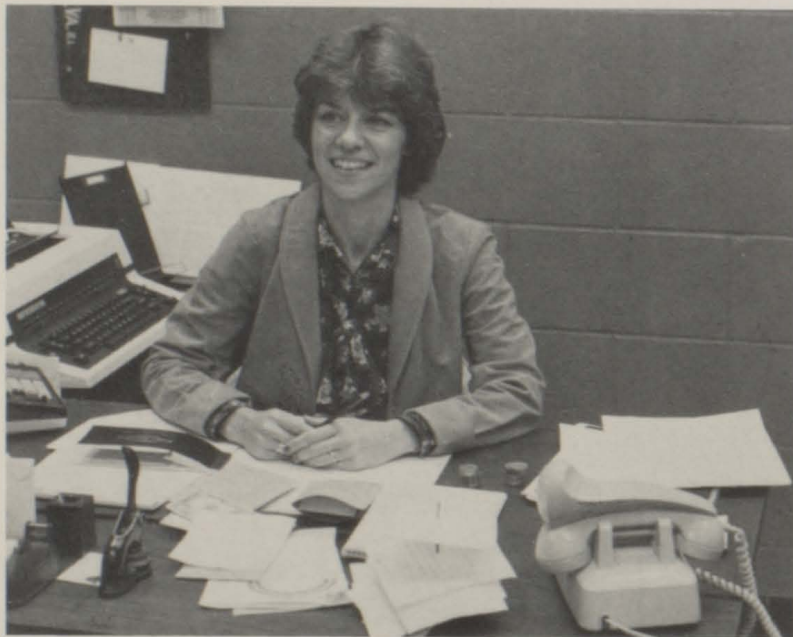
Secretary Diane Klein Leaves GHS

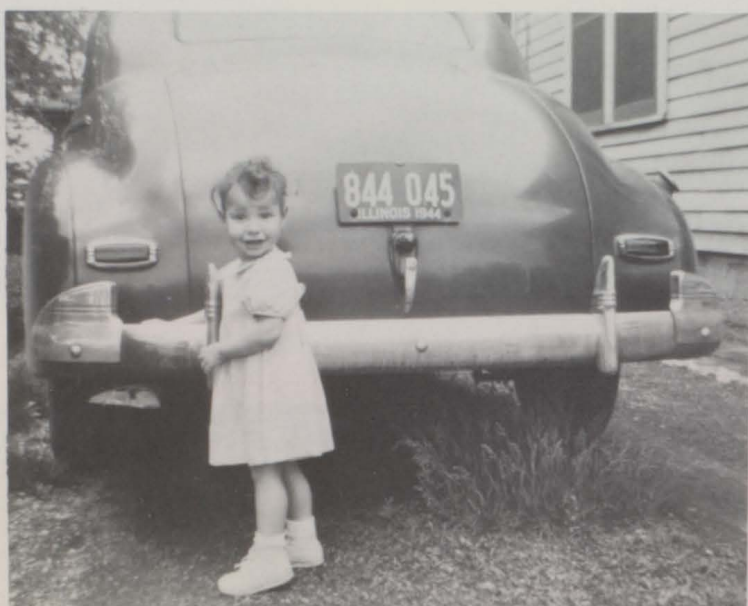

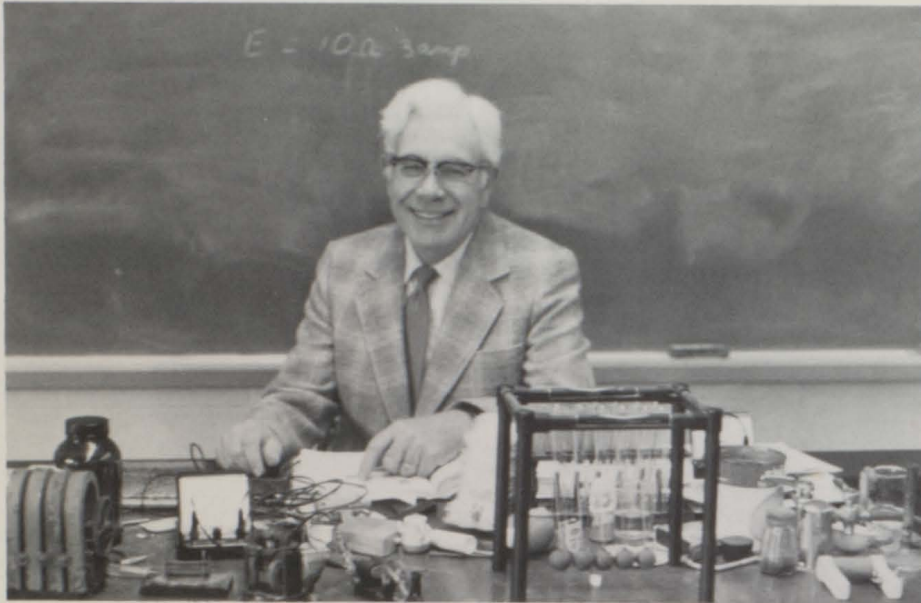

The End Of An Era



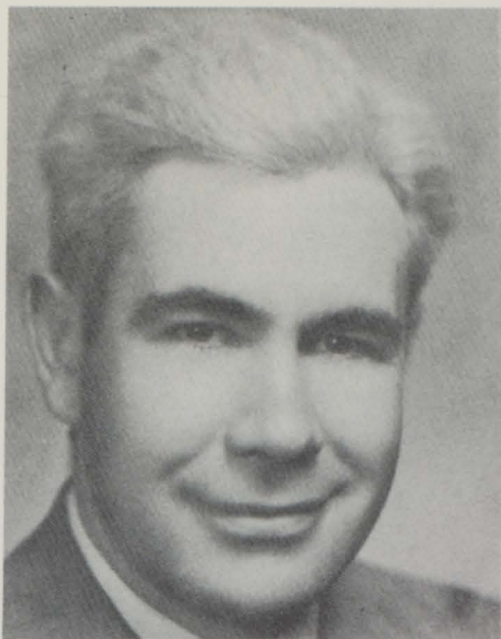
H. Ray Young

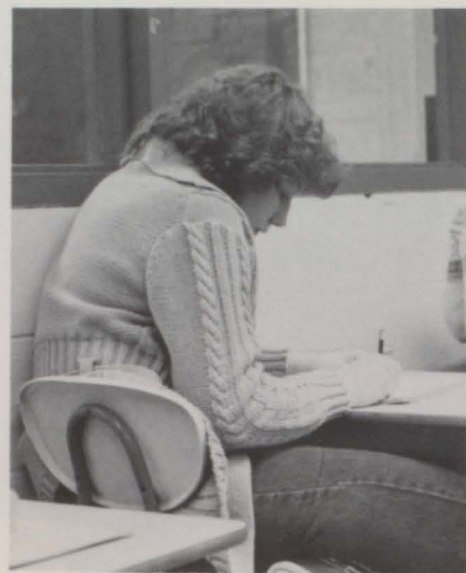

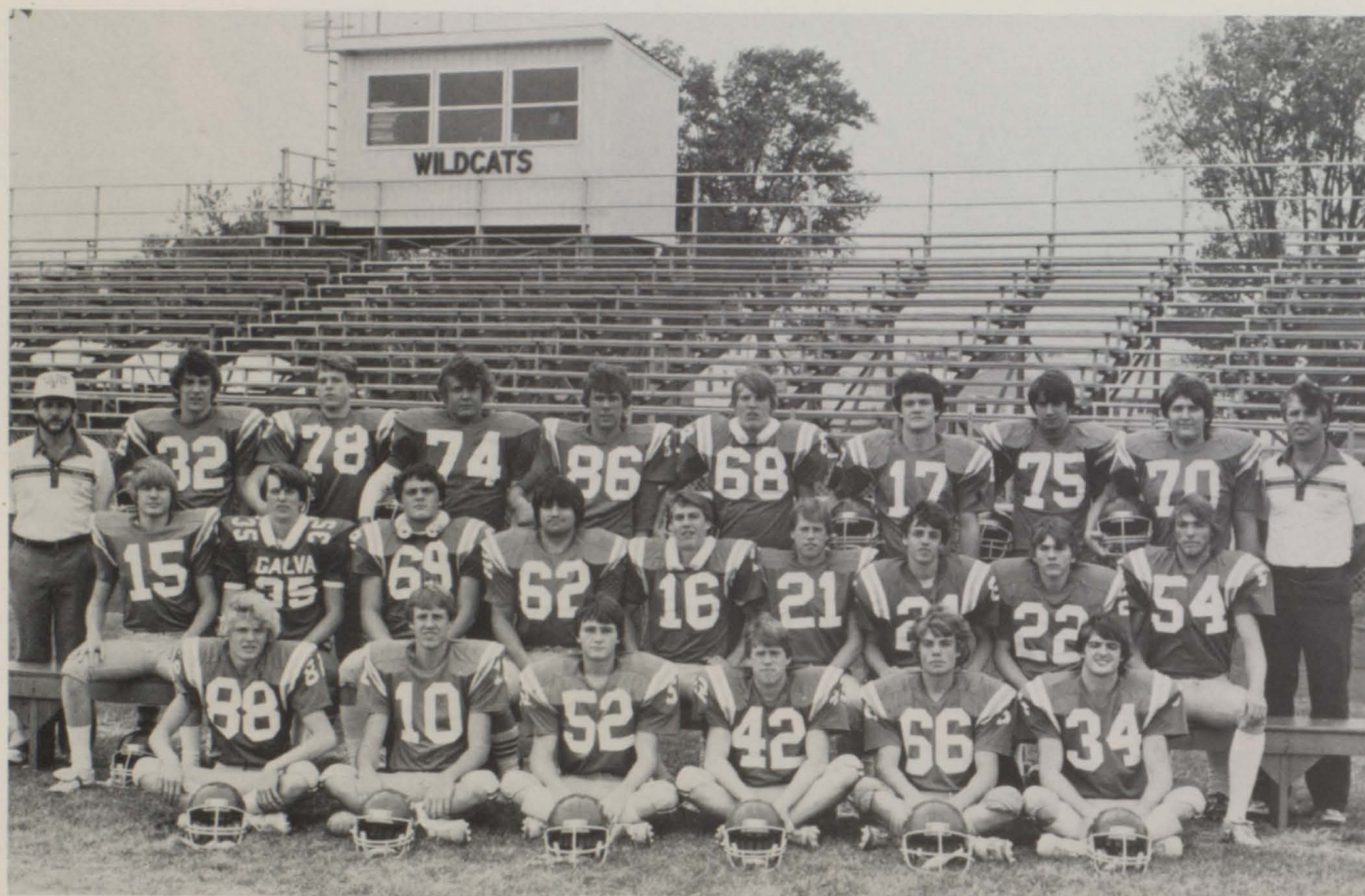

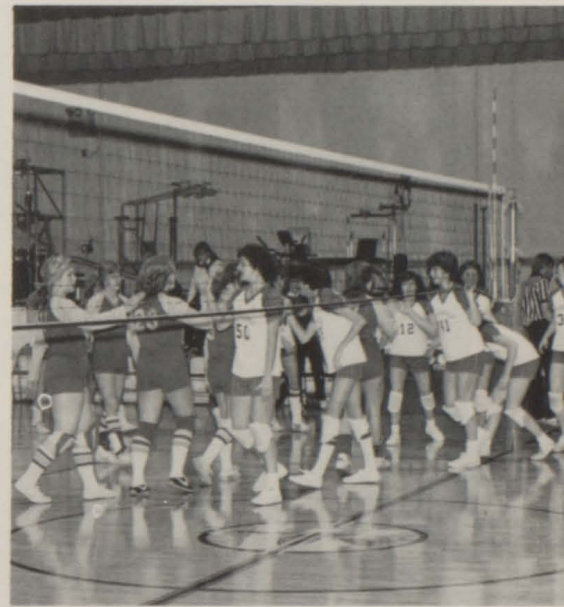

The Glava Wildcat basketball team had an extremely successful 1982-83 season. The 'Cars started out the season by defeating Yares City, Toulon, and host Williamsfield claiming first place in the Williamsfield Tournament. Next, they beat Princeville and lost to Annawan; then the 'Cars beat Western and Bradford before losing to a Champaign-bound Tiskilwa team in the Bradford Tournament (the 'Cars places second). In the Kewanee game the Wildcats were shut down, but they pulled off a big win by edging ROVA 63-62. Then came a five-game winning streak, soundly defeating Cambridge, Winola, Toulon, Arkinson, and Alexis, before winning a couple of close ones against Alwood and Werthersfield. Then ROVA had their chance to gain revenge — which they did. After several more wins, the 'Cars were downed by Alexis. Galva defeated Werthersfield one more time before entering the Alexis Regional. The 'Cars trounced Alexis and squeaked by Monmouth before losing the championship game to ROVA. The Wildcats finished the season with 21-6 record, and tied for first place in the Lincoln Trail Conference.

Coach John Smith's Wildkits also fared well this season. They tied for first in the LTC with an 18-5 record and won the Atkinson Tournament.

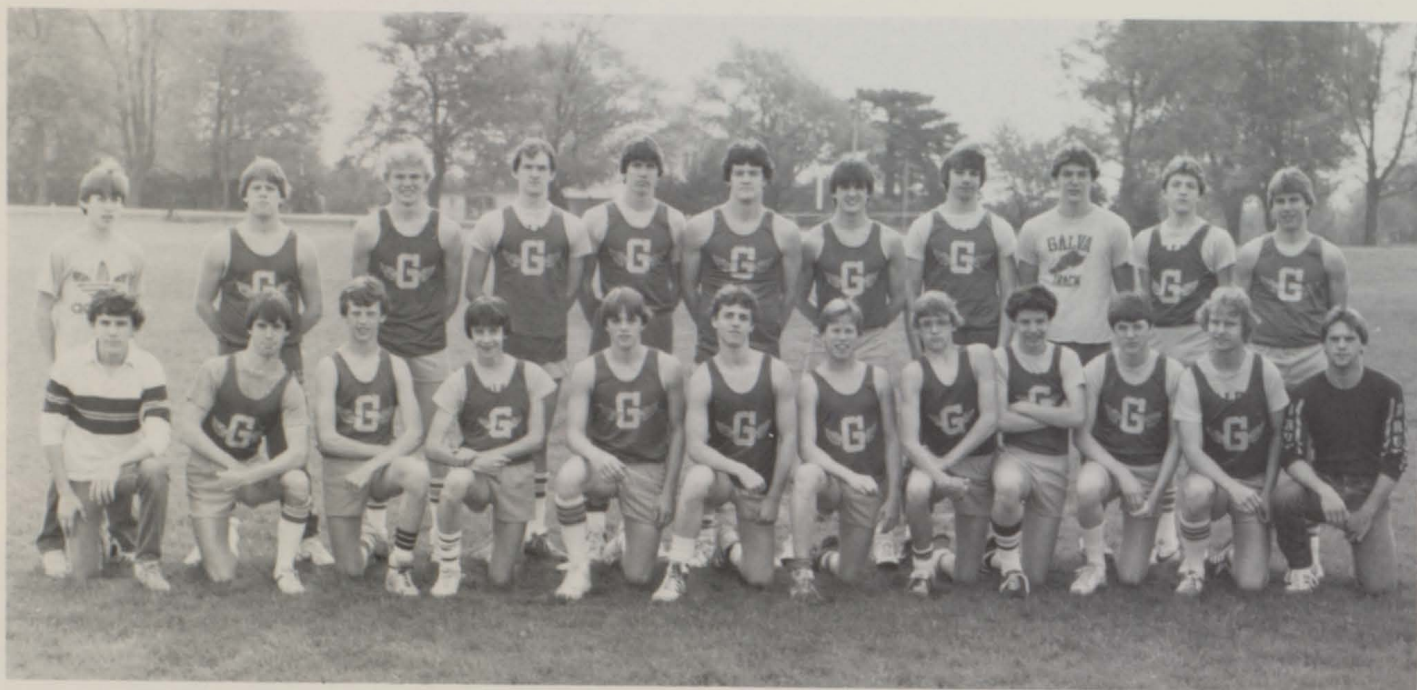

Dawn Leman Leon Best Award

The "Leon Best Award" is based on scholarship, character, leadership, and citizenship. Any senior, male or female, who has received a "B" or better average throughout the first three and three-fourths years of high school and a minimum ACT score of 22 is eligible for this award. The award is given by Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Ovitz, Jr. in memory of her father, Leon Best. The winner will receive a \$500 scholarship.

Kendra Boston Beta Sigma Phi Award

The "Beta Sigma Phi Award" is awarded every year to a senior girl who has attended GHS for three years and has a 3.5 average or better. The selection is based on the general financial condition of a questionnaire where the student is asked why she wants to attend college, how she'd worked in and for her high school and community, and what the award would mean to her. The winner who is planning on attending a college, university, or accredited vocational school will receive \$200.



Hays Arter Richard Freece Award

The "Richard Freece Award" was established in 1931 by Mrs. E. L. Yocum in Memory of Richard Freece who drowned his junior year in high school. This award is given each year to a senior boy who has shown himself to be the best all-around student in scholarship and has been active in high school activities. He must have a 4.0 average or better by the end of his sophomore year. The winner receives \$100, a gold key, and his name is placed on a plaque in the trophy case.



Jeff Birr Women's Club Recognition Award

The "Women's Club Gift of Recognition" emphasizes academic improvement, character, leadership and citizenship. Any student who has attended Galva High School for four consecutive years is eligible to apply. The gift is \$100 and the recipient is responsible for reporting to the Women's Club of Galva personally or by letter.



Sarah Cardiff Overbaugh Farm Award

The "Overbaugh Equipment Award in Agriculture" is based on a student's contribution to agriculture, leadership, scholarship, and school citizenship. To be eligible a student must have attended Galva High School for at least three years, taken agriculture for at least three years and currently enrolled in agriculture, and maintained a 3.5 average through the third quarter of his last year. If a student meets these requirements, he will receive a grant of \$100.



Dawn Leman PEO English Award

The PEO English Award was established in 1956 by the BR Chapter of PEO Sisterhood. This award recognized the superior work in English by a senior girl who has the highest English grade in all four years of high school. The winner receives a \$25 government bond.



Dawn Leman DAR Award

The "DAR Good Citizenship Award" is awarded each year to a senior who exemplifies leadership and citizenship to both the school and the community.



Sarah Cardiff VFW Award

In the fall of each year the speech classes participate in the VFW Voice of Democracy contest. Sarah placed first in the local competition, winning a \$50 savings bond, and also placed first at district, where she won \$50. The theme for this year was "Youth — the Strength of America."
