Wildcats Win Four Games Out Of Nine

Following a Lincoln Trail Conference co-championship team, this year's Wildcats had their work cut out for them. Bad luck seemed to hinder the Wildcats this year as injuries started before the first game and continued at regular intervals until the last game.

The young and inexperienced team headed into a tough opening game with Aledo but fell short of victory by six points.

They roared back, however, and Coach Keller experienced his first victory at Galva with a 27-8 lashing of Prophetstown.

But the Wildcats were just getting started. The following week they faced a heavily favored Wethersfield team but the tough defensive battle ended in a 7-6 score with Galva on top.

The Cats again came away Friday night with a victory when they pushed by ROVA, 20-6. It had been the third consecutive game played in the rain but rather than hinder the Cats, the bad weather seemed to boost their playing ability.

The following week the cats marched onto the playing field on a Saturday afternoon to play at the Cambridge homecoming. The Cats scored first, but the Vikings took advantage of two Galva mistakes and scored on both to end up with a 12-7 win.

One week later the Cats played their homecoming game against Winola but despite all efforts, came out on the disappointing end of the contest.

The next two games were discouraging to the Wildcats. They were defeated by a tough Toulon team and the following week suffered their fourth loss to Alexis, who later became the Lincoln Trail champs.

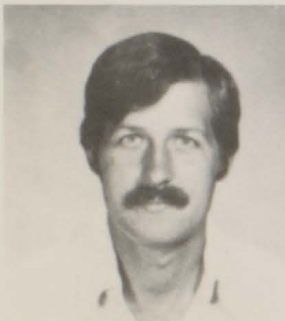

They could lay down the finish out the season with a 3 and 6 record or they could get it together and give their all to the last home game with Alwood. Coming off of an opening season loss to Kewanee, the Wildcats headed into the Bradford Tourney. The cats came away with a third place trophy, losing only to state ranked Tiskilwa. Galva then lost two close ones to ROVA and Annawan. Over the course of the next ten games, Galva won seven and lost three, each loss to a state ranked team. 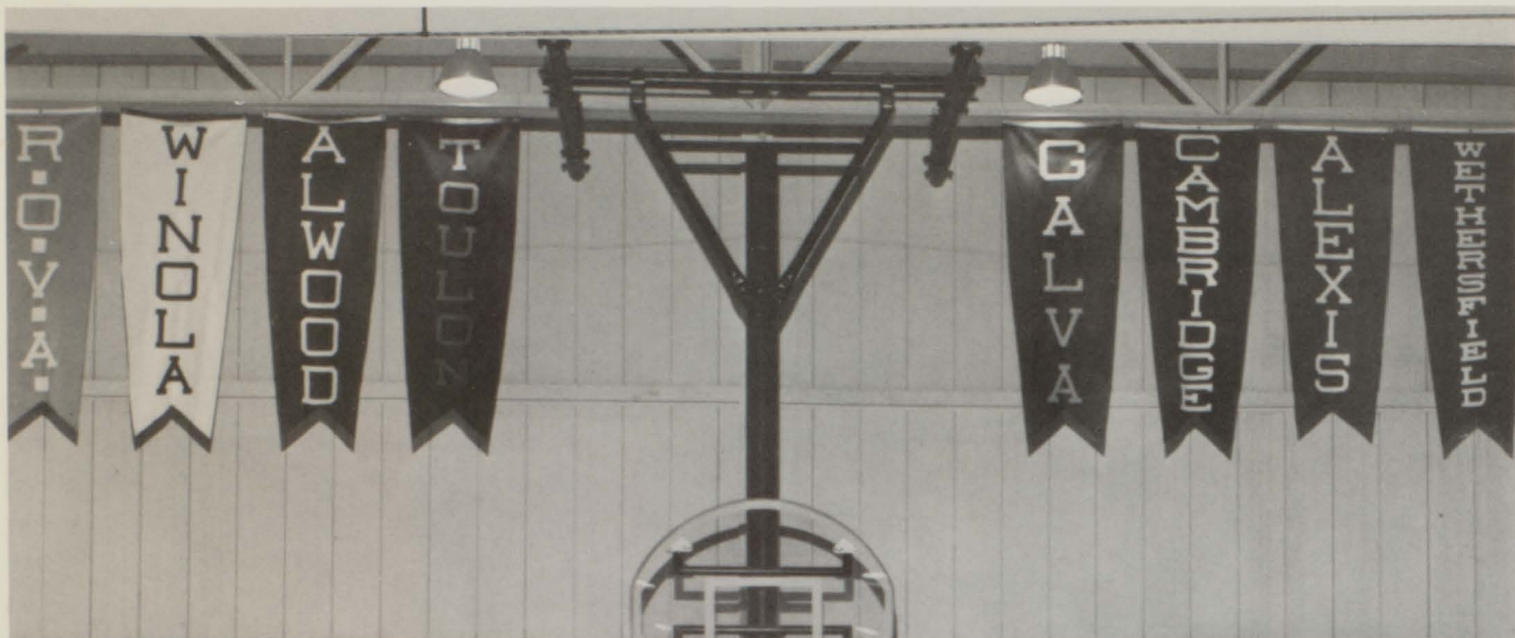

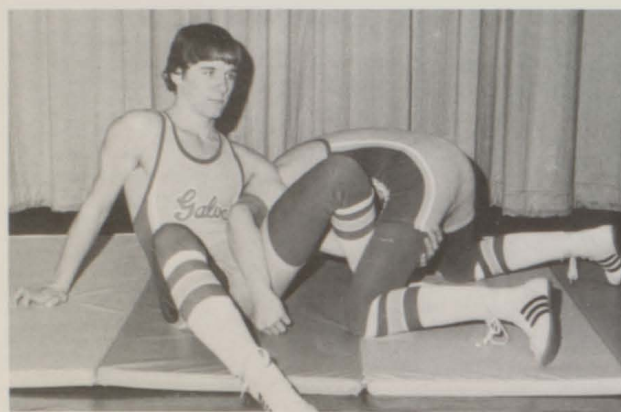
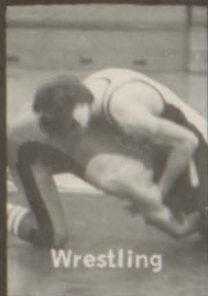

Andre McNaught Is Top Wrestler

Using only three seniors this year, the Galva matmen were short on experience, but were still able to defeat some tough teams. Although the Wildcats record stood at 6 and 7, the Galva wrestlers maintained several good individual records, with seven of the eleven varsity wrestlers having winning records. They posted a combination of 111 wins to 94 losses. 50 of those wins were pins. The young wrestlers of Galva lost their first two meets to two tough squads from Princeton and Polo. They bounced back, however, and won their next three meets decisively over Bradford, Hall Township, and Oregon. They contin-

ued throughout the season, having their ups and downs. The ups being two second place finishes at both the Bradford Tournament and our own Galva Frosh-Soph Tournament. The downs came later in the season, when the Galva squad came within three points of beating a very tough Orion team. The Galva grapplers ended up their regular season with a devastating victory over a slightly favored Farmington team. They then traveled to Monmouth for the districts, where Andre McNaught qualified for the sectional tournament.



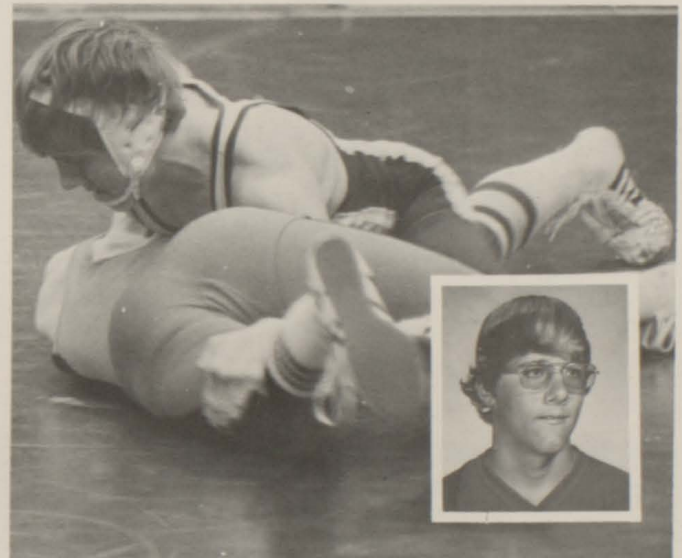

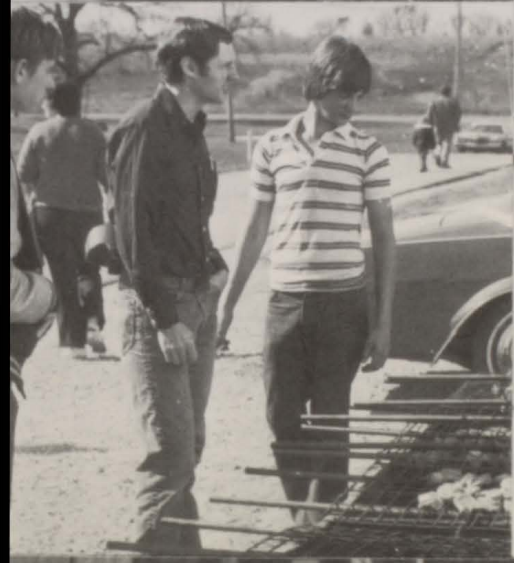


Anyone For Frisbee "Guts"?
