John Nash won the pie eating, Jim Steffey won the arm wrestling and the faculty soundly defeated the FHA and FFA officers in three games of vol-




















From A Ventriloquist

Galva then traveled to Viola where they were upended by a fiesty Winola team, 22-14. The score was close throughout the game as the Cats played in-



Cats Finish 16-10

The 1978-79 edition of the Galva Wildcat Basketball team finished second in the Lincoln Trail Conference to Wethersfield, who ended the season at 29-1, losing to Providence in the Supersectional. A 10-4 Conference slate by the 'Cats edged R.O.V.A. for the distinction of 'the best of the rest. "

Beginning the season with four losses (3 to AA teams) to strong competition in closely contested games gave promise of good things to come when the Wildcats returned to Conference and Class A 16-5 before bowing out to a fine Wyoming team in the Bradford Regional after defeating the host in the quarterfinal contest. A season record of 16-10 was very commendable considering three losses were to AA teams, two to 4th rated Wethersfield, one to 10th rated Tiskilwa and two others to conference champions.

Highlights of the season were 8 and 9 point losses to AA powers Geneseo and Kewanee, a third place finish at the Bradford Tournament (on a miracle John Hathaway to Jeff Holding pass and layup and the 2nd place con-

ference clain.

The 'Cats were led by returning lettermen Roger Smith, John Hathaway, Jeff Holding, and Jeff Patterson. Holding ended a great 4-year career with 1700 points (2nd on all-time list to Rich Falk's 1883) and 939 rebounds as he averaged 25 (648) points and 11.3 (293) rebounds for his senior season. 
Largest Squad In Five Years


Being a young squad, inconsistancy was the biggest problem, but as the season progresses improvement was seen through-out the squad.


Jeff Patterson Leon Best Award




Angie Anderson Maxine Dexter Award

The ''Maxine Dexter Award'' was established by Peyton Dexter in memory of his wife. It is given to aid a girl in pursuit of a college education and who has the highest scholastic average over her 4 years of high school. The winner must have GHS eight consecutive semesters. The winner receives \$100.



The ''Richard Freece Award'' was established in 1931 by Mrs. E.L. Yocum in memory of Richard Freece who drowned his junior year in high school. This award is given each year to a senior boy who has shown himself to be the best all-around student in scholarship and has been active in high school activities. He must have a 4.0 average or above by the end of his Sophomore year. The winner receives \$100, a gold key, and his name placed on a plaque in the trophy case.





Kathy Doss Beta Sigma Phi Award

The 'Beta Sigma Phi Award' is awarded every year to a senior girl who has attended GHS for 3 years and has a 3.5 average or better. The selection is based on the general financial condition and an evaluation of a questionaire where the student is asked why she wants to attend college, how she's worked in and for her high school and community and what the award would mean to her. The winner is chosen by a committee consisting of the high school principal, a senior citizen, community citizen, and 2 members of the Beta Sigma Phi sorority. The winner who is planning on attending a college, university, or accredited vocational school will receive \$100.



Angie Anderson PEO English Award

The ''PEO English Award'' was established in 1956 by the BR Chapter of PEO Sisterhood. This award recognizes the superior work in English by a senior girl who has the highest English grade in all 4 years of high school. The winner receives a \$25 government bond.



Angie Anderson DAR Award

The ''DAR Good Citizenship Award'' is awarded each year to a senior who exemplifies leadership and citizenship to both the school and the community.

Angie Anderson & Jeff Holding "I Dare You" Leadership Award

The ''I Dare You Award'' is presented by the William H. Danforth Foundation to a senior girl and boy who has exemplified leadership based on healthy physical habits, an alert and ever-growing mind, an outreach of friendship, and constructive social relationships within the home nd community, and above all character. The winner receives a certificate and a book.



Jamie Ericson Arion Band Award

The ''Arion Award'' is voted upon each year by the senior band members. They select the senior whom they feel has contributed the most to the band throughout their four years in high school. The winner receives a medal and a pin.



Angie Anderson Home Economics Award

The CO-ED ''Home Economics Student of the Year Award,'' is based on an evaluation of a small essay written by the applicant and letters of recommendation by Mrs. Hulin, the home ec teacher, a community member, a parent, and Mr. Varner, the guidance counselor. Angie was selected to be the winner of one regional award. She won a \$500 scholarship toward a home-ec major at the Western Illinois University in Macomb.


