The Galva Wildcats finished a tremendous football season and captured a piece of the Little Six title for the '71 season. A quick look at the 7-1 record of the team gives an indication of the type of team fielded by Galva this year, but a comparison of statistics gives an even better picture. The squad worked as a unit, both offensively and defensively. Teamwork is the key to the game and it worked for the Wildcats. The Cats scored a total of 184 points this year and at the same time held their competition to only 20 points, a new school record. Galva's defense proved they were one of the strongest in the area. No other team in the conference allowed as few points while scoring as did the Galva squad. The strength of the defense was also seen in the number of fumbles committed. The opponents fumbled 28 times during the season due to Galva tackling and the Wildcats grabbed 14 of them. Galva's offense committed only 15 fumbles and lost 6. At the same time Galva's defense was busy holding the competition to an average of approximately 70 yards a game rushing, the Cat offense was busy picking up about 25 yards a game. The Wildcats went to the air 67 times during the season and completed 20 for 260 yards. The opponents passed 61 times, completed 19 and gained 176 yards. Al Troline, Lauren Murray and Tom Dehler were the leading ground gainers for the Cats. Troline averaged 7.2 yards per carry in 110 tries. Dehler was next with an average of 6.5 yards per carry, followed by Murray with 5.4. Troline was the second highest scorer in the Little Six with 66 points to his credit. Dehler was also among the top 10 with 6 recorded this year. Coach Martoglio steered his team to these impressive statistics and has every right to be proud of his Galva Wildcats.

The Galva High School track squad had a good season with one member heading to the state meet. The season opened with a win over Rockridge when Al Troline, Scott Johnson, Tom Dehler, and Lauren Murray scored individual wins. The next meet was a Wethersfield Triangular with Troline winning both high and low hurdles and Dehler winning both discus and shot. Galva placed sixth in the Wethersfield Relays and tenth in the Davenport Relays. The 34th Annual Galva Relays was claimed by Wethersfield with Galva coming in sixth scoring 30 points.
