



Last year the Senior Class made an attempt to organize for the publication of an annual. But when they began it was too late, nearly half the year had flown by.

> This year the Class of '24 made their demand for a school publication as soon as school opened; Miss S. E. Miller, their English instructor, helped to arouse enthusiasm. The matter was brought to Mr. White. He thought favorably of it and submitted it to a committee for consideration. They decided in favor of an annual and selected a staff. Work was begun at once. A naming contest was held, the prize being an annual. The winning name was submitted by Miss Gertrude Biedermann, one of the English teachers.

The GHS Honor Society was organized to promote scholarship. - First National Bank of Galva had Capital of \$60,000. --- The first sound film was made in Hollywood. --- Semester exams lasted for four days. --- The 1929 football team consisted mostly of freshmen. --- Bathtub Gin, the Charleston, and Dance Marathons were the rage in 1923. --You could get a permanent wave for \$5 or a Marcel for fifty cents from Fern Matticks in her beauty shop in Galva. --- Grace Kelly graduated from GHS. --- Miss Grundy and Miss Fish really exist as teachers at Galva High. --Treasures found in King Tut's Tomb in 1923. --- Membership in the high school chorus is compulsory of all students. --- Miss Cronk, GHS Latin teacher, succumbs and is replaced mid-year by Miss Sprague. --- You can get a chicken dinner for sixty cents at Galva's Bungalow Inn. --- Al Capone's 1929 Valentine's Day Massacre blasts Chicago. 1930 GHS football team lost to Kewanee 64 to 0. --- GHS teachers to Champaign for Institute. --During the early 30's Al Capone ruled Chicago. --- The ag department and FFA are added to GHS curriculum. --- The first "G" Club was organized in 1933. --- Contact lenses were invented. GHS home ec. teacher, Miss Dresser, gets married so she is replaced by Miss Morgan at midyear. F. U. White resigns in March, 1931 as superintendent. --- Adolph Hitler becomes Chancellor of Germany. --- School was canceled for a week in February of 1936 because of minus twenty degree temperatures. ---In 1937 the athletic teams were nicknames the "Wildcats" by an unknown person named "Char-The school board purchased football jerseys with the "Wildcat" insignia. --- Galva had its own Kroger grocery store. ---The first regular TV broadcasts were made in 1939. --- Galva's Hudson's Barber Shop boasted "Haircuts That Fit Your Head." The News

The first Home Ec. formal dance was held in 1942 --- The 1945 basketball team was the conference champion. -- To serve the war effort, GHS collected scrap metal and paper, sold war stamps and bonds. They outfitted 6 soldiers at a cost of \$243 each in 1943 --- The Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor in 1941 and Joe DiMaggio hit in 56 successive baseball games ---Nine members of the 1944 senior class left school to join the army and the Galahi list over 290 names of Galva residents serving the war effort --- In 1945, U.S. atomic bomb destroyed Hiroshima and Nagasaki, and Adolph Hitler committed suicide, and F.D.R. died of a stroke, and the United Nations was created -Wayne Troline and Richard Lewin were co-captains of the 1946 basketball team --- Galva defeated Victoria in basketball in 1946 with a score of 75 to 11 -The first U.F.O. was sighted in 1947 --- Penicillin reached the civilian market in 1944 --- Bernie Cromien was the 1948 homecoming King --- In 1947 Galva's football team and basketball team each claimed their first undisputed conference championship --- The 1946 Galva Relays were won by Galva --- Milton Berle was 1949's top TV performer and Polaroid-Land cameras hit the marketplace --- GHS students receiving detentions in 1949 had to stay until 5:00 p.m. --- Chuck Medley and Bob Overbaugh graduate from GHS --Mr. Young came in 1948

The News

The first Volkswagen was imported to U.S. from Germany --- F. U. White School destroyed by fire on January 7, 1950 --- School was canceled in February, 1950, because of a coal strike School hot lunches of 1950 were served in the armory --- Pay telephone rates were increased from five cents to ten cents --- The 1951 Galahi featured a summer supplement containing photos of spring events --- The marching band of 1951 marched in the Lions' Club Parade in Chicago and placed ninth in competition --- Willie Thomson placed second in low hurdles and third in high hurdles at the 1951 State Track Meet in Champaign --- Salk vaccine preventing polio became available --- Galva celebrated its centennial in 1954 --- Favorite band songs were "String of Pearls" and "In The Mood" ---Junior-Senior Prom was held at Midland Country Club --- The 1958 basketball team averaged 65.3 points per game --- Elvis Presley recorded "Blue Suede Shoes" in 1956 --- The Ten Commandments starring Charleton Heston premiered in movie theaters --- Cult hero, James Dean died in an auto crash in 1956 --- Former GHS teacher and coach Elner Lundeen was elected to the school board ---GHS offered a class in auto mechanics --- GHS athletes got a new sport for one year only in 1959, golf --- The last game of the 1959 football season was canceled because of extremely cold temperatures and snow.

The News

The GHS marching band lost 27 members when the 1960 seniors graduated --- Rich Falk graduated in 1960 leaving behind a basketball record of 1841 points scored in varsity basketball competition --- Galva's Future Teachers Club had 51 members --John Glenn became the first man to orbit Earth in 1962 --- ZIP codes were initiated in 1962 --One 1961 assignment in English IV was to memorize 18 lines of Chaucer --- 1961 saw the addition of wrestling to the athletic program at GHS --- LSD experiments proved dangerous in 1963 --- H. M. Robertson retired as Supt. in 1962 --- In 1962 the GHS basketball team placed second in the Sectional Tournament and Paul Schmidt pitched a no-hit baseball game for GHS in the conference tournament ---1961 juniors and seniors were upset when prom had to be held at the school rather than Midland Country Club --- Mrs. Eisenbarth came to GHS in 1965 --- Galva's first exchange student, Kurt Flueckiger, arrived from Switzer land in 1962 --- The 1963 GHS basketball team had the best season record in the state with 26 wins and 1 loss; they were defeated by Aledo in the Regional Championship --- The 1964 basketball team lost the final game of the Sectional to Rock Island Alleman --- In 1968 U.S. public turned against the Viet Nam War and Hair, a pop-rock musical, hit Broadway --- Construction began on the present high school building in 1966 JFK assassinated in 1964.

The 1970 track team won Wethersfield Relays and Galva Relays --- In 1971 the Student Council abolished the dress code and established a student social hall --The 1971 football team had 22 seniors --- Richard Nixon in 1974 became the first U.S. president to resign from office --- "Streaking," running au naturel, was the current fad --- Basketball team of 1971 finished third in conference but won the regional tournament --- In March of 1973, 12 French students made a trip to France --- The GHS pom-pon squad was instituted in 1973 --- Mr. Varner grew a mustache in 1973 --- The 1973 J-V football team had 25 freshmen and three sophomores on the squad --- Peggy Thees-feld was voted the first prom queen --- In 1977 President Jimmy Carter turned the Panama Canal over to Panama --- In 1974 the movie Jaws hit the screen and the religious Moonies hit New York --- The 1974 volleyball team was undefeated --- The 1976 girls track team had only two meets --- The drama club presented "1984" in 1976 --- Socks with toes were the rage in 1976 --- The school event sign was dedicated in 1976 in memory of Dan Stevens a member of the senior class --- The 1976 edition of the Galahi was the largest ever published, 200 pages --- In 1977 Roots with Levar Burton hit the TV airwaves and Elvis Presley, the "King of Rock & Roll" died --- The 1979 Galahi won first place in National School Publications Contest

The 1983 Galva Wildcats had an outstanding football season, finishing with an 8-2 record and trichampions of the Lincoln Trail Conference. First year head coach Tom Buck had 18 returning lettermen to build his football machine around. Team depth was an asset to the Wildcats as many different players were inserted into the starting line-up each week. The Wildcats used a powerhouse offense and a swarming defense to become only the second team from Galva to advance to the I.H.S.A. playoffs. The dream of a state title went down in the mud of a rain-soaked Hamilton field, however, as the 'Cats came up a touchdown short, 14-8. Ironically, the only points the 'Cats gave up in the third quarter of any game all year proved to be the one's that beat them at Hamilton. But that same defense registered 5 shutouts and allowed an average of only 6.9 points a game. While allowing only 119 total offensive yards each game, they picked-off 19 of the opponents' passes. The offense, on its way to averaging 25.1 points a game, used a quick, powerful running game to defeat opposing teams. On 454 attempts the Wildcats gained 2175 yards, a 4.7 average per carry. In between running plays, the offense was passing for 548 yards. These statistics combined for 2723 yards for the year, a staggering 272 yards in each game. The 1983 football team gave the school and community something it could be proud of, a team that worked together and gave 100%.

The 'Cats were honored with 1st Team All-Conference choices Ron Bell (offense and defense), David Adkison (offense and defense), Don Troline (offense), Larry Johnson (offense), and Alex Darragh (defense). Mike Clucas, Alex Darragh, and David Adkison were voted to the 1st Team All-Western Illinois defensive squad.



After an impressive football season, the Galva Wildcat basketball team picked up where they had left off last year. Returning four starters and six lettermen from a 21-6 team, the Wildcats did that season two better by going 23-4 in 1983-84. The Wildcats used a stifling man-to-man defense to limit their opponents to an average of 50 points a game while they racked up 66 each time. The season began with the Williamsfield Tourney, and with only one week of practice, the 'Cats cruised through the opposition to win their second consecutive title. Next up was the Bradford Tourney where the Wildcats slipped from their #1 seeding to capture 3rd place. Once the 'Cats got to 7-2, they reeled off 14 consecutive victories in winning the Lincoln Trail Conference with a record of 13-1. Toward the end of the season, Galva was ranked as high as 14th in the Associated Press poll. They went into the Galva Regional seeded first and proved to be just that as they stormed past Wethersfield, 69-51, in the championship. In Sectional play, however, the Wildcats were tripped-up by Princeville, thus ending one of the most successful basketball seasons in the history of G.H.S. Post-Season honors included Mike Clucas and Brad Hulick named All-State Honorable Mention, Clucas 1st Team All-Western, Hulick 4th Team All-Western, and Dave Adkison Honorable Mention All-Western. 

The mile relay team made up of Kim Payne, Sami Kitner, Tahnee Nichols, and Sue Donaldson broke the school record with a time of 4:48.9. These girls should be commended for their effort and hard work.




Mike Clucas Richard Freece Award
