Although the 1985 Galva Wildcats season was not a strong one, they were still able to post a 3-6 overall record, and a 3-4 record in the conference. The 3-4 conference record was good enough to give the Wildcats a four-way tie for 3rd place. Under first-year head coach Jim Welti, the Wildcats started their 1985 campaign at home against Aledo, but the Wildcats dropped their first two non-conference games. The Wildcats also dropped their first conference game against Cambridge. The team finally got their first win on Homecoming against Wethersfield, but then dropped games to Toulon, Rova, and Alwood. The Wildcats finished strong beating Alexis and Winola.

The Wildcats had five all-conference selections. Junior Craig Vincent was named First Team All Conference Defense. Senior Troy Stairwalt was named to the Second Team All-Conference both defense and Offense. Keith Morby, Stuart Darragh, and David Hoxworth were also named to all-conference Second Team Defense. In addition, Craig Vincent, David Hoxworth, and Cicero Garcia received All Western Illinois Honorable Mention.
