Life Goes On At GHS






Students had the opportunity to participate in 10 different organizations, 4 different male sports, and 3 different female sports. Sixty academic courses were offered.

Through rain, sleet, snow, and hail the mail continued and so did student life at Galva High School.








































Homecoming















Football



The Galva Wildcats, after coming off a 1-8 season last year, had a lot to prove this year. In the opening game against Aledo, the Wildcats plagued by penalties, suffered their first loss of the season.

Galva's second game was another nonconference game against Prophetstown. The Cats were determined to end their losing streak and they did it in fine style

by burning Porphetstown by 47 points.

Their next outing was with long-time rival Wethersfield. The first half ended with Galva leading by 7 points, but the Wildcats came on strong in the second half to dump the Geese and claim their second victory of the season.

ROVA was Galva's next victim and the Wildcats had another good night offensively as they socred 40 points, and the defense did a fine job by holding RO-VA scoreless.

The Wildcats faced Cambridge next in an important conference game, but for the second time the Wildcats were stopped by penalties.

The Wildcats came back the next week to battle with Winola. The temperature dropped low that night but the Cats were hot as they clipped the Jets. It was the fourth shutout for the Wildcats defense in six

outings.

Homecoming was next on the schedule and the Toulon Trojans were the team Galva wanted to beat. The Wildcats got off to a slow start and took a slim lead into the locker room at half time. But in the second half the Cats' offense exploded to give the Galva fans a homecoming win.

Galva's next game was against another long time rival, Alexis. The Cardinals came to Galva undefeat-

ed but when they left, they were 7-1.

The stage was set for the final game of the season. The Wildcats had to beat Alwood to assure themselves of getting a share of the conference title. If Alexis defeated Cambridge then Galva and Alexis would tie for the championship and Galva would be picked for the state playoffs. But as it turned out, Cambridge beat Alexis by 1 point in an overtime so the Wildcats' hopes of a playoff berth were washed down the drain. The season ended with Galva and Cambridge tieing for the Lincoln Trail Conference Championship.


Basketball

Senior Players Last Game Is Heartbreaker

The fighting Wildcats worked hard all season under their new coach Stan Messmore and hit their peak when it counted most--the end of the season. The conference title was up for grabs and Galva had 3 tough games to play in just 4 days. In those four days, the Wildcats defeated Alexis, Wethersfield and Alwood giving Galva a 10 win and 4 loss conference record and, best of all, sole claim to the Lincoln Trail Conference Championship. The Wildcats had several strong individual players but it took the tremendous efforts of Coach Messmore to match the player with the right position to produce a team that could work together. Leading scorers were Sophomore Jeff Holding, with 355 points, Senior Mark Brock with 286, Senior Roy Brooks with 243, Senior Pat Cromien with 233 and Senior Bill Robson with 171. The Galva team scored 626 field goals out of 1409 attempts. Sinking over 60% of their free throw attempts added 247 points to their total season score of 1499 points against the competition total of 1404 in 24 games. Roy Brooks and Jeff Holding led the team in rebounding with each getting well over a hundred rebounds both offensively and defensively. Galva entered the Bradford regional with unbelievable exuberance and knocked off favored Princeville 84-66. Next came arch-rival Wetherfield, but the Geese were shot down with a 55-43 loss. The championship game pitted Galva against ninth-ranked Buda-Western. It was a tight game and with only 1:39 left the score was 49-49. Despite their best efforts the Cats couldn't quite pull out a victory and lost, 53-51.


The 1976-77 wrestling season started with a doubleduel meet against Polo and Princeton. The Cats looked very promising and gave both teams a close contest. The Erie Tournament put Galva against some tough teams and the Cats placed two fourth place winners. Next, the Cambridge Vikings were beaten by an enthusiastic team giving Galva their first conference win. In their next meet against Winola, the Cats missed taking home the conference trophy by six points. Further tournament action at Bradford showed four Wildcats making the top four. The Cat's second double dual of the season featured Kewanee and Aledo, two strong teams the Cats just couldn't get by. Galva was downed in a close match against Prophetstown. The Cats came back and beat Bradford and Farmington in their last two meets of the season. District action placed one Galva wrestler, Joe Anderson, in second place enabling him to continue to sectional play.




Rob Lander accepts the first-place medal after winning the 105-pound bracket of the Galva Frosh-Soph Wrestling Tournament.






Girls' Sports
