
Our Galva football team is great because we are what we say we are — a Team! And with that attitude we will always be on top whether we win or lose!

The girls worked hard and played hard, and the future looks brighter today than it did at the beginning of the year because of the efforts that the girls put forth this year.









Senior Award Winners

The \$100.00 Galva Educational Booster ''Pat Trickle Memorial Scholarship'' will be presented by the Galva Education Boosters in memory of Pat Trickle, Community Unit District 224 Librarian, who passed away in January of 1987. It will be presented to a graduating senior who plans on attending college, junior college or vocational school and has demonstrated outstanding attributes in scholarship, character, leadership and citizenship. Financial need will also be considered.

The Sisterhood of P.E.O. established an award in 1956 to recognize superior work in English. The award, a U.S. Savings Bond, is presented each year to the graduationg girl who has attained the highest four-year average in English.

The DAR Good Citizenship Award is awarded each year to a senior who exemplifies leadership and citizenship to both the school and the community.

The Jostens Foundation Leader Scholarship Award is an award of \$1,000.00 presented to 300 graduation high school seniors across the nation who exemplify the highest standards of school and community involvement and academic achievement.

The Galva Lion's Club award is presented to a graduating senior attending college, junior college or vocational school who has demonstrated outstanding abilities in character, scholarship, leadership and service to school/community. It is a \$100.00 award.

In 1980 the Women's Club of Galva established an award to be presented to the senior who has shown significant academic improvement, outstanding character, leadership and citizenship during four years at Galva High School. The student must also be planning to pursue his or her education beyond high school.

Following the death by drowning in June of 1931 of Richard Freece, Mrs. E.L. Yocum established what is now known as the Richard Freece Memorial Award. This award is to be presented each year to the graduating boy who best represents the high ideals of scholarship, leadership and participation in extracurricular activities in memorial of Richard Freece.
