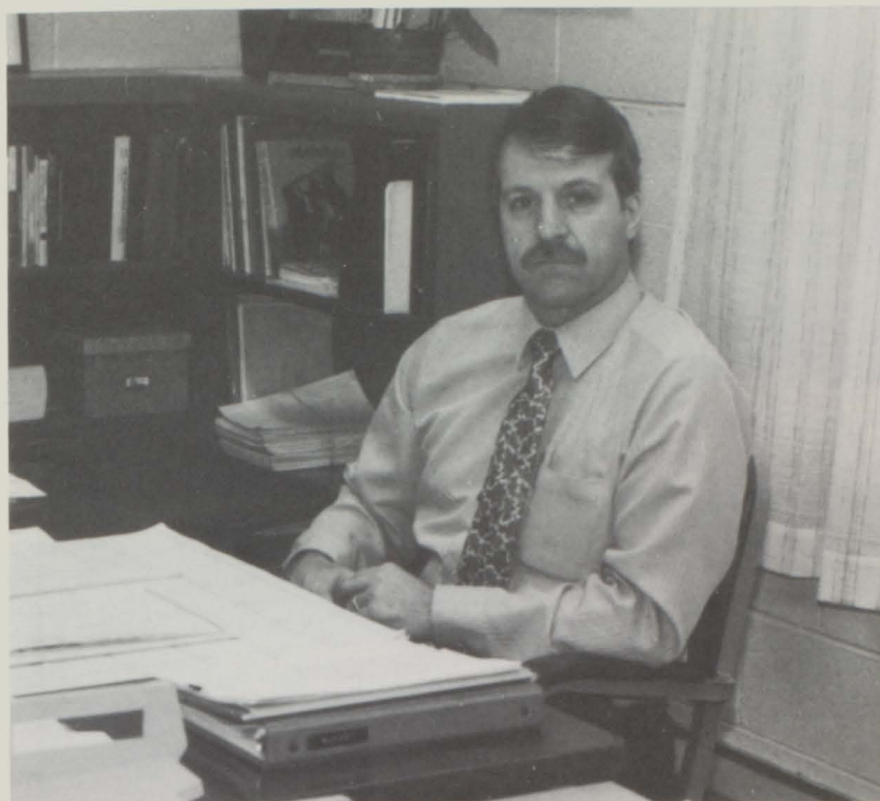

GHS Welcomes New Principal



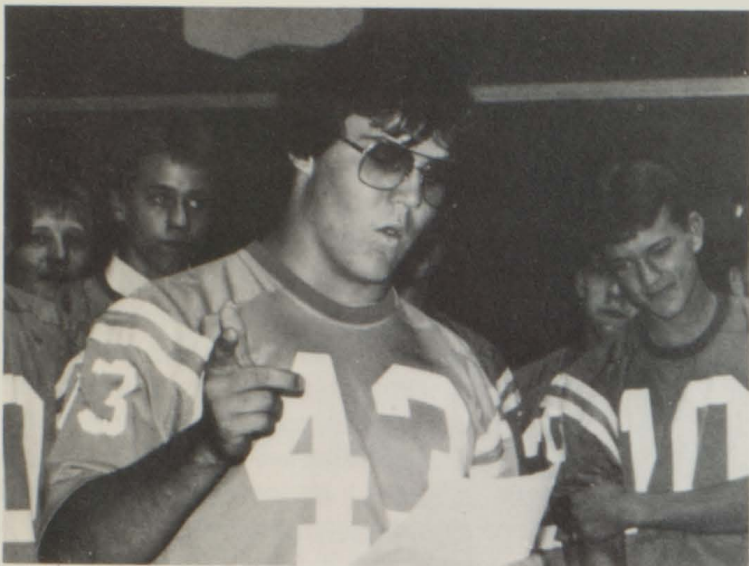
Principal Jamie Drag

Ana Maria Zuluaga



Ana Maria arrived in Galva in mid-January to learn about the American way of life: its culture and values and to learn the English language more fluently as a part of the Rotary Exchange Program. "On my return I hope I'll be a more mature person with a better capacity to understand people and the world," she said. Ana Maria left her home in Medellin, Colombia with a population of 2,000,000 to spend one year in America. She found quite a difference between schools in Colombia and America, because in most of the Colombian schools, the teachers move and the students remain in the same room during the school day. Another major difference in the Colombian schools is that students can't choose the subjects and have different subjects each day. After returning to Colombia, she hopes to attend the University Bolivariana to study journalism.
