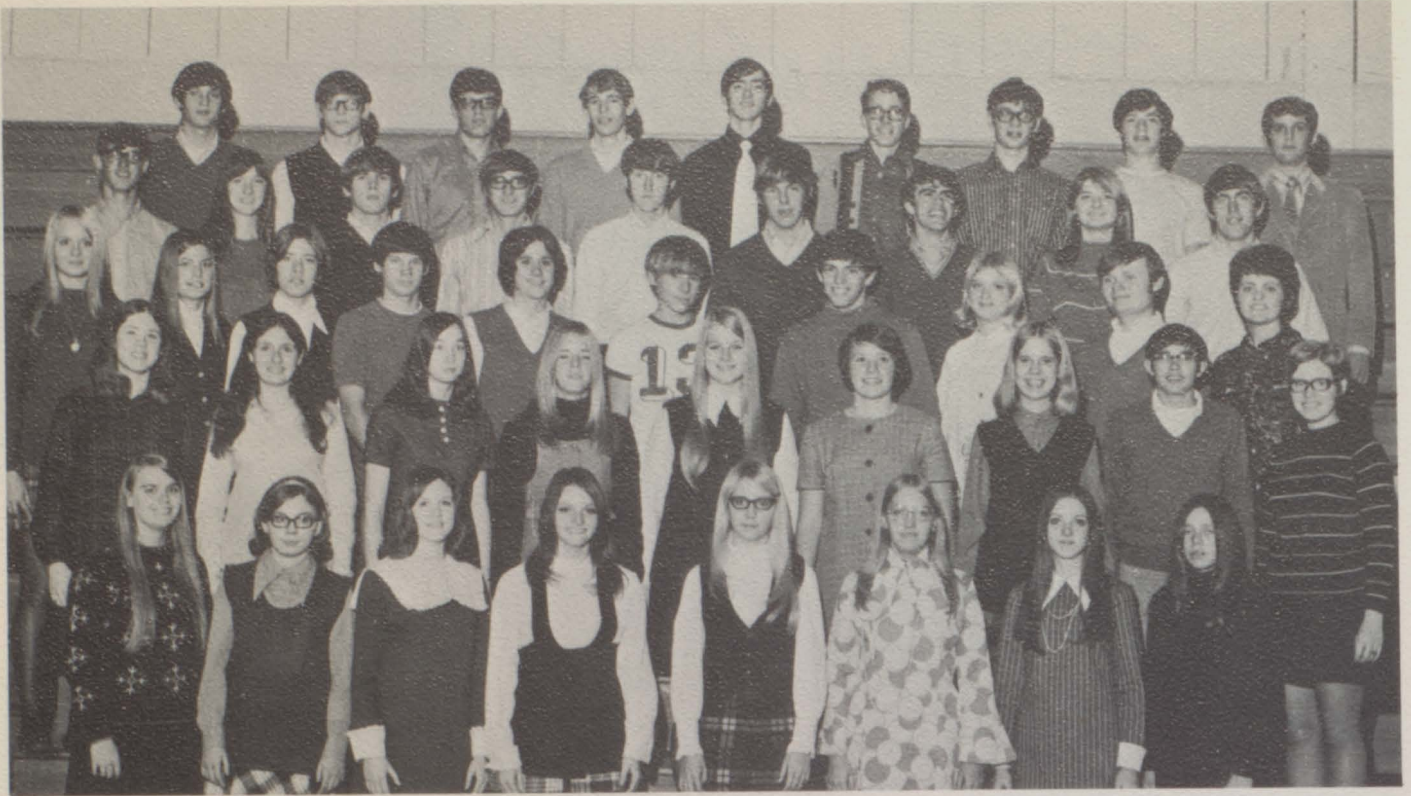
French Club

The 1970 Wildcats left a string of very impressive statistics when compared to our opponents' during this year's football season. The Wildcats' state-ranked defense gave up only 26 points while our potent offense punched over 167 points, which proved to be the best effort among the Little Six teams. The strong Galva defense unit held the opponents to approximately 100 yards per game. The Wildcats offense totaled 1956 yards; 1585 of them were gained by rushing while 371 were picked up by passing. At the same time Galva's opponents managed only 853 yards total offense, 529 on the ground and 324 in the air. The Wildcats gained 76 first downs while allowing only 55. The Wildcats attempted a total of 69 passes and completed 25 during the season. The opposition attempted 116 and completed 39. Galva's passing yardage totaled 371 while the opponents registered only 324. Four of the Wildcats were among the top twelve scorers in the conference this year, more than any other team had.

Had a few breaks come Galva's way that night, it would have enjoyed its second straight undefeated season; but instead had to settle for a seven-and-one record.
